PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Twenty-fecond Day of December One thousand eight hundred and fix, for the Payment of Bounties for the Encouragement of Seamen and Landmen to enter into His Majesty's Royal Navy; and the Rewards for discovering Seamen who may conceal themselves, so that such Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service; and also the Rewards to Persons who should procure the voluntary Service of Able and Ordinary Seamen and Landmen, fit for His Majesty's Naval Service, and should convey such Seamen and Landmen on board any of His Majesty's Ships and Veffels, or to any of His Majefty's Sea Officers employed in raifing Men, will expire on the Thirty-first Day of December next; which Bounties and Rewards are as follows; that is to fay, To every Able Seanian, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should enter himself to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, a Bounty of Five Pounds; and to every Ordinary Seaman fo entering himfelf, and not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, a Bounty of Two Pounds Ten Shillings; to every Able bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, fo entering himfelf, a Bounty of Thirty Shillings; to any Person or Persons who shall discover any Able or Ordinary Seaman or Seamen, who may have concealed him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen shall be taken for His Majesty's Service by any of His Majesty's Officers employed to raife Men, a Reward of Three Pounds for every fuch Able Seaman, and Fifty Shillings for every fuch Ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships; to any Person or Persons who shall procure the voluntary Service of Able or Ordinary Seamen

or Landmen, fit for His Majesty's Service, and shall convey them on board any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or to any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in raifing Men, a Reward of Three Guineas for every fuch Able Seaman, Two Guineas for every fuch Ordinary Seaman, and One Guinea for every fuch Landman, together with an Allowance at the Rate of One Penny per Mile for each Able Seaman, Ordinary Seaman, and Landman, for every Mile fuch Men may respectively travel to the nearest of His Majesty's Ships of War, or nearest Place of Refidence of any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in raifing Men; provided fuch Man shall be found fit for His Majesty's Service. and there shall not be Reason to suppose that he is an Apprentice: And whereas it is expedient that the faid feveral Bounties, Rewards, and travelling Allowance should be continued to be paid for some Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Payment of the faid Bounties, Rewards, and travelling Allowance beprolonged and extended from the faid Thirty-first Day of December next to the Thirty-first Day of Decembet One thousand eight hundred and eight, inclusive, and that the same be paid in the Manner specified in His Majesty's several Proclamations now in force, for the Encouragement of Seamen and Landmen to enter into His Majesty's Royal Navy, and for the discovering Seamen who may conceal themselves, and for giving Rewards for procuring the voluntary Service of Seamen and Landmen; whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly. And every Veffel failing on or after those Days, from those Places respectively, shall be deemed and taken to have received Notice of the aforefaid Order: And it is further ordered, that if any Veffel shall fail within Twenty Days after the Periods above affigured respectively, from any of the said Places, in Contravention of the said Order of the Eleventh of November instant, and shall be detained as Prize on account thereof, or shall arrive at any Port in this Kingdom, deftined to some Port or Place within the Restriction of the said Order, and Proof shall be made to the Satisfaction of the Court of Admiralty in which fuch Veffel shall be proceeded against, in cafe the same shall be brought in as Prize, that the Loading of the faid Veffel had commenced before the faid Periods, and before Information of the faid Order had actually been received at the Port of Shipment, the faid Veffel, together with the Goods fo laden, shall be restored to the Owner or Owners thereof, and shall be permitted to proceed on her Vo age in such stanner as if fuch Veffel had failed before the Day to specified as aforetaid. And it is further ordered, that no Proof shall be admitted, or be gone into, for the Purpole of thewing that Infor- !

WHEREAS His Majesty, by His Order in Council, dated Eleventh November instant, respecting the Trade to be carried on with His Majesty's Enemies, was pleased to exempt from the Reltrictions of the faid Order, all Veffels which shall have cleared out from any Port or Place in this Kingdom, under fuch Regulations as His Majesty may think fit to prescribe, and shall be proceeding direct to the Ports specified in the respective Clearances; His Majefly, taking into Confideration the Expediency of making such Regulations, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that all Veffels belonging to Countries not at War with His Majesty, shall be permitted to lade in any Port of the United Kingdom any Goods being the Produce or Manufacture of His Majesty's Dominions, or East India Goods, or Prize Goods, (all fuch Goods having been lawfully imported) and to clear out with, and freely to convey the fame to any Port or Place in any Colony in the West Indies, or America, belonging to His Majesty's Enemies, such Port or Place not being in a State of actual Blockade, fubject to the Payment of fuch Duties as may at the Time when any fuch Veffels may be cleared out, be due by Law on the Exportation of any fuch Goods, or in respect of the same being destined to the Ports of the Colonies belonging to His Majesty's Enemies; and likewise to lade, clear out with, and couvey as aforefaid, any Articles of Foreign Produce or Manufacture which shall have been lawfully imported into this Kingdom, provided His Majesty's Licence shall have been previously obtained for so conveying such Foreign Produce or Manusactures:

