# 'The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council.

WHEREAS the Island of Curaçoa and its Dependencies have been furrendered and placed under the immediate Protection of His Majefty's Arms, and the Territory and Forts of the fame have been delivered up to His Majefty, and the faid Island is now in His Majefty's Polledins; His Majefty is thereupon pleafed to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that all His lowing Subjects may lawfully trade to and from the faid Island of Curaçoa, fubject, neverthelefs, to the fame Duties, Rules, Regulations, Conditions, Refrictions, Penaltics, and Forfeitures to which the Trade to and from His Majefty's Colonics, Plantations, and Islands in the Welt Indics is or shall be fubject by Law:

And His Majefty is further pleafed to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that all Commodities, being of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of the faid Ifland of Curaçoa, being in His Majefty's Poffeffion, fhall be permitted to be imported into any of the Ports of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland in Britifh Ships, owned by His Majefty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, fubject to the fame Duties, Rules, Regulations, Refrictions, Conditions, Fenalties, and Forfeitures, as Articles of the like Sort are fubject to coming from His Majefty's Colonics, Plantations, or Iflands in the Weft Indies : And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, and the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

THIS Day the Lords being met, a Message avas fent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Uther of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, aushorifed by wirtue of His Majefly's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Ass agreed upon by

both Houles, do defire the immediate Attendance of the Honorable Houle in the Houle of Peers to hear the Commilfion read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commiffion, empowering the Lord Archbithop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and feveral other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affest given to

An Act for further continuing, until the 25th Day of March 1808, certain Bounties and Drawbacks on the Exportation of Sugar from Great Britain, and for fulpending the Countervailing Duties and Bounties on Sugar, when the Duties impofed by an Act of the laft Seffion of Parliament fhall be fulpended.

An Act to continue, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March 1810, an Act of the Forty-fourth Year of His prefent Majefty, for permitting the Exportation of Salt from the Port of Naffau, in the Island of New Providence, the Port of Exuma, and the Port of Crooked Island, in the Bahama Islands, in Ships belonging to the Inhabitants of the United States of America, and coming in Ballaft.

An A& to repeal Part of the Duty on the Importation of unmanufactured Tobacco into Ireland.

An Act for punishing Mutiny and Defertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters.

An AA for the Regulation of His Majcfty's Royal Marine Forces while on Shore.

An Act for continuing, until the First Day of August 1808, an Act of the Forty fifth Year of His prefent Majetty, for allowing, under certain Refirstions, the bringing a limited Quantity of Coals, Culm, or Cinders, to London and Weltminster by Inland Navigation.

Inland Navigation. Copy of a Letter from Rear-Admiral Sir Edward Pellew, Bart. Commander in Chief of His Ma-jefly's Ships and Veffels in the East Indies, to William Marsden, Esq; dated on board the Culloden, in Madras Roads, the 29th August 1805.

SIR,

THE inclosed Letters from Captains Plampin and Lord George Stuart will convey to their Lordfhips, Intelligence of the Capture of La Bellone, La Henriette, and Iffe de France, Privateers from the Mauritius.

I reflect with much Pleafure on the Capture of La Bellone in particular, as well from her fuperior -Sailing, as her uncommon Success in the prefent, and preceding War against the British Commerce in the Indian and European Seas. The commercial Interests of this Country are particularly fe-cured by her Capture, which could not have been expected but under very favourable Circumstances.

His Majefly's Ship Powerful, Buck-Bay, SIR, Trincomale, 16th July, 1806.

I HAVE the Houour to inform you, that on Wednefday the 9th Inftant, being at Anchor in this Bay, I received Information, by a Ship from Colombo, that La Belione Privateer had returned to her old cruizing Ground, off Dondra Head ; in confequence of which I inftantly put to Sea, and fent Directions to Captain Bailard, of the Rattleinake, (who was in the inner Harbour, taking in the Iron Ballast of the Sheernels, agreeably to your Orders,) to follow, and join me off the Baffes, which he did the next Morning at Daylight. My Intention was, if poffible, to beat up as far as Tengall, into which Place La Bellone had chaced the Ship above mentioned; but on Saturday Morning, being to the Southward of the Great Baffes, I found fo much Wind, and fuch a heavy Sea, that the

and run for the Little Baffes, intending to keep clofe in Shore under their Lee. The Morning being very thick, the Rattlefnake had fortunately feparated in the Afternoon; about a'Quarter paft Three, being about Seven Miles to the Northward of the Little Baffes, a Ship was difcovered on our Weather Beam, Iteering free, with Steering Sails fet ; we were foou convinced it was La Bellone, and very fhortly after we had the Pleafure to fee the Rattlefnake broad on his Weather-Quarter, fo that he could not haul his Wind from us, without being forced to Action by her , he therefore preferred the Chance of croffing between us and the Shore, having at that Time a ftrong Land Wind, and we lying nearly be-calmed; in this hope he was deceived, and was by Five o'Clock within Gun-fhot of us, at which Time he hoifted his Colours, and fired a Broadfide at us, and continued a running Fire until a Quarter before Seven, at which Time, finding there was no poffibility of getting from us, he ftrack his Colours and brought to.

