of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and | Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commisfioners, flewing that the faid Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered outwards : But it is His Majefty's Pleafure, nevertheles, that the following Articles, viz. Bar-Iron, White and Tarred Rope, Tallow or Mill Greafe, Tarpaulins for Waggon-Covers, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, shall be permitted to be exported, upon Payment of the proper Duties, without Bond being entered into by the Merchant Exporter, to any of the British Plantations in the West Indies, or to any of His Majefty's Settlements in South America; provided the Merchant Exporter shall first verify, upon Oath, that the Articles fo exported are intended for the Ufe of a particular Plantation or Settlement, to be named in the Entry Outwards, and not for Sale; and that the faid Plantation or Settlement has not before been furnished with any Supply of the faid Articles during the fame Seafon ; and provided alfo that the Exportation of the faid Articles shall, in no Cafe, exceed the Value of Fifty Pounds Sterling for any given Plantation or Settlement, whether by one or more Shipments within the fame Seafon : And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may refpectively appertain. 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## By the KING. A PROCLAMATION. GEORGE R.

HEREAS by Our Order in Council, bearing Date the Twentieth Day of January laft, the Time prefcribed by Our feveral Proclamations now in force for the Payment of the Bounties promifed by Our faid Proclamations, for the Encouragement of Scamen and Landmen to enter into Our Royal Navy; and the Rewards for difcovering Seamen who may conceal themfelves, fo that fuch Seamen should be taken for Our Service ; and also the Rewards to Perfons who fhould procure the voluntary Service of Able and Ordinary Seamen and Landmen, fit for Our Naval Service, and fhould convey fuch Seamen and Landmen on board of any of Our Ships and Veffels, or to any of Our Sea Officers employed in raifing Men, has been continued until the Thirty-first Day of this inflant December; which Bounties and Rewards are as follows; that is to fay,—To every Able Scaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should enter himfelf to ferve in Our Royal Navy, a Bounty of Five Pounds; and to every Ordinary Seaman, fo entering himfelf, and not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, a Bounty of Three Pounds ;- to every able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty five, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, fo entering him-felf, a Bounty of Thirty Shillings; —to any Perfon or Perfons who fhall difcover any Able or Ordi-

the faid Commiffioners, and specified in the Bond, I nary Seaman or Seamen who may have concealed themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman may be taken for Our Service, by any of Our Officers employed to raife Men, a Reward of Three Pounds for every fuch Able Seaman, and Fifty Shillings for every fuch Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board Our Ships ;to any Perfon or Perfons who fhall procure the voluntary Service of Able or Ordinary Seamen or Landmen fit for Our Service, and fhall convey them on board any of Our Ships or Veffels, or to any of Our Sea Officers employed in raifing Men, a Reward of Four Guineas for every fuch Able Seaman, Three Guineas for every fuch Ordinary Seaman, and Two Guineas and a Half for every fuch Landman ; together with an Allowance, at the Rate of One Penny per Mile, for each Able Seaman, Ordinary Seaman, and Landman, for every Mile fuch Men may refpectively travel to the nearest of Our Ships of War, or nearest Place of Refidence of any of Our Sea Officers employed in raising Men; provided fuch Man shall be found fit for Our Service, and there shall not be Reason to suppose that he is an Apprentice :- And whereas it has been reprefented to Us, that it is expedient that the faid feveral Bounties and Rewards should be continued until the Thirtyfirst Day of December, One thousand eight hun-dred and feven, fave and except only that the Rewards to Perfons who fhall procure the voluntary Service of Able or Ordinary Seamen or Landmen fit for Our Naval Service, and fhall convey them on board of any of Our Ships or Veffels, or to any of Our Sea Officers employed in raifing Men, should be decreased, We have therefore, thought fit, by and with the Advice of our Privy Council to declare, and We do hereby declare, that, from and after the Thirty-first Day of December One thousand eight hundred and fix, to, and until the Thirty-first Day of December One thoufand eight hundred and feven, a Reward of Three Guineas, and no more, for every fuch Able Seaman; Two Guineas, and no more, for every fuch. Ordinary Seaman; and One Guinea, and no more, for every fuch Landman, shall be paid to any Perfon who may procure the voluntary Service of any fuch Able Seaman, Ordinary Seaman, or Landman, together with the fame Allowance for their travelling Expences, and with the fame Provifos, as are fpecified in Our faid Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Seventh Day of November, One thousand eight hundred and five :- And We do hereby, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, further promife and declare, that all other Bounties and Rewards granted by Our feveral Proclamations now in force, and declared by Our faid Order in Council of the faid Twentieth Day of January laft to be continued to, and until the faid Thirty first Day of this inftant December, One thousand eight hundred and fix, for the Encouragement of Seamen and Landmen to enter into Our Royal Navy, and for the difcovering of Seamen who may conceal themfelves, fhall continue to be paid in the Manner specified in Our faid Proclamations respectively, to and until the Thirty-first Day of December, One thousand eight hundred and feven.
