THE following Addresses having been transmitted to the Right Honourable Lord Hawkesbury, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, have been by his Lordship presented to the King; which Addresses His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously:

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Mayor, Citizens, and other Inhabitants of the City of Worcester.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, the Mayor, Citizens, and other Inhabitants of the ancient and loyal City of Worcester, approach your Majesty with the warmest Gratitude for the conscientious Regard and inflexible Firmness with which you have uniformly supported the Protestant Religion established in your United Kingdom.

Those Laws which partook of any Spirit of Persecution have, in your Majesty's mild Reign, been repealed; and the Possession of Power, Civil and Military, is in no Degree necessary to the free Profession of religious Faith, and Enjoyment of religious Liberty. It would only afford Pretences and Arguments for new Claims, and give fresh Encouragement to Desires not to be satisfied, consistently with the Existence of that Church, which is inseparable from the British Constitution.

We humbly beg Leave to assure your Majesty with the most perfect Confidence, that, influenced by these Principles, and acting with these Views, you have established your Throne in the Hearts and Affections of your Subjects.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

Most Gracious Sovereign,
