The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Island of Curaçoa and its Dependencies have been surrendered and placed under the immediate Protection of His Majesty's Arms, and the Territory and Forts of the same have been delivered up to His Majesty, and the said Island is now in His Majesty's Possession; His Majesty is thereupon pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that all His loving Subjects may lawfully trade to and from the said Island of Curaçoa, subject, nevertheless, to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Conditions, Restrictions, Penalties, and Forfeitures to which the Trade to and from His Majesty's Colonies, Plantations, and Islands in the West Indies is or shall be subject by Law:

And His Majesty is further pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that all Commodities, being of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of the said Island of Curaçoa, being in His Majesty's Possession, shall be permitted to be imported into any of the Ports of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland in British Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, subject to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Restrictions, Conditions, Penalties, and Forfeitures, as Articles of the like Sort are subject to coming from His Majesty's Colonies, Plantations, or Islands in the West Indies: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

Then, by His Majesty's Command, Rear-Admiral Sir Richard John Strachan was introduced into the Presence between Sir Thomas Trigge and Sir David Dundas, the Two Junior Knights Companions present, preceded by the Gentleman Usher of the Order, with Reverences as before.

The Sword of State was thereupon delivered to the Sovereign by Lord De Blaquiere, the Second Knight in Seniority present, and Rear-Admiral Sir Richard John Strachan, kneeling, was knighted therewith. Then His Royal Highness the Duke of York, the Senior Knight, presented the Ribbon and Badge to the Sovereign, and His Majesty put them over the new Knight's Right Shoulder, who, being thus invested, had the Honour to kiss the Sovereign's Hand, and withdrew.

Then, by His Majesty's Command, Major-General Sir John Stuart was, in like Manner, introduced into the Presence between the said Two Junior Knights Companions, preceded by the Gentleman Usher as before; and the said Sir John Stuart being already a Knight, (that Honour having been conferred upon him by Patent under the Great Seal, bearing Date the 20th Day of June 1804,) His Royal Highness the Duke of York presented the Ribbon and Badge to the Sovereign, and His Majesty invested Sir John therewith; who, having had the Honour to kiss the Sovereign's Hand, withdrew, and the Procession returned in the Order before observed.

THE Committee appointed to carry into Execution the Acts of Parliament for rendering more commodious, and for better regulating the Port of London, do hereby give Notice, that from and after Lady Day next the Office for conducting the Harbour-Master's Business of the Port of London will be removed from No. 41, Fore-Street, Limehouse, to the Canal Office at Blackwall, and that the present Office in St. Katharine's-Square, below the Tower of London, will be continued as usual until further Notice; and the Committee have directed to be made public, for the Information of all Masters and Commanders of Ships, Vessels, and other Craft using or coming into the Port of London, as well as Pilots and all other Persons, the following Sections of the Bye-Laws for regulating the said Port, so far as relates to the Attendance of the First Harbour-Master at the Office nearest the Custom-House, and also the Attendance of the other Harbour-Masters at each Extremity of the Canal in the Isle of Dogs, viz.

Sec. 3. And be it further ordained and established by the Authority aforesaid, That the First Harbour-Master shall constantly attend every Day, and shall regularly superintend the Conduct and Management of the whole Duty afloat during the Flood Tide in the Course of each Day, and shall, during the remaining Hours, attend for the Transaction of all Public Business at the Office situate nearest the Custom House, or at such other Office or Place between the Tower of London and Blackwall aforesaid, as the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons in Common Council assembled, or any Committee or Committees appointed by them, shall deem necessary and proper, from Time to Time, to regulate and appoint in Writing; which Office shall continue open from Nine o'Clock in the Morning until Five o'Clock in the Afternoon each Day; and whenever the First Harbour Master quits the said Office, a Notice in Writing shall be stuck up on the Door, or left in the Office, daily, announcing the Hour at which he means to return, for the Purpose of receiving any Communication relative to the Harbour-Service, upon Pain of forfeiting for every Default a Sum not exceeding Forty Shillings, nor less than Ten Shillings.

Sec. 14. And for the more speedy and easy Entrance and Exit of all Ships or Vessels into and out

of the said Canal, Be it ordained and established by the Authority aforesaid, That one of the said Harbour-Masters doing alternate Duty as aforesaid, shall, at the Discretion and by the Appointment of the said Board of Harbour Masters as aforesaid, attend and remain at the Eastern Extremity of the said Canal; and the other of the said Harbour-Masters doing alternate Duty as aforesaid, shall, at the like Discretion and Appointment of the said Board of Harbour-Masters as aforesaid, attend and remain at the Western Extremity of the said Canal from the Time of Half Flood until the Expiration of One Hour after high Water, in the Day, to direct, manage, and order, in such Manner as to such Harbour-Masters shall seem most easy, convenient, and expeditious, the Entrance and Exit of all Ships or Vessels passing into, through, or out of the said Canal, on Pain of forfeiting for every Time when such Harbour-Master shall be found absent from his Duty in this Behalf, a Sum not exceeding Forty Shillings, nor less than Ten Shillings.
