ORD VISCOUNT HOWICK, His Majefty's Prin a cipal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has this Day notified to the Ministers of Friendly and Neutral Powers refident at this Court, that in confequence of the recent Proceedings, and the prefent Polition of the Enemy upon the Continent, which enables him to command the Navigation of the Rivers Elbe, Wefer, and Ems, His Majefty has judged it expedient to re-eftablish the most rigorous Blockade at the Entrances of those Rivers; and to maintain and enforce the fame, according to the Ufages of War acknowledged and allowed in fimilar Cafes.
