s ived the la? week from France told us, That the King, upon the Spanish Ambassadors Declaring to lim, that Orders had been fent for the Evacuation of Virton, had Commanded the Count de Billy o retire with his Troops out of Luxemburg, which made us the more castly believe what was writ in some Letters from thence, that the said Troops were leaving that Countrey, but it proves a mistake, for we have fresh Letters which say, that they still continue there, and that the Count de Biffy had required tome [mall Places, as Rhemich, Cravenmacheren, &c to furnish him with great quantities of Provisions, and at the sime time had forbid them to fend any to the City of Luxemburg.

Bruffelt, April 22, The Count & Archinto is re-

turned from Antwerp, having composed the difference between the Magisfrates and the People, and Adjutted all Matters to his Highneffes latisfaction. Count d' Erpe is likewise returned from Limburg, having obtained the Sublidies he went thither to, Demand of the States of that Province in his Highness's Name. His Highness has received an account from Guelderland, that the Elector of Brandenburg will be at Cleves before the end of the next Month; that at Wesel and Lipstade they are providing a great many Carriages for Cannon, Pontoons, and Ammunition-Waggons, and that feveral Officers are employed in raising of Men. From Luxemburg they write, that the french do not yet make any thew of leaving that Countrey; but that on the contrary, they make a new Claim to the Prevofty of Rhemich; and not content with the Evacuation of Virton, they Demand to have the same, delivered into their hands by a formal Act, acknowledging their Right; but the Prince of Parma, thinks he has done enough in withdrawing the Spanilh Troops, and leaving it to the Count de Biffy to take Possession if he please. Don Alexander Farneffe, the Prince's Son, having entred himself a Volontier in the Marquis of Bedmar's Regiment of Spanish Foot, and Mounting the Guard yesterday for the first time, it was done with much Ceremony; the Prince de Rache Maistre de Camp-General of the King's Forces in these Provinces, supplying the place of the Major, and Leading the Regiment, the Prince de Vaudemont, and Don Antonio d'Agurto General of the Artillery, discharging the Place of Adjutants, the Mai quis de Bedmar, and Monsieur Sarmiento, Generals of Batallia, that of Sergeants, and all the Colo icls that were in Town, that of Corporals, belides lever! Persons of Quality accompanied Don Alexander, and carried Pikes; after which the Prince of Parma Entertained them at Supper, and with the same Solemnity the Guard was this day religion.

Hague, April 22. The Count d'Augus, Ambassador from France, has by a Memorial acquainted the States-General, that the Ftench Commissioners will be at Courtray on the second of the next Month, to renew the Conferences for the determining the differences concerning the Limits.
