WE, taking into Our most ferious Consideration the just and necessary War in which We are engaged, and putting Our Trust in Almighty God, that he will graciously bless our Arms, both by Sea and Land, have refolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby command, that a publick Day of Fasting and Humiliation be observed throughout those Parts of Our United Kingdom called England and Ireland, on Wednesday the Twenty-fifth Day of February next enfuing, that so both We and Our People may humble Our-felves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sius, and in the most devout and folemn Manner fend up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majesty, for averting those heavy Judgments which Our manifold Provocations have most justly deserved; and for imploring His Bleffing and Affiltance on our Arms for the Restoration of Peace, and Prosperity to Us and our Dominions: And We do firicily charge and command, that the faid publick Fast be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in England and Ireland, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid his Wrath and Indignation; and upon Pain of fuch Punishment as We may justly inslict on all fuch as contemn and neglect the Performance of fo religious and necessary a Duty: And for the better and more orderly folemnizing the same, We have given Directions to the Most Reverend the Archbishops, and the Right Reverend the Bishops of England and Ireland, to compose a Form of Prayer fuitable to this Occasion, to be used in all Churches, Chapels, and Places of publick Worship, and to take Care that the fame be timely dispersed throughout their respective Dioceses.

Our Will is, therefore, and We charge, that this Our Proclamation seen, Ye forthwith proceed to the Market Cross of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Ignorance; and Our Will and Pleasure is, that Our Solicitor of classes printed Copies hereof to be fent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shires, Stewarts of Stewartries, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the fame published; and We do appoint them to fend Copies hereof to the feveral Parish Churches within their Bounds; and that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above mentioned, the same may be published

and read from the Pulpits immediately after Divine

AT the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 7th of January 1807,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS the French Government has iffued certain Orders, which, in Violation of the Usages of War, purport to prohibit the Com-merce of all Neutral Nations with His Majesty's Dominions; and also to prevent such Nations from trading with any other Country in any Articles the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of His Majelty's Dominions; and whereas the faid Government has also taken upon itself to declare all His Majesty's Dominions to be in a State of Blockade, at a Time when the Fleets of France and her Allies are themfelves confined within their own Ports by the fuperior Valour and Discipline of the British Navy; and whereas such Attempts on the Part of the Enemy would give to His Majetty an unquestionable Right of Retaliation, and would warrant His Ma-jefty in enforcing the fame Prohibition of all Commerce with France, which that Power vainly hopes to effect against the Commerce of His Majesty's Subjects, a Prohibition which the Superiority of His Majesty's Naval Forces might enable him to fupport, by actually invefting the Ports and Coafts of the Enemy with numerous Squadrons and Cruizers, fo as to make the Entrance or Approach thereto manifelly dangerous; and whereas His Maijelly, though unwilling to follow the Example of His Enemies, by proceeding to an Extremity fo distressing to all Nations not engaged in the War, and carrying on their accostomed Trade, yet feels Himfelf bound by a due Regard to the just Defence of the Rights and Interests of His People, not to fuffer such Measures to be taken by the Enemy, without taking some Steps on His Part to restrain this Violence, and to retort upon them the Evils of their own Injustice; His Majety is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no Vessel shall be permitted to trade from one Port to another, both which Ports shall belong to or be in the Possession of France or her Allies, or shall be so far under their Controll as that British Veffels may not freely trade thereat; and the Com-manders of His Majesty's Ships of War and Pri-vateers shall be, and are hereby instructed, to warn every Neutral Veffel coming from any fuch Port, and deflined to another fuch Port, to discontinue her Voyage, and not to proceed to any fuch Port; and any Veffel after being fo warned, or any Veffel coming from any fuch Port, after a reasonable Time shall have been afforded for receiving Information of this His Majesty's Order, which shall be found proceeding to another fuch Port, shall be captured and brought in, and, together with her Cargo, shall be condemned as lawful Prize. And

His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Judges of the High Court of Admiralty and Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take the necessary Measures herein as to them shall respectively appertain.
