Etd very fuddainly in Holltein, will bring a gicat many Troops with him, he intending to form an Arny of 1 zoco Men, which whecher true or falie does allarm th is City, who cannot bot be jo.lous of the leapt motion of that King this way.

Brufels, March 2 8. The Magiffrates of this City have fillally prevailed with the (ommotes to grant the Impofition of the zoth Penny, whith the Duke de Villa Fiermofa asked of them before he left this Governme't; and now the Priuce of larma will make another Demakid in his con Name. On Wedncflay lift we reccived Advice fim Luxem--burg, that 5 or 600 Peafants not being able to bear the irtarment they receiwe from the Fiench, had got together, and had fallen upon three Troops of Horie and two Compani s of Dragoonsas they were -difpert in their Quartes in the night, and had killed about 50 of thim; but that upon the Allarm, toine other French Troops coming to their Afifiancè, the Boors retircd intoa ncighboring Village, where fome handreds more bayf joyned them, bcing refolved to defend themeflves in cale they are attacked. This accident has brought more French Trosps into that Countrey, uporiuhich it is to be feared they will take tl eif Revenge.

Bruflets, Aprilis. The Prinee of Parma was yeferday upon the point of leaving this City, and the Ceurcs and Councils wetre alfo to remove withint tno or thrte days: but upon the Inftances that were maje by the Magiltrates, and fome of the chief of the Commons, his Highnels delayed his departure for fome days, to fee what fuccefs the fecond Demand he has macie of a Supply for the maintainance of 2 g 00 Men that are to be kept in Garrifon here will have. On Sunday laft arrived here an Exprefs from Paris, with Letters from the Spanilh Minifter theru, who as we are informed, acquaintshis Highncf, that upon the Reprefentations he had made, concrrning the Count de Bifj's Procededings in the Province of Luxemburg, he hadreceived this Anfwer: That the King would maintain the Peace, but that he would have what belonged to him ; and that he would Quarter his Troops upon the Countrey till te was poffeffed of fich Places, whichas Dependencies he Mad a Right to. This flay the Count de Taxis was Deciared Prince de la Tour. To morrow the Count d' Archinto gers for Antwerp. On Saturday arrived here the E.arl of Cufecthaven.

Bruffers, Apri 4. The Nations of this City ars ftill Alfembled, but feem not inclined to grant the Supply demanded by this Highnefs, who has theteupon Commanded the Ccurcils and Sovereign Courts to fechove from hence before the $y$ th InPant, and to fettle themfetves at Malines, Louvain, and Vilvord, which eccafions much toroble a nong the People, who are fenfible how much they Chail
fufier thereby, and lad hored that lis Hikh efs would have lea prevailed wi het change d.is Retolution of leavng this placr. The Fr nch Ticols continue in the Conucity of Euxemburg, and live uion she countref-p opie, and Declare tley have Oders fo to do, till Virion antid Arloa be put into their hauds. Frem Lile thy wite, that they are gcing to pull down part of the Walls of Tourat, in ord I to the cullatging the Ciry, asd dill th s be made up again, that a Budy of Men will be pofled at Pont Ejperies, and that rothat cad feveral Troups of the Kings Houlinoldaie alr ady come to Lille and Ipres.

Marfeiles, April 1. Three or fuur Algerines have bencruiting fincet be beginining of the laft Month on thefe Coalts, but all the milchief they have done, has been che tiking of two or three fimall Basks beJunging to Gexoura. Here are in Port thre or four Esgrilh Veflels bound for lta $y$, who dare not venture to Sca till the Coalt is eicar. We are told that the King is fending a fecund Envoje to Argitesy to cndeavour to eliablifh the Pcace; in order whercunto, his Majefy has caufed all the Algerinss that were Slaves in his Galli.s to be relafed.
Paris, April s. We are expecting the arrival of the Mofcovite Ambaffatiors in whis City, who landed at Caiais the laft week, whither they came by Sea from Biollard : We are told that they are fent by the Czar to our King, to propofe an Allyance betwe $n$ them, and to make fome Overtures concerning Trade. This Court is now in Mourning for the death of the Princefs IJabeila. There arrive very frequently Exprelifs from Repse, but we krow not what they bring, farther than that in the general it is faid, That the Cardinal d'E Etree is not like to do any great good there, the Popeappearing refolved net to depart fiom the Rights of the Church.
Deal' Aprill r. This morning we erpyed upon the Goodwin Sands a Flyboat, upon which, feveral Boats wept off to her affiftance, they uuderfood that the was bound from $D_{\text {wikirk }}$ to St. Maloes; but fome hours after the had the good fortune to get off again, and rook her courfe to the Suuth wards.
