To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

SIRE,

WE, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Magistrates and Council of your Royal Burgh of Inverberrie, assembled at this the presiding Burgh of the District, pursuant to your Majesty's Writ for electing a Burgess to serve in the ensuing Parliament for this District, having now fulfilled that Duty, eagerly embrace the Opportunity of proceeding to the Discharge of another.

We beg to approach your Majesty with Reference to the interesting Events which have lately passed, and to assure our Sovereign that none of his loyal Subjects have participated more warmly in the general Sentiment of Gratitude and Attachment for the necessary and firm Resistance displayed by your Majesty to a Measure threatening our religious Establishments. These Sentiments, however deeply felt by us, we might not have thought it necessary to carry publicly to the Foot of the Throne, had we not observed undue Artifices resorted to for the Purpose of misrepresenting and counteracting the Force of public Opinion, so unequivocally prevalent at this Time throughout the Country. The Partizans of the Ministers whom your Majesty lately dismissed from Office, labour to induce a Belief that the public Mind has been delusively excited to unnecessary Alarm for the Security of our Religion, thus vainly hoping to account for that marked Hostility to the Measure in question, which they too well know arises from the calm and uninfluenced Observation of a discerning People, contemplating not with a bigoted, but with a just Jealousy, every Attempt, however remote, to sap those Bulwarks which our Ancestors so wisely placed round the Pale of our national Church.

We rejoice to find that your Majesty has called to your Councils Ministers acting upon the political Principles of that illustrious and lamented Patriot

William Pitt; to whose pre-eminent Talents, exercised in Times of unparalleled Difficulty, we ascribe, next to your Majesty's paternal Care, the Preservation of all that is dear to us; and we observe, with peculiar Satisfaction, that your Majesty has restored to your Privy Council a Nobleman, whose transcendent Abilities were, during so many Years, conspicuously employed for the Benefit of the State, and from whose yet undiminished Energies we anticipate still further national Advantages. That your Majesty's protecting Arm may long be continued over us, and that this Country may be blessed with a Succession of Princes of your Royal House, equally zealous for the Preservation of our civil and religious Rights, is our most earnest Prayer.

I BEG Leave to inclose you, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a Copy of a Letter I have received from Captain Shipley, of His Majesty's Ship Comus, stating the Capture of Eight of the Enemy's Vessels, which Service appears to have been planned and executed with good Judgment and Energy.

SIR,

I HAVE the Honour to report, for your Information, the Capture of Six of the Enemy's Vessels, (described in the Margin*) by the Boats of His Majesty's Ship under my Command, under the Direction of Lieutenants G. E. Watts and Hood Knight, and Lieutenant J. Campbell, of the Royal Marines, with a Detachment of Petty Officers, Seamen, and Marines. They were moored in the Puerto de Haz, Grand Canaria, and defended by the cross Fire of Three Batteries; Lieutenant Campbell was the only Person wounded on the Occasion.

Since your Orders of the 1st Instant, His Majesty's Ship has also captured Two Spanish Brigs,

HIS Majesty's Ship Comus has just anchored, and I have the Honour to inclose you a Copy of a Letter from Captain Shipley, detailing a gallant Exploit effected by the Boats of that Ship.

His Majesty's Ship Comus, off Canaria, May 9, 1807.

SIR,

I HAVE the Honour to relate to you the Particulars of a gallant Exploit performed last Night by the Boats of His Majesty's Ship, under the Direction of Lieutenant George Edward Watts, and assisted by Lieutenant Hood Knight and Mr. Jeaffreson Miles, Master's Mate, with a Party of Petty Officers, Seamen, and Royal Marines, in the Port of Grand Canaria.

A large armed Felucca, with His Catholic Majesty's Colours flying, had been for the Three last Days lying under the Protection of a strong Port and Two Batteries, and the Wind Yesterday Evening proving favourable, she was boarded by Lieutenant Watts in the large Cutter, under a severe Fire of Musketry from between Thirty and Forty Soldiers, sent to assist in her Defence; and he had nearly cleared her Deck when the Two other Boats, which did not row so well, arrived, and fully accomplished the Business.

Her Cables were now cut, and the Boats took her in Tow, (the Enemy having had the Precaution to send her Sails and Rudder on Shore,) when a Hawser, fast under Water a-stern, was manned in the Fort, and the Vessel dragged nearly under the Muzzels of the Guns before it could be cut, upon which an exceeding heavy Fire from all the Batteries was commenced, and continued until she was out of Sight.

She proves to be the St. Pedro Spanish Packet, having a Cargo of Bale Goods, &c. &c. from Cadiz, bound to Buenos Ayres.

This was effected with the Loss of One Man killed and Five wounded, as per inclosed List. Mr. Watts has several Wounds, but none of them dangerous, and I feel convinced his gallant Conduct, with the Exertions of every Officer and Man employed on this Service, will meet your Approbation.

Twenty-one of the Enemy's Troops were made Prisoners, Eighteen of whom are wounded; the Rest, excepting a few who swam on Shore, were killed, as was her Captain and some of her Crew.

She had captured since her Departure from Cadiz, the Lord Keith, bound from London to Mogador.

His Majesty's Ship has taken and destroyed since the 1st Instant, the St. Francisco Spanish Lugger,

with Wheat and Salt; and La Louisa Schooner, in Ballast, the latter perfectly new.
