Able Seaman, and Fifty Shillings for every fuch Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majefty's Ships; to any Perfon or Perfons who fhall procure the voluntary Service of Able or Ordinary Seamen or Landmen, fit for His Majefty's Service, and fhall convey them on board any of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels, or to any of His Majefty's Sea Officers employed in railing Men, a Reward of Three Guineas for every fuch Able Seaman, Two Guineas for every fuch Ordinary Seaman, and One Guinea for every fuch Landman, together with an Allowance at the Rate of One Penny per Mile for each Able Seaman, Ordinary Seaman, and Landman, for every Mile fuch Men may refpectively travel to the nearest of His Majesty's Ships of War, or nearest Place of Refidence of any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in raising Men; provided fuch Man shall be found fit for His Majesty's Service, and there shall not be Reason to suppose that he is an Apprentice : And whereas it is expedient that the faid feveral Bounties, Rewards, and travelling Allowance fhould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer, His Majelly, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Payment of the faid Bounties, Rewards, and travelling Allowance be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty-firft Day of December next to the Thirty-first Day of Decembet One thousand eight hundred and eight, inclusive, and that the same be paid in the Manner fpecified in His Majefty's feveral Proclamations now in force, for the Encouragement of Seamen and Landmen to enter into His Majesty's Royal Navy, and for the difcovering Seamen who may conceal themselves, and for giving Rewards for procuring the voluntary Service of Seamen and Landmen; whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly. ## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS in virtue of the Powers vefted in His Majelty by an Act, paffed in the Fortyfixth Year of His Majelty's Reign, intituled " An Act for reviving and continuing feveral Laws of Cuftoms relating to the establishing Courts of Judicature in the Island of Newfoundland ; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation to, Great Britain of Corn ; and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provifion without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and nine ; and for continuing feveral Laws relating to the granting a Bounty upon certain Species of British and Irish Linens exported from Great Britain, and taking off the Duties on Importation into Great Britain of Foreign Raw Linen Yarns made of Flax ; to the granting a Bounty upon the Importa-tion into Great Britain of Hemp, and rough and undreffed Flax, from His Majefty's Colonies in America ; and to the Encouragement of the Greenland Whale Fisheries; and for reviving and continuing feveral Laws relating to the regulating the Prices at which Corn and Grain may be exported from Great Britain to Ireland, and from Ireland to

Great Britain; and to the Admiffion to Entry in Great Britain of Oil and Blubber of Newfoundland, taken by His Majefty's Subjects carrying on the Fifhery from, and refiding in, the faid Ifland; and for continuing an Act of the Twenty-third Year of His present Majesty, for the more effectual Encouragement of the Manufactures of Flax and Cotton in Great Britain; and for reviving and continuing feveral Laws relating to the permitting the Impor-tation into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in Foreign Ships; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from Ireland of Corn and Potatoes, or other Provisions ; and to the permitting the Importation into Ireland of Corn, Fifh, and Provisions without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eight; and for reviving and continuing an Act, paffed in the Parliament of Ireland in the Twentyfifth Year of His prefent Majefty, for the Encouragement of the Flaxen and Hemp Manufactures ot Ireland, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and twenty-feven; and for amending and further continuing an A&, made in the Seventh Year of His prefent Majefty, for the free Importation into Great Britain of Cochineal and Indigo, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and nine :" It was, amongst other Things, enacted, that an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His prefent Majefty, intituled An Act for permitting, until the Fifth Day of May, One thousand eight hundred and five, the Importation of Hides, Calf-Skins, Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) in Foreign Ships, on Payment of the like Duties, as if imported in Britilh or Irilh Ships; which, by an Act made in the Forty-fifth Ycar of His Majelty's Reign, was revived and further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and fix, and extended to Goat Skins imported in Foreign Ships, fhould be, and the fame was thereby revived and further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eight : And whereas His Majefty was pleafed by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Thirteenth Day of May One thousand eight hundred and seven, to permit, for the Space of Six Months, the Importation in Foreign Ships of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undreffed, Calf Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dreffed or undreffed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and Goat Skins dreffed or undreffed, on the Duties specified in the faid Order : And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Permiffion fhould be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby al-low, from the Twenty-fixth Day of this inftant November, until the Twenty fifth Day of March next, the Importation of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undreffed, Calf Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dreffed or undreffed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and Goat Skins, dreffed or undreffed, in any Foreign Ship or Veffel ; and that, on the Arrival at any Port of the United Kingdom of any Foreign Ship or Veffel, with any of the Articles above-mentioned, the faid Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Payment of the fame Duties of the Cuftoms and Excife as are due and payable on the like
