AT the Court at the *Queen's Palace*, the 1st of April 1807,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Majesty, in Council, was this Day graciously pleased to deliver the Great Seal to the Right Honourable John Lord Eldon, whereupon the Oath of Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain was, by His Majesty's Command, administered to his Lordship, and his Lordship took his place at the Board accordingly.

This Day his Grace Charles Duke of Richmond and Lenox was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took his place at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty, in Council, was this Day pleased to declare his Grace Charles Duke of Richmond and Lenox Lieutenant-General and General-Governor of that Part of the United Kingdom called Ireland.

BARON REHAUSEN, His Swedish Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary at this Court, has this Day delivered to the Right Honourable George Canning, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Note, of which the following is a Translation, announcing the Blockade of the River Peene by the Naval Forces of His Swedish Majesty.

T R A N S L A T I O N.

THE Undersigned Minister Plenipotentiary from His Majesty the King of Sweden, has just received Orders from his Court, to acquaint His Britannic Majesty's Ministry, that in order to protect the Commerce of the Baltic, and for other Military

Reasons, His Majesty has judged it indispensable to cause the Mouth of the River Peene to be blockaded by a sufficient Force in the most rigorous Manner, so as to prevent any Vessels from going to Anclam, Wolgast, Stettin, &c. or from coming from any of those Ports; and that therefore the Mouth of the River Peene is, and must be considered from this Time, as being in a State of Blockade.

In acquitting himself of this Order, the Undersigned has the Honour to assure his Excellency Mr. Canning, of the Sentiments of his high Consideration.
