**T**HIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly; and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for raising the Sum of Three Millions by Loans or Exchequer Bills, for the Service of Great Britain for the Year 1807.

An Act for raising the Sum of One Million Five Hundred Thousand Pounds by Loans or Exchequer Bills, for the Service of Great Britain for the Year 1807.

An Act to enable His Majesty to grant a certain Annuity to Major-General Sir John Stuart, Knight of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, in Consideration of the eminent Services which he has rendered to His Majesty and the Public.

An Act to indemnify Persons who have advised or acted under an Order of Council for making Regulations with respect to the Navigation and Commerce between His Majesty's Subjects and the Subjects of the United States of America.

An Act to revive and continue, until the Expiration of Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Session of Parliament, Three Acts, passed in the Thirty-seventh, Forty-fifth, and Forty-sixth Years of His Majesty's Reign, for carrying into Execution the Treaty of Amity, Commerce, and Navigation between His Majesty and the United States of America; and for empowering His Majesty to suspend, before the 1st Day of March, 1808, the Provisions of the said Acts, for such Period as His Majesty may deem expedient.

**A** CHAPTER of the Most Noble Order of the Garter having been summoned for this Day, the Knights Companions, in the full Habit of the Order, with the Officers of the Order hereafter-mentioned, in their Mantles, and wearing their Chains and Badges, having assembled in the King's Drawing-Room, repaired from thence at Two o'Clock in order to attend His Majesty in his private Apartment, and, being there called over by Garter King of Arms, a Procession was made to the Chapter-Room in the following Order :

Garter. The Register.

The SOVEREIGN.

The Sovereign and Knights Companions being seated, the Register acquainted the Sovereign that the Right Reverend Dr. John Fisher, Bishop of Salisbury, attended at the Door, and humbly prayed to be admitted to take the Oath of Chancellor of this Most Noble Order; whereupon, being in his Mantle over his Episcopal Habit, he was conducted

to the Sovereign by Garter, carrying, on a Crimson Velvet Cushion, the Purse, Gold Chain, and Badge; and, the Bishop kneeling near the Sovereign, the Oath was administered to him by the Registrar, Garter holding the Gospels; and being invited by the Sovereign with the Gold Chain and Badge, the Purse was delivered to him by His Majesty; and the Bishop, having kissed His Majesty's Hand, withdrew to his Place.

Then the Chancellor signified to the Chapter the Sovereign's Pleasure for filling up the Two vacant Stalls; and as by the Statutes none but a Knight can be elected, Garter was sent to introduce the Marquis of Hertford, who was knighted by the Sovereign with the Sword of State, after which his Lordship withdrew.

Garter then, by the Sovereign's Command, introduced the Earl of Londale, who, being also knighted, retired with the like Ceremony.

The Knights Companions proceeded to the Election; and the Suffrages being collected by the Chancellor, and presented to the Sovereign, Francis Marquis of Hertford was, by His Majesty's Command, declared duly elected. His Lordship was thereupon received at the Door of the Chapter-Room by the Two Junior Knights, and conducted between them to the Sovereign, preceded by Garter, bearing the Ensigns on a Cushion.

Garter presenting the Garter to the Sovereign, His Majesty delivered it to the Two Senior Knights, who buckled it on his Lordship's Left Leg, the Chancellor pronouncing the Admonition.

Garter then presented the Ribband and George to the Sovereign; and, his Lordship kneeling, the Sovereign, with the Assistance of the said Two Senior Knights, put it over his Shoulder, the Chancellor, in the mean Time, pronouncing the Admonition; and his Lordship having kissed His Majesty's Hand, and saluted the Knights present, withdrew.

After which the Knights Companions proceeded to a second Election; and the Suffrages being collected as before, William Earl of Londale was, by His Majesty's Command, declared duly elected: His Lordship being thereupon introduced, was invested with the like Ceremonies.

Garter then called over the Knights Companions, and a Procession was made back to His Majesty's Apartment in the Order as before, except that the Chancellor walked in his Place.

A Dinner was provided for the Knights Companions, to which the Officers of the Order had the Honour of being invited.

CHELSEA HOSPITAL.

