LORD VISCOUNT HOWICK, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has this Day notified to the Ministers of Friendly and Neutral Powers resident at this Court, that in consequence of the recent Proceedings, and the present Position of the Enemy upon the Continent, which enables him to command the Navigation of the Rivers Elbe, Wefer, and Ems, His Majesty has judged it expedient to re-establish the most rigorous Blockade at the Entrances of those Rivers; and to maintain and enforce the same, according to the Usages of War acknowledged and allowed in similar Cases.

Sec. 3. And be it further ordained and established by the Authority aforesaid, That the First Harbour-Master shall constantly attend every Day, and shall regularly superintend the Conduct and Management of the whole Duty afloat during the Flood Tide in the Course of each Day, and shall, during the remaining Hours, attend for the Transaction of all Public Business at the Office situate nearest the Custom-House, or at such other Office or Place between the Tower of London and Blackwall aforesaid, as the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons in Common Council assembled, or any Committee or Committees appointed by them, shall deem necessary and proper, from Time to Time, to regulate and appoint in Writing; which Office shall continue open from Nine o'Clock in the Morning until Five o'Clock in the Afternoon each Day; and whenever the First Harbour-Master quits the said Office, a Notice in Writing shall be stuck up on the Door, or left in the Office, daily, announcing the Hour at which he means to return, for the Purpose of receiving any Communication relative to the Harbour-Service, upon Pain of forfeiting for every Default a Sum not exceeding Forty Shillings, nor less than Ten Shillings.

Sec. 14.
