ARMY HALF-PAY.

Pay-Office, Horse-Guards, Oct. 19, 1807.

IN pursuance of an Act of the 47th Year of His present Majesty, Sess. 2. Cap. 25, intituled "An Act for the more convenient Payment of Half-Pay, and other Allowances to Officers, and Widows of Officers, and to Persons on the Com-
"passionate List," Notice is hereby given, by Directions of the Right Honourable the Paymaster-General, that all Officers, who may wish to be paid in their own Districts, from and after the 24th of December 1807, under the Provisions of the said Act, are required to send, under Cover to the Right Honourable the Paymaster-General of His Majesty's Forces, Pay-Office, Horse-Guards, (writing thereon the Words, "Half-Pay Affidavits," to ensure their Delivery in the proper Department,) their Affidavits immediately after the 25th June, and 25th December, in each Year, siting at the same Time, by Letter, the Receiver-General of the Land-Tax, the Collector of the Cels in Scotland, the Collector of the Customs or Excise, or the Collector of the Duties under the Management of the Commissioners for the Affairs of Taxes, from whom they are desirous of receiving the Monies due to them; and, where the whole Amount of the Income is under 150l. per Ann. always to transmit with said Affidavits to the 24th December, an Affidavit, according to the under-mentioned Form, of the whole of their Income, if it be derived from Military Appointments only; and if it be a mixed Income, (that is derived from different Sources,) a Certificate of the District Commissioners, to whom their Returns have been made, of the whole of their Income, including their Half-Pay, in order that their Half-Pay may be assessed to the Property-Tax, and a Bill for the Net Sum remitted to them, as soon as the Monies for that Service are in Course of Payment, Notice of which will be advertised in the Gazette.—Where the whole of the Income amounts to 150l. per Annum, it will then be sufficient to state, instead of specifying the Amount thereof, that the full Tax is to be taken from the Half-Pay.

If the above Directions are not strictly complied with, a Bill for the Half-Pay cannot be remitted.
