The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS by an Act, passed in the Twentycighth Year of the Reign of His prefent
Majesty, intituled "An Act for regulating the
"Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in North America and in " the West India Islands, and the Countries belong-46 ing to the United States of America, and between 44 His Majesty's said Subjects and the Foreign " Islands in the West Indies;" it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be iffued and published from Time to Time, to authorize, or by Warrant or Warrants under His Sign Manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland for the Time being to authorize, in case of Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the then ensuing Season only; provided always, that such Bread. Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock. fo authorized to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported except in Conformity to such Rules. Regulations, and Restrictions as shall be specified in such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants respectively; and except by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law; and whereas it is expedient and necessary, that Provision be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the enfuing Scafon, with Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock, His Majesty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, that for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fisher-men of the Island of Newfoundland for the ensuing Season only, Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock may be imported into the faid Island from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships owned by His Majesty's Sub-

within the Space of Nine Months previous to the Time of fuch Importation, have cleared out from fome Port of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or other His Majesty's Dominions in Europe, for which Purpose a Licence shall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or the Commisfioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Person or Persons who may be duly authorized in that Kingdom respectively, in the Manner and Form hereinaster mentioned; which Licence shall continue and be in Force for Nine Calendar Months, from the Day of the Date upon which fuch Licence is respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no such Licence as aforesaid, granted after the 30th Day of September next, shall be of any Force or Effect. And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Veffel to whom fuch Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the faid Ship or Veffel at the Port, Harbour, or Place, in the Island of Newfoundland, where he shall discharge such Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock, deliver up the said Licence to the Collector, or other proper Officer of the Customs there, having first indorsed on the Back of fuch Licence the Marks, Numbers, and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, Butter, and the Number of Live Stock, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the faid Act mentioned; and the Collector or other proper Officer of the Curtoms at Newfoundland, is hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Mafter or Person having the Charge or Command of fuch Ship or Veffel, of his having received the faid Licence fo indorfed as before directed, and to transmit the same to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland respectively, by whom fuch Licence was W. Fawkener.

Now be it known, that the faid [Person's Name] hath a Licence to lade on board the faid Ship, [Ship's Name | at and from any Port or Place belonging to the United States of America, Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock, the Produce of the faid United States, and no other Article whatever; and to carry the faid Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock to some Port or Place in the Island of Newfoundland; and on the Arrival of the faid Ship at any Port, Har-bour, or Place of Discharge in Newsoundland, the Mafter or Person having the Charge or Command of the faid Ship, is required and enjoined to deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of His Majesty's Customs there, and to endorse on the Back thereof the Marks, Numbers, and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, Butter, and the Number of Live Stock, and shall thereupon receive a Certificate thereof from the faid Collector, or other proper Officer of the Cuftoms.

WHEREAS, in virtue of Powers vested in His Majesty by an Act passed in the Forty first Year of His Reign, intituled, "An Act to emission power His Majesty to regulate the Trade and Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta until the signing of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, and from thence until Six Weeks after the next Meeting of Parliament, and to declare the Isle of Malta to be a Part of Europe;" His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Thirtieth July, One thousand eight hundred and one, to make certain Regulations for the said Trade and Commerce, which Act, by an Act, passed in the Forty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to continue several Laws re-

" lating to the suspending the Operations of Two " Acts, of the Fifteenth and Seventeenth Years of " the Reign of His present Majesty, for restraining " the Negotiation of Promissory Notes and Bills of " Exchange, under a limited Sum, in England; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from, " and permitting the Importation to Great Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of " other Articles of Provision, without Payment of " Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, " One thousand eight hundred and five; and to the " regulating the Trade and Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta, until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace;" was, after a former Act of Continuance, further continued until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace; whereupon the faid Order was, after former Orders of Continuance, further and lastly continued, by an Order of the Twenty first December, One thousand eight hundred and three, until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, unless His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, should think fit otherwise to order and direct; and whereas His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, has thought fit otherwise to order and direct, His Majesty is, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said beforementioned Order, bearing Date the Twenty-first December, One thousand eight hundred and three, be, and the fame is hereby revoked and declared void; and in lieu thereof, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the Advice aforesaid, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the Date hereof, and until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, unless His Majesty shall, in the mean time, otherwife order and declare, the Trade and Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta, and the Dependencies thereof, shall and may be carried on in any Ships or Veffels belonging to any of His Majesty's Subjects, owned and navigated according to Law; and in Trading Ships or Veffels belonging to the Subjects of States in Amity with His Majesty, of whatever Burthen, or in whatever Manner navigated; and in any Ship or Veffel belonging to any Person or Persons whatsoever, of whatsoever Description, and howsoever navigated, to which His Majesty may be graciously pleased to grant His Royal Licence or Authority for that Purpole; and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, are to give the necessary Directions hercin, as to them may respectively appertain. Copy of a Letter from the Earl of St. Vincent, K. B. Admiral and Commander in Chief of His Majefly's Fleet employed in the Channel, Soundings, Sc. to William Marsden, Esq. dated in Town, the 13th Instant. SIR,

I INCLOSE herewith Copy of a Letter from Commodore Keats, and of one addressed to him by Captain Lord Cochrane, giving a more detailed

Account of an Attack made upon Fort Roquette, at the Entrance of the Baffin d'Arcaffon, whereof the Outline was reported in an Inclosure of my Letter of the 17th Ultimo.