And it is further ordered, that any Vessel belonging as aforesaid shall be permitted to lade in any Port of the United Kingdom any Goods, not being Naval or Minitary Stores, which shall be of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of this Kingdom, or which shall have been lawfully imported, (save and except Foreign Sugar, Cosse, Wine, Brandy, Smuss, and Cotton,) and to clear out with, and freely to convey the same to any Port, to be specified in the Clearance, not being in a State of actual Blockade, although the same shall be under the Restrictions of the said Order; and likewise to lade, clear out, and convey Foreign Sugar, Cosse, Wine, Brandy, Snuss, and Cotton, which shall have been lawfully imported, provided His Majesty's Licence shall have been previously obtained for the Exportation and Conveyance thereof: And it is hereby further ordered, that no Vessel shall be per-

mitted to clear out from any Port or Place in this Kingdom to any Port or Place of any Country fubjected to the Reffrictions of the faid Order, with any Goods which shall have been laden (after Notice of the faid Order) on board the Veffel which shall have imported the fame into this Kingdom, without having first duly entered and landed the same in some Port or Place in this Kingdom; and that no Veffel shall be permitted to clear out from any Port or Place in this Kingdom to any Port or Place whatever, with any Goods the Produce or Manufacture of any Country subjected to the Restrictions of the faid Order, which shall have been laden after Notice as aforefaid on board the Veffel importing the fame without having fo duly entered and landed the fame; or any Goods whatever which shall have been laden after fuch Notice in the Veffel importing the fame, in any Port or Place of any Country subjected to the Redrictions of the faid Order, without having to duly entered and landed the fame in fome Port or Place in this Kingdom, except the Cargo shall confift wholly of Flour, Meal, Grain, or any Article or Articles the Produce of the Soil of some Country which is not subjected to the Restrictions of the faid Order, except Cotton, and which shall have been imported in an unmanufactured State direct from fuch Country into this Kingdom, in a Vellel belonging to the Country from which such Goods have been brought, and in which the same were grown and produced :

And it is further ordered, that any Vessel belonging to any Country not at War with His Majesty, may clear out from Guernsey, Jersey, or Man, to any Port or Place under the Restrictions of the faid Order, which shall be specified in the Clearance, not being in a State of actual Blockade, with fuch Articles only, not being Naval or Military Stores, as shall have been legally imported into such Islands respectively, from any Port or Place in this Kingdom direct; and with respect to all such Articles as may have been imported into the faid Islands respectively, from any Port or Place under the Restrictions of the faid Order, it shall not be permitted to any Veffel to clear out with the same from any of the faid Islands, except to some Port or Place in this Kingdom : - And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Judges of the High Court of Admiralty and Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take the necessary Meafures herein as to them shall respectively appertain. W HEREAS His Majesty, by His Order in Council dated the Eleventh of November instant, respecting the Trade to be carried on with His Majesty's Enemies, was pleased to exempt from the Restrictions of the said Order all Vessels belonging to any Country not at War with His Majesty, together with their Cargo, which shall be coming from any Port or Place in Europe which is declared in the said Order to be subject to the Restrictions in

cident to a State of Blockade, direct to some Port or Place in Europe belonging to His Majesty, and also all Vessels which shall be cleared out from Gibraltar or Malta under such Regulations as His Majesty may think sit to prescribe, and which shall be proceeding direct to the Ports specified in their respective Clearances:

