Navy-Office, October 2, 1807. 1 THE Right Honourable the Lords Commillioners of His Majefly's Treasury baving appointed Money for the Payment of Half-Pay to Sea Officers, from the 1A January to the 30th June 1807, according to His Majefty's Eftablishment on that Behalf,

These are to give Notice, that the several Payments will begin to be made at the Pay-Office, by the Trea-surer of His Majesty's Navy, at Ten o'Clock in the Morning, on the following Days, wiz.

On Monday the 12th Inflant, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attornies.

On Tuesday the 13th, and Wednesday the 14th, to Lieutenants, and their Attornies.

On Thursday the 15th, to Masters, Surgeons, and their Attornies.

After which the Lift will be recalled the first and third Wednesday in every Month, that all Persons may then and there attend to receive rubat may become payable to them, and not only bring with them the Affidavit required, touching their not having enjoyed the Benifit of any Public Employment, either at Sea or on Shore, during the Time they are to be paid their Half-Pay, but also to produce Certificates that they have subscribed to the Ieft, and taken the Oaths of Allegiance required by All of Parliament to His prefent Majefty; and in ease any of the faid Officers should not be able to attend. themselves, but employ Attornies for that Purpoje, that the faid Attornies do produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Perfons they are employed by.  <sup>45</sup> Nawy in London, to have such Half-Pay paid at or "near to the Place of his Refidence, in the Manner pointed "out by the faid Act;" Notice is bereby further given, that the Half-Pay, ending the 30th June laft, will commence paying on the 12th Infant; and all Perfons defirous of basing their Half Pay remitted may apply R.