THESE are, by Order of the Right Honourable the Lords and others, Commissioners for managing the Affairs of the Royal Hospital at Chelsea, to give Notice, That all Out Pensioners belonging to the said Hospital, residing in London, or within Twenty-five Miles thereof, are required to appear personally and regimentally at the Secretary's Office, in the said Hospital, on the respective Days, and in their different Classes, according to their several Rates of Pension, as undermentioned; when Attendance will be given from Nine o'Clock in the Morning until Three in the Afternoon, for the Payment of Half a Year's Pension in Advance, to Christmas next, with an Augmentation in Proportion to their Disability and Length of Service, according to His Majesty's new Regulations in their Favour.

*On Monday, the 20th of July.*

The Pensioners who receive 6d. per Day, from the different Regiments of Cavalry, Foot Guards, 11th Regiment of Foot, to the 62d Regiment, inclusive.

*On Tuesday, the 21st of July.*

Those who receive 6d. per Day, from the 63d Regiment of Foot, with the remaining Regiments or Corps; as also the Pensioners who receive 9d. per Day, from the several Regiments of Cavalry, Foot Guards, the 11th Regiment of Foot, to the 69th inclusive.

Those who receive 9d. per Day, from the 70th Regiment of Foot, with the remaining Regiments or Corps, as also the Pensioners who receive 1s. per Day, from all the Regiments of Cavalry, the 1st and Coldstream Regiments of Foot Guards.

And that all Out Pensioners belonging to the said Hospital, who live at a greater Distance than Twenty-five Miles from London, and those in Scotland and Ireland, are hereby required and commanded, after the 25th Day of December next, and after every succeeding 25th of December and 25th of June, until further Orders, to apply to One of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace in the Neighbourhood where they reside, and make the following Affidavit, which the said Magistrate for the County, City, Borough, or Riding, before whom the Pensioner appears, will sign and date, viz.

The Affidavit, drawn according to the above Form, sworn before, dated and attested by a Magistrate, is to be put up in a Cover, and sent by the General Post, directed thus: "To the Right Hon. the Paymaster-General of His Majesty's Land Forces, London," marking on the Cover, "Chelsea Pensioners' Affidavit," and Counterparts or Duplicates of the said Affidavits are to be reserved by the Out Pensioners respectively, to be exhibited to such Persons as shall be directed to pay them, that they may be satisfied that all such as may claim Out-Pensions are the real Persons entitled to receive the same.

And to the End that the Commissioners for the Affairs of Chelsea Hospital may be satisfied that the Pensioners are the same Persons who have passed their Examination, it is hereby further directed, that such of them who have served in, and have been discharged from, any of the Regiments, or Independent Companies of Invalids, or Royal Veteran Battalions, are not to mention in their Affidavits such Regiment or Company of Invalids, or Royal Veteran Battalions, in which they served last, but the

Regiment, Troop, or Corps of the Army from which they were first discharged and recommended, and received at Chelsea Hospital.

The Pensioners are particularly to take Notice, that the Half-yearly Payments after Midsummer, are regulated, as to the Place of Payment, by the Musters at Chelsea, or the Affidavits sent as above, after the Christmas preceding; and that the Christmas Payment is in like Manner regulated by the Musters or Affidavits after the Midsummer preceding.

It is also ordered and directed, that no Person who shall change the Place of his Abode given in at his Muster, or specified in his Affidavit aforesaid, and who may apply for his Pension, (excepting to the Officers of Excise nearest such Place of Abode,) shall receive the same, unless it appears, by the Certificate of respectable Persons, that such Removal was through unavoidable Necessity, which he or they could not foresee or prevent; and that if any Pensioner shall fraudulently attempt to receive a double Payment of the Pension, either at Chelsea or at different Places, he shall be struck off the Lists.

Lastly, it is notified, that none will be entered upon the Pay Lists of the said Hospital, or be entitled to receive any Benefit therefrom, who shall not act agreeably to these Orders and Directions, particularly in sending their Half-Yearly Affidavits to the Paymaster-General, as above directed, and to no other Office; which several of the Pensioners have of late either neglected to do, or sent them irregularly to other Departments.