And whereas it is expedient to encourage the Trade from Gibraltar and Malta to Countries under the Restrictions of the faid Order, subject to Regulations to be made in respect thereto; His Majesty is therefore pleafed to prescribe the following Regulations in regard to such Trade, accordingly, and by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that all Sorts of Flour and Meal, and all Sorts of Grain, Tobacco, and any other Article in an unmanufactured State, being the Growth and Produce of any Country not being fubjected by the faid Order to the Restrictions incident to a State of Blockade, except Cotton, and Naval and Military Stores, which shall have been imported into Gibraltar or Malta direct from the Country where the same were grown and produced, shall, without any Licence, be permitted to be cleared out to any Port or Place not being in a State of actual Blockade, without the same being compelled to be landed: But neither the faid Article of Cotton, however imported, nor any Article which is not the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of this Kingdom, or which has not been imported in a British Ship, or from this Kingdom direct, (except Fish,) and which shall have been laden at the Port of original Shipment after the Period directed by an Order of this Date to be taken as the Time at which Notice of the faid Order of the Eleventh of November shall be confidered as having been received at fuch Port of Shipment, shall be permitted to be exported from Gibraltar or Malta, except to fome Port or Place in this Kingdom; and all other Articles of the Growth, Produce, and Manufacture of this Kingdom, or which shall have been imported into Gibraltar or Malta in a British Ship, or from some Port or Place in this Kingdom, together with the Article of Fish, however imported, may be exported to any Ports or Places in the Mediterranean or Portugal, under fuch Licence only as is hereinafter directed to be granted by the Governor of Gibraltar and Malta respectively:

And it is hereby further ordered, that Licences be granted by the Governors, Lieutenant-Governors, or other Persons baving the Chief Civil Command at Gibraltar or at Malta respectively, but in His Majesty's Name, to sugh Person or Persons as the faid Governors, Lieutenant-Governors, or Persons having the Chief Civil Command shall think fit, allowing fuch Person or Persons to export from Gibraltar direct, to any Port in the Mediterranean, or to any Port of Portugal, or to any Port of Spain without the Mediterranean, not further North than Cape Finisterre, and from Malta direct to any Port being within the Mediterranean, with any Articles of the Produce or Manufacture of His Majesty's Dominions, and any Articles which shall have been imported into Gibraltar or Malta from this Kingdom, to whomsoever fuch Articles shall appear to belong, (not being Naval or Military Stores,) in any Veffel belonging to any Country not at War with His Majesty, or in any Vessel not exceeding One Hundred Tons Bur-

then; and being unarmed, belonging to the Country to which fuch Veffel shall be cleared out and going, and also to import in any fuch Vessel or Vessels as aforefaid, from any Port within the Mediterranean, to Gibraftar or Malta; or from any Port in Portugal or Spain as aforefaid, to Gibraltar; fuch Port and fuch Destination respectively to be specified in such Licence, any Articles of Merchandize whatfoever, and to whomfoever the fame may appear to belong; fuch Articles to be specified in the Bill of Lading of such Veffel, subject however to such further Regulations and Restrictions with respect to all or any of the said Articles fo to be imported, or exported, as may be inferted in the faid Licences by the Governors, Lieutenant-Governors, or other Persons having the Chief Civil Command at Gibraltar, or Malta, for the Time being respectively, as to them shall, from Time to Time, feem fit and expedient :

And it is further ordered, that in every such Licence shall be inserted the Names and Residence of the Person or Persons to whom it shall be granted, the Articles and their Quantities permitted to be exported, the Name and Description of the Vessel, and of the Master thereof, the Port to which the Vessel shall be allowed to go, which shall be some Port not under actual Blockade; and that no Licence so to be granted shall continue in force for longer than Two Months from its Date, nor for more than One Voyage; nor any such Licence be granted, or acknowledged to be valid, if granted to permit the Clearance of any Vessel to any Port which shall be actually blockaded by any Naval Force

of His Majesty or of His Allies:
And it is further ordered, that the Commanders of His Majesty's Ships of War and Privateers, and all others whom it may concern, shall suffer every such Vessel sailing conformably to the Permission given by this Order, or having any Licence as aforesaid, to pass and repass, direct between Gibraltar, or Malta, and such Port as shall be specified in the Licence, in such Manner, and under such Terms, Regulations, and Restrictions as shall be expressed therein:

