Given at our Court at the Queen's Palace, this Fourteenth Day of January, One thousand eight hundred and seven, in the Forty-seventh Year of Our Reign.

GOD fave the KING.

AT the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 7th of January 1807,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majefty in Council.

7HEREAS the French Government has iffued certain Orders, which, in Violation of the Ufages of War, purport to prohibit the Com-merce of all 'Neutral Nations with His Majefty's Dominions; and also to prevent fuch Nations from trading with any other Country in any Articles the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of His Majefty's Dominions; and whereas the faid Government has alfo taken upon itfelf to declare all His Majefty's Dominions to be in a State of Blockade, at a Time when the Fleets of France and her Allies are themfelves confined within their own Ports by the fuperior Valour and Discipline of the British Navy; and whereas fuch Attempts on the Part of the Enemy would give to His Majelly an unqueffionable Right of Retaliation, and would warrant His Ma-jefty in enforcing the fame Prohibition of all Commerce with France, which that Power vainly hopes to effect against the Commerce of His Majefty's Subjects, a Prohibition which the Superiority of 'His Majefty's Naval Forces might enable him to fupport, by actually invefting the Ports and Coafts of the Enemy with numerous Squadrons and Cruizers, fo as to make the Entrance or Approach thereto manifelly daugerous; and whereas His Majelly, though unwilling to follow the Example of His Enemics, by proceeding to an Extremity fo diffreffing to all Nations not engaged in the War, and carrying on their accuftomed Trade, yet feels Himfelf bound by a due Regard to the just De-fence of the Rights and Interests of His People, not to fuffer fuch Meafures to be taken by the Enemy, without taking fome Steps on His Part to reitrain this Violence, and to retort upon them the Evils of their own Injustice; His Majeny is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no Vefiel thall be permitted to trade from one Port to another, both which Ports shall belong to or be in the Poffeffion of France or her Allies, or shall be to far under their Controul as that British Veffels may not freely trade thereat ; and the Com-manders of His Majefty's Ships of War and Pri-vateers shall be, and are hereby instructed, to warn every Neutral Veffel coming from any fuch Port, and deflined to another fuch Port, to difcontinue her Voyage, and not to proceed to any fuch Port; and any Veffel after being fo warned, or any Vef-fel coming from any fuch Port, after a realonable Time fhall have been afforded for receiving In-formation of this His Majefly's Order, which fhall be found proceeding to another fuch Port, shall be captured and brought in, and, together with her Cargo, Ihall be condemned as lawful Prize. And

His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, and the Judges of the High Court of Admiralty and Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take the neceffary Measures herein as to them shall respectively appertain. W. Fawkener.
