The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

IIIS Majefty having been pleafed to appoint John Earl of Chatham, K. G. to be Governor of the Island of Jersey, his Lordship, this Day, took the Oaths appointed to be taken by the Governor of that Island.

By the KING. A PROCLAMATION,

For recalling and prohibiting Seamen from serving Foreign Princes and States.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS it hath been represented unto Us, that great Numbers of Mariners and Seafaring Men, Our Natural-born Subjects, have been enticed to enter into the Service of Foreign States, and are now actually ferving as well on board the Ships of War belonging to the faid Foreign States, as on board the Merchant Vessels belonging to their Subjects, notwithstanding Our former Proclamation recalling them, contrary to the Duty and Allegiance which Our faid Subjects owe unto Us, and to the great Differvice of their Native Country; We have therefore thought it necessary at the present Moment, when Our Kingdom is menaced and endangered, and when the Maritime Rights, on which its Power and Greatness do mainly depend, are disputed and called in question, to publish, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, this Our Royal Proclamation:

We do hereby ftrictly charge and command all Masters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Shipwrights, and other Seafaring Men, being Our Natural-born Subjects, who may have been enticed into the Pay or Service of any Foreign State, or do ferve in any Foreign Ship or Veffel, that, forthwith, they and every of them do (according to their bounden Duty and Allegiance, and in Confideration that their Native Country hath need of all their Services), withdraw themselves, and depart from, and quit such Foreign Services, and do return home to their Native Country; or do enter on board such of Our Ships of War as they may chance to fall in with, either on the high Seas, or in any Rivers, Waters, Havens, Roads, Ports, or Places whatsever or wheresoever.

And, for the better Execution of the Purpoles of this Our Royal Proclamation, We do autnorize and command all Captains, Masters, and others, commanding Our Ships and Vessels of War, to stop and make ftay of all and every fuch Perfon or Perfons (being our Natural-born Subjects) as shall endeavour to transport or enter themselves into the Service of any Foreign State, contrary to the Intent and Command of this Our Royal Proclamation, and to feize upon, take, and bring away all fuch Perfons as aforefaid, who shall be found to be employed or ferving in any Foreign Merchant Ship or Veffel as aforesaid :- but We do strictly enjoin all such Our Captains, Masters, and others, that they do permit no Man to go on board fuch Ships and Vessels belonging to States at Amity with Us, for the Purpose of so seizing upon, taking, and bringing away fuch Persons as aforesaid, for whose discreet and orderly Demeanor the faid Captains cannot answer; and that they do take especial Care that no unneceffary Violence be done or offered to the Veffel, or to the Remainder of the Crew, from out of which fuch Persons shall be taken:

And in case of their receiving Information of any such Person or Persons being employed, or

ing to fach Foreign State, being a State at Amity with Us, We do authorize and command Our Captains, Masters, and others, commanding Our Ships of War, to require of the Captain or Commander of fuch Foreign Ship of War, that he do forthwith release and discharge such Person or Persons, being our Natural-born Subject or Subjects; and if fuch Release and Discharge shall be refused, then to transmit Information of such Refulal to the Commander in Chief of the Squadron under whose Orders such Captain or Commander shall be then ferving; which Information the faid Commander in Chief is hereby ftrictly directed and enjoined to transmit, with the least possible Delay, to Our Minister residing at the Seat of Government of that State to which the faid Foreign Ship of War shall belong, or to Our Lord High Admiral, or Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being, in order that We, being apprized of fuch Proceeding, may forthwith direct the necessary Steps to be taken for obtaining Redress from the Government to which fuch Foreign Ship of War fhall belong, for the Injury done to Us by the unwarranted Detention of Our Natural-born Subjects in the Service of a Foreign State:

