fame may be published and read from the Pulpits immediately after Divine Service.

T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 6th A of January 1808,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS it is expedient in the orefent State of the Subjects of Her Molt Faithful Majefty, and during the Interruption in Commercial Correspondence between Great Britain and Portugal, that Claims fhould be permitted to be given for Portuguese Property brought in and detained by His Majefty's Ships of War and Privateers; His Majefty is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Claims for Portuguese Property, given by Perfons duly authorized by the Owners, or by the Conful or other Perlon authorized by the Portuguele Minister refident at this Court, shall be admitted in the High Court of Admiralty; and it is further ordered, that immediate Restitution shall pais of all fuch. Property as shall appear by the Bills of Lading or other Documents found on board Portuguele Ships, coming from Portuguele Settlements to the Ports of Portugal, to belong to Her Molt Faithful Majelty, or to any of Her Subjects reliding at the Date of this Order, in the Brazils, or in any Foreign Settlement belonging to Her Crown, or in England, or in any Country in Amity with His Majefty, upon a general Claim for every luch Ship and Goods, given by the Conful under the Authority aforefaid . And it is further ordered, that the Property of the Subjects of Her Molt Faithful Majetty, at the Date of this Order, reliding in Portugal, either belonging to them feparately, or jointly with Subjects refiding in the Brazils, or other Places be-forementioned, thall be pronounced to belong as claimed, upon a general Claim given for the fame on board fuch Portuguese Ships as aforesaid : And it is further ordered, that the Property last-mentioned, as well as all other Property, under private Claims already given or to be given, and pronounced to be Portuguele Property, and belonging to Perlons re-fident in Portugal at the Date of this Order, shall remain subject to His Majesty's further Orders; and, in the mean Time, shall be put into the Joint Cuftody of Agents to be named on Behalf of His Majefty, and on Behalf of the Portuguese Minister relident at this Court, or of any Claimant ; and that fuch Parts thereof as are perishable, or which it may be otherwife expedient to fell, shall be fold by the aforefaid Agents, under Commissions to be isfued by the High Court of Admiralty, and the Proceeds' thereof deposited in the faid Court: — And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury, His Majefty's Principal Secre-taries of State, the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, and the Judges of the High Court of Admiralty and Courts of Vice Admiralty, are to take the neceffary Measures herein as to them shall respectively appertain.

## Whitehall, January 26, 1808.

The King has been pleafed to order a Congé d'Elire to pass the Great Seal, empowering the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Carlifle to elect a Bishop of that See, the same being void by the Translation of the Most Reverend Father in God Doctor Edward Venables Vernon to the Archbishopric of York; and His Majefty has also been pleased by His Royal Sign Manual to recommend to the faid Dean and Chapter Samuel Goodenough, Clerk, Doctor of Laws, Dean of Rochefter, to be by them elected Bifhop of that See

The King has also been pleased to grant to the Reverend Walker King, Clerk, Doctor in Divinity, the Place and Dignity of a Prebendary of the Collegiate Church of Saint Peter, Weitminfter, the fame being void by the Death of Doctor Nathan Wetherall.