I HAVE the Honour herewith to transmit a Letter, which I have just received from Lord Cochrane, Captain of His Majesty's Ship Imperieuse, reporting the Particulars of an Enterprize (noticed in my Letter to your Lordship of the 10th Instant), highly creditable to Lieutenant Mapleton of that Ship, and to the Officers and Men employed under his Command.

SIR,

His Majesty's Ship Imperieuse, January 7, 1807.

HAVING been led in Chase to the Southward Yesterday, as the Imperieuse passed the Bason of Arcasson, in returning to the Station you had assigned, Lieutenant Mapleton volunteered his Services to bring out with the Boats whatever Vessels might be found there, and, as a preliminary Step, attacked Fort Roquette, which was intended for the Defence of the Entrance. A large Quantity of Military Stores was destroyed, Four Thirty-six Pounders, Two Field Pieces, and a Thirteen-inch Mortar spiked, the Platoons and Carriages burnt, and the Fort laid in Ruins.

'The Honourable Mr. Napier and Mr. H. Stewart, Midshipmen, accompanied Lieutenant Mapleton; and Mr. Gibbert, the Surgeon's First Assistant, embraced the Opportunity to shew his Zeal even in this Assair, foreign to his Profession.

I am happy to add, that as it was well conducted, fo it was accomplished without any Loss.

As several Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms, the following Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majestes King George the First and Second, and of His present Majesty, for preventing such Practices, are published; for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them: And it will be observed, that such Penalties likewise extend to those who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manusacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manusacturers themselves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

If any Person shall contract with, entice, or solicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Information in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Assizes or Quarter Sessions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the sirst Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Person having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid. If any of the King's Subjects, being such Arti-

If any of the King's Subjects, being such Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the said Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any such Foreign Country, exercising any of the said Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by

the Ambassador, Minister, or Consul of Great Britain, in the Country where such Artificers shall be, or by any Person authorised by such Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from thenceforth inhabit within this Realm; such Persons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devise, or Purchase, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His

Majesty's Protection. Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Tuffice of Peace, that any Person is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majesty's Dominions, for the Purposes afore-faid, such Justice may fend his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before fome other Juilice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of One Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, such Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions: And if fuch Person shall refuse to give Secu-rity, the Justice may commit him to Gaol till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fuch Promife, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpose aforesaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given. If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the

Court of Justiciary or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13. IF any Person shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton, or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufac-tures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Justiciary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ire land; the Person so convicted shall, for every Artificer contracted with or seduced, forseit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid: And in case of a subsequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Persons so again offending shall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or seduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall fuffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until such Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any such Tools or Utensils as are commonly used in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up, or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures, or any Part of such Tools, he shall, for every Oftence, forseit all such Tools, or Parts thereof, put on board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Sefsion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Essoin, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to seize and secure, in some of His Majesty's Warehouses, all such Tools or Utensils prohibited to be exported, as such Officer shall sind on board any Vessel not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools so seized shall, after Condemnation, be publicly sold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall seize and secure the same.

If the Captain of any Vessel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the said Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on board his Vessel, he shall, for every such Ossence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inslicted upon Persons exporting the Tools; and, if the Vessel belongs to His Majesty, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majesty.

If any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly suffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or sign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the said Tools, or knowingly suffer the same to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforesaid, and also forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majesty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the same.

Statutes 14, 21, 25, and 26 of His present Majesty.

BY these Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above-mentioned are extended to Persons packing or putting on board any Vessel, not bound directly for some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Press, Paper, Utensil, or Implement whatsoever, used in or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Steel, or Iron Manusactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of such Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof; and all Captains of Ships and other Persons receiving or being in Possession of any such Articles, with an Intent to export the same to Foreign Parts, and all Custom-house Officers suffering an Entry to be made thereof,



are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above-mentioned, in the case of Tools and Utenfils used in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.

BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF HIS MAJESTY'S TREASURY.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, 44 An Act for permitting certain Goods imported "into Great Britain to be secured in Warehouses, without Payment of Duty," it is enacted, That it should be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Confignee or Confignees of any of the Goods, Wares, or Merchandize enumerated or described in the Table thereunto annexed, marked (B), and which shall he legally imported and brought into the Port of London, to lodge and fecure the same under the Joint Locks of the Crown and the London Dock Company, in any Warehouse or Warehouses erected or to be erected, fituate within the Premises belonging to the London Dock Company, without Payment at the Time of the first Entry of fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize of the Duties of Customs or Excise due on the Importation thereof, Subject nevertheless, to the Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions therein contained; provided that no fuch Goods, Wares, or Merchandize should be so lodged or secured unless, and until such Warehouses or other Works belonging, or to belong thereto, should be so far completed, that in the Judgment of the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, the fame shall be fit and proper, in every Respect, for the Reception of fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and wherein the same might respectively be fafely and fecurely deposited, and remain under. the Regulations and Directions in the faid Act contained; and the faid Lord High Treasurer, or Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, were thereby-authorized and empowered, by Writing under his or their Hand or Hands, to certify and make known his or their Approbation of such Warehouses, which Certificate should be published Three Times at least, in the London Gazette, and in Two or more public Morning Newspapers usually circulated in London.

And whereas the Table marked (B), above referred to, is in the Words following, viz.
