TTHEREAS by an Act, paffed in the Forty. third Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, intituled " An Act for permitting certain Goods imported into Great Britain to be fecured in Warehoules without Payment of Duty;" it is, among other Things, enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Configuee or Configuees of any of the Goods, Wares, and Merchandize coumerated or defcribed in the Table thereunto annexed, marked (E), and which shall have been legally imported or brought into the Port of London, to lodge and fecure in a Warehouse or Warehouses to be provided for that Purpofe, any fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant, without Payment at the Time of the first Entry of the Duties of Cultoms due on the Importation thereof: Provided always, and it is thereby further enacted, that no Goods, Wares, or Merchandize fo enumerated or described in the faid Table marked (E), shall be permitted to be to lodged or fecured, unlefs and until it shall have been made appear to the Satisfaction of the Lord High Treafurer, or the Committioners of His Majetty's Treafury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, that the faid Warehoufe or Warehoufes are complete, fit, and proper in every Refpect for the Reception of fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and wherein the fame may be fafely and fecurely deposited; and fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, fo lodged and fecured in fuch Warehoufes, fhall, in all other Refpects, be fubject and liable to the Rules, Regulations, and Reftrictions in that Act contained.

Provided always, and it is thereby further enacted, That if the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, shall deem it expedient that the Provisions of the faid Act shall be extended to any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize not enumerated or defcribed in either of the Tables thereto annexed, and shall cause a List of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize to be published in the London Gazette, then, and from thenceforth, all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Re-firictions of the faid Act shall extend, and be conftrued to extend, to fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize in every Refpect, in as full and ample a Manner as if the fame had been inferted and enumerated in the faid Tables respectively at the Time of paffing this Act:

We, the underfigned Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury, purfuant to and in Execution of the Powers velled in us in and by the faid Act, do hereby declare that it appears to us to be expedient that the Provisions of the faid Act should be extended to Sarfaparilla legally imported or brought into the Port of London, (not being imported by the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies, or not being imported from the West Indice;) and that fuch Sarfaparilla fhould be added to the Lift of Goods, Wares, and Merchandize enumerated and defcribed in the faid Table annexed to the faid recited Act marked (E); and that fuch Sarfaparilla fhould be lodged and fecured under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant in fuch Warehouse of Warehouses as aforefaid, under the Regulations and Directions of the faid Act : And we do further declare, that from and after the Pub-
