To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

WE, your Majesty's loyal and dutiful Subjects, the High Sheriff and Grand Jury of the County of Denbigh, assembled at the Assizes held at Ruthin, the 2d Day of April 1807, humbly beg Permission to offer to your Majesty our unanimous and heartfelt Thanks, for the late Instance of that firm Opposition which your Majesty has so conscientiously exerted against every Attempt to infringe upon the Protestant Establishments of this Country, as settled at the Revolution, by granting certain Indulgences to your Majesty's Roman Catholic Subjects of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, which we conceive would prove highly subversive of every Regulation heretofore settled by the wisest Councils, and by whose Decisions the illustrious House of Brunswick was requested to accept of the Government of these Kingdoms.