And it is further ordered, that, in case any Vessel, so failing as aforesaid, for which any such Licence as aforesaid shall have been granted, and which shall be proceeding direct upon her said Voyage, shall be detained and brought in for legal Adjudication, such Vessel, with her Cargo, shall be forthwith released by the Court of Admiralty or Vice-Admiralty in which Proceedings shall be commenced, upon Proof being made that the Parties had duly conformed to the Terms, Regulations, and Restrictions of the said Licence: the Proof of such Conformity to lie upon the Person or Persons claiming the Benefit of this Order, or obtaining or using such Licence, or claiming the Benefit thereof:

And it is hereby further ordered, that no Veffel belonging to any State on the Coast of Barbary shall be prevented from failing with any Articles of the Growth or Produce of such State, from any Port or Place in such State, to any Port or Place in the Mediterranean, or Portugal, such Port or Place not being actually blockaded by some Naval Force belonging to His Majesty, or his Allies, without being obliged to touch at Gibraltar, or

HEREAS His Majesty, by His Order in Council of the Eleventh of November instant. was pleased to order and declare, that all Trade in Articles which are of the Produce or Manufacture of the Countries and Colonies mentioned in the faid Order, shall be deemed and considered to be unlawful (except as is therein excepted); His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, is pleafed to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that nothing in the faid Order contained shall extend to subject to Capture and Confiscation any Articles of the Produce and Manusacture of the said Countries and Colonies laden on board British Ships, which would not have been subject to Capture and Confiscation if such Order had not been made: - And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Judges of the High Court of Admiralty and Courts of Vice-Admiralty are to take the necessary Measures herein as to them shall respectively appertain.

HIS Majesty, taking into Consideration the Cir-cumstances under which Prussia and Lubeck have been compelled to flut their Ports against British Ships and Goods, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that all Ships and Goods belonging to Prussia which may have been seized subsequent to His Majesty's Order of the Nineteenth of November, One thousand eight hundred and Six, and are now detained in the Ports of this Kingdom, or elfewhere, and all Ships and Goods belonging to Inhabitants of Lubeck which are fo detained, shall be reftored upon being pronounced by the High Court of Admiralty, or any Court of Vice-Admiralty, in which they have been or may be proceeded against, to belong to Subjects and Inhabitants of Prussia or Lubeck, and not otherwise liable to Confiscation; and that such Ships and Goods shall be permitted to proceed to any Neutral Port, or to the Port to which they respectively belong: And it is further ordered, that the Ships and Goods belonging to Pruffia or Lubeck shall not, until further Orders, be liable to Detention, provided fuch Ships and Goods shall be trading to or from any Port of this Kingdom, or between Neutral Port and Neutral Port, or from any Port of His Majesty's Allies, and proceeding direct to the Port specified in their respective Clearances:



And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commisfioners of the Admiralty, and the Judges of the High Court of Admiralty and Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take the necessary Measures herein, as to them shall respectively appertain.

IIS Majesty taking into Consideration the Circumstances under which Portugal has been compelled to shut her Ports against the Ships and Goods of His Majesty's Subjects, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that all Ships and Goods be-longing to Portugal, which have been, and are now detained in the Ports of this Kingdom, or elfewhere, shall be restored, upon being pronounced, by the High Court of Admiralty, or by the Court of Vice-Admiralty, in which Proceedings may have been, or shall be commenced, to belong to Subjects and Inhabitants of Portugal, and not otherwise liable to Confifcation; and that the faid Ships and Goods shall be permitted to proceed to any Neutral Port, or to Portugal: And it is further ordered, that the Ships and Goods belonging to Portugal shall not, until further Orders, be liable to Detention; provided such Ships and Goods shall be trading to or fr m any Port of this Kingdom, or to and from Gibraltar, or Malta, and proceeding direct to the Port specified in their Clearance, or between Neutral Port and Neutral Port, or between Portugal and the Ports of her own Colonies, or from any Port of His Majesty's Allies, and proceeding direct to the Ports specified in their respective Clearances; provided fuch Ports shall not be at the Time in a State of actual Blockade: And it is further ordered, that the Ships of Portugal shall not be considered as entitled, under any Treaty between His Majesty and Portugal, to protect any Goods laden therein which may be otherwise subject to Confiscation.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commifsioners of the Admiralty, and the Judges of the High Court of Admiralty and Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take the necessary Measures herein as to them shall respectively appertain.