I am forry to add, we had Two Men killed and Eleven wounded; the Enemy acknowledge only One killed, and Six or Seven wounded.

SIR, Trincomale, June 15, 1806. I HAVE the Honour to inform that, purfuant to your Orders, I left Madras Roads early on the 4th Inflant, and arrived at this Anchorage in the Forenoon of the 11th. Having received Intelligence that the Privateer, whole Defeription you favoured me with, had been feen but a few Days, fince in the Neighbourhood of Batecato; I put to fea again in the Afternoon, and being close in with the Land, a-brealt of Friars Hood, the following Evening, I continued flanding to the Southward, under eafy Sail, all Night; at Day-Break of the 13th, we discovered a Ship on the Lee Quarter, with the Courfes up, on the opposite Tack, and had foon the Pleafure to be convinced, by her Appearance and Manœuvres, that it was the Ship we were in Search of. After a Chace of Eleven Hours, during Search of. After a Chace of Liceto Housing her the laft Hour of which fhe continued firing her Stern-Chaces over us, (happily without Effect,) the Bauch his Colours, and brought to. The Ship proved to be La Henrictte, mounting Twenty Guns, Four Twelve-Pounder Carronades, Two Nine Pounders, and Fourteen Six-Pounders, (Four of the latter were hove over during the Chace,) having on board One Hundred and Twenty-four Men, including Officers. She failed from the Ifle of France on the 7th of April.

Extract of a Letter from Captain Chriflopher Cole to Rear Admiral Sir E. Pellevo, Bart. Commander in Chief, Sc. Sc. dated His Majesty's Ship Culloden, at Sea, September 25, 1806

I HAVE the Honour to report to you the Capture of L'Emilien Ship Corvette, of Eighteen Guns and One Hundred and Fifty Men, by His Majefty's Ship under my Command, after a Chace which lafted Two Days and a Night. At Two A. M. on the 25th, we got Poficifion of her clofe off the Shoals of Point Guadaveri. We found that we had driven her on Shore the Night before, and that the had hove overboard Twelve of her Guns, and had loft her Anchors and Boats, before the got afloat again.

L'Emilien was formerly His Majefty's Sloop Trincomale; is Copper-faltened, and was confidered to be one of the fineft Cruizers out of the life of France.—She has heretofore annoyed our Trade by the Name of La Gloire; but has made no Captures fince leaving the life of France, Two Months ago.

SIR

I HAVE the Honour to inclose a Letter from Captain Cramer, of His Majefty's Ship Concorde, flating the Capture of a small French Brig Privateer, at Muscat, mounting Two Eighteen-Pounders.

SIR, July 21, 1806. I HAVE the Honour to inform you, that on my Arrival at this Place I found a French Privateer

Brig lying in the Cove, having been there nearly Five Weeks, and refitting for a Cruize. I immediately reprefented to the Sultan how wrong it was to allow French Privateers to come into his Port, and to refit their Veffels to cruize againft the Englifh, and requefted he would fend her out; after remaining there Three Days, he promifed, if I would go out of Sight for Twenty-four Hours, he would fend her out, which I accordingly did; but in the Dufk of the Evening fent all my Boats in, under the Orders of Lieutenant Rideout, who fell in with her at Daylight, when the hauled down her Colours. She is called the Vigilant, mounting Two Eighteen-Pounders; has been cruizing Five Months in the Arabian Gulph, and had captured One Veffel, belonging to Surat.

Sec. 3. And he it further ordained and eftablished by the Authority aforefaid, That the First Harbour-Mafter shall constantly attend every Day, and Thall regularly superintend the Conduct and Management of the whole Duty afloat during the Flood Tide in the Courfe of each Day, and fhall, during the remaining Hours, attend for the Transaction of all Public Bufinefs at the Office fituate neareft the Cultom-Houfe, or at fuch other Office or Place between the Tower of London and Blackwall aforefaid, as the faid Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons in Common Council affembled, or any Committee or Committees appointed by them, fhall deem ne-ceffary and proper, from Time to Time, to regulate and appoint in Writing; which Office fhall continue open from Nine o'Clock in the Morning until Five o'Clock in the Afternoon each Day; and whenever the First Harbour-Master quits the faid Office, a Notice in Writing shall be sluck up on the Door, or left in the Office, daily, announcing the Hour at which he means to return, for the Purpole of receiving any Communication relative to the Harbour-Service, upon Pain of forfeiting for every Default a Sum not exceeding Forty Shillings, nor lefs than Ten Shillings.