And whereas it has further been represented unto .Us, that divers Mariners and Seafaring Men, Our Natural-born Subjects, have been induced to accept Letters of Naturalization, or Certificates of Citizenship, from Foreign States, and have been taught to believe that, by fuch Letters or Certificates, they are discharged from that Duty of Allegiance which, as Our Natural-born Subjects, they owe to Us; now We do hereby warn all Iuch Mariners, Seafa. ring Men, and others, Our Natural born Subjects, that no fuch Letters of Naturalization, or Certificares of Citizenship, do, or can, in any Manner, divest our Natural-born Subjects of the Allegiance, or in any Degree alter the Duty which they owe to Us their lawful Sovereign. But, in confideration of the Error into which fuch Mariners and Seafaring Men as aforesaid may have been led, We do hereby publish and declare Our free Pardon to all fuch Our Subjects, who, repenting of the Delufion under which they have acted, shall immediately, upon Knowlege of this Our Royal Proclamation, -withdraw themselves from Foreign Service, and return to their Allegiance to Us; and We do declare that all fuch Our Subjects, who shall continue in the Service of Foreign States, in Difregard and Contempt of this Our Royal Proclamation, will not only incur Our just Displeasure, but are liable to be

ferving on board of any Ship of War belonging to such Foreign State, being a State at
Amity with Us, We do authorize and command Our Captains, Masters, and others, commanding Our Ships of War, to require of the Captain
or Commander of such Foreign Ship of War, that
he do forthwith release and discharge such Person or
Persons, being our Natural-born Subjects or Subincress, and if such Release and Discharge shall be
Great Britain:

And We do further notify, that all such Our Subjects as aforesaid, who have voluntarily entered, or shall enter, or voluntarily continue to serve on board of any Ships of War belonging to any Foreign State at Enmity with Us, are and will be guilty of High Treason: And We do by this Our Royal Proclamation declare, that they shall be punished with the utmost Severity of the Law.

Given at Our Court at the Queen's Palace, the Sixteenth Day of October, One thousand eight hundred and seven, and in the Fortyseventh Year of Our Reign.

AT the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 30th of September 1807,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS, in virtue of the Powers vested in W His Majesty by an Act, passed in the last Sef-fion of Parliament, intituled "An Act for reviving and continuing feveral Laws of Cultoms relating to the establishing Courts of Judicature in the Island of Newfoundland; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation to, Great Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and nine; and for continuing several Laws relating to the granting a Bounty upon certain Species of British and Irish Linens exported from Great Britain, and taking off the Duties on Importation into Great Britain of Foreign Raw Linen Yarns made of Flax; to the granting a Bouncy upon the Importation into Great Britain of Hemp, and rough and undreffed Flax, from His Majesty's Colonies in America, and to the Encouragement of the Greenland Whale Fisheries; and for reviving and continuing feveral Laws relating to the regulating the Prices at which Corn and Grain may be exported from Great Britain to Ireland, and from Ireland to Great Britain; and to the Admission to Entry in Great Britain of Oil and Blobber of Newfoundland, taken by His Majesty's Subjects carrying on the Fishery from, and residing in, the said Island; and for continuing an Act of the Twenty third Year of His present Majesty, for the more effectual Encouragement of the Manufactures of Flax and Cotton in Great Britain; and for reviving and continuing feveral Laws relating to the permitting the Importation into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in Foreign Ships; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from Ireland of Corn or Potatoes, or other Provisions, and to the ermitting the Importation into Ireland of Corn, Fish, and Provisions, without Payment of Duty, un til the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eight; and for reviving and continuing an Act, passed in the Parliament of Ireland in the Twenty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, for the Encouragement of the Flaxen and Hempen Manufactures of Ireland until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and twentyfeven; and for amending and further continuing an Act made in the Seventh Year of His prefent Majefly for the free Importation into Great Britain of Cochineal and Indigo, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and nine:"

His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Fifteenth Day of April last, to permit for the Space of Six Months, from the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of April, the Importation of fundry Articles of Provi-fions, therein specified, Duty free: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Permission should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council to allow, and doth hereby allow, for and during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Sixteenth Day of this instant October, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain of any Beans, called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulse; and also of Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine, and of Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, (except Salted Beef, and Pork.) and of Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheefe, Potatoes, Sago, Sago Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatfoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all such Articles as aforesaid, that shall be To imported with the proper Officers of the Customs at the Port where the same shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in an Act paffed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty; and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.
