AT the Court at the *Queen's Palace*, the 6th of January 1808,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is expedient in the present State of the Subjects of Her Most Faithful Majesty, and during the Interruption in Commercial Correspondence between Great Britain and Portugal, that Claims should be permitted to be given for Portuguese Property brought in and detained by His Majesty's Ships of War and Privateers; His Majesty is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Claims for Portuguese Property, given by Persons duly authorized by the Owners, or by the Consul or other Person authorized by the Portuguese Minister resident at this Court, shall be admitted in the High Court of Admiralty; and it is further ordered, that immediate Restitution shall pass of all such Property as shall appear by the Bills of Lading or other Documents found on board Portuguese Ships, coming from Portuguese Settlements to the Ports of Portugal, to belong to Her Most Faithful Majesty, or to any of Her Subjects residing at the Date of this Order, in the Brazils, or in any Foreign Settlement belonging to Her Crown, or in England, or in any Country in Amity with His Majesty, upon a general Claim for every such Ship and Goods, given by the Consul under the Authority aforesaid: And it is further ordered, that the Property of the Subjects of Her Most Faithful Majesty, at the Date of this Order, residing in Portugal, either belonging to them separately, or jointly with Subjects residing in the Brazils, or other Places beforementioned, shall be pronounced to belong as claimed, upon a general Claim given for the same on board such Portuguese Ships as aforesaid: And it is further ordered, that the Property last-mentioned, as well as all other Property, under private Claims already given or to be given, and pronounced to be Portuguese Property, and belonging to Persons resident in Portugal at the Date of this Order, shall remain subject to His Majesty's further Orders; and, in the mean Time, shall be put into the Joint Custody of Agents to be named on Behalf of His Majesty, and on Behalf of the Portuguese Minister

resident at this Court, or of any Claimant; and that such Parts thereof as are perishable, or which it may be otherwise expedient to sell, shall be sold by the aforesaid Agents, under Commissions to be issued by the High Court of Admiralty, and the Proceeds thereof deposited in the said Court: — And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Judges of the High Court of Admiralty and Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take the necessary Measures herein as to them shall respectively appertain.

S I R,

I ENCLOSE herewith, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Copy of a Letter which I received from Captain Tower of the *Iris*, at Plymouth, giving an Account of the Capture by that Ship, on the 24th Instant, of the French Lugger Privateer *Marfouin*, of Fourteen Guns, (which with her Anchors, it appears, were thrown overboard,) and having a Complement of Sixty Men.

MY LORD, 25th January 1808.

IN returning from the Squadron under the Command of Sir Richard King, Bart. I have the Honour to inform your Lordship I fell in Yesterday, off the Lizard, with a French Lugger Privateer *Marfouin*, armed with Fourteen Guns and Sixty Men, which we captured; her Guns and Anchors were thrown overboard during the Chace.

It appears by the Journal of her last Cruise, (dated 28th October, near Cork,) and is corroborated by the Role de L'Equipage, that in attempting to board a Transport, the Troops being con-

ceased, a Volley of Musketry killed the Captain and Ten Men, and wounded Five others.

*Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral the Right Hon. Lord Collingwood, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels in the Mediterranean, to the Hon. W. W. Pole, dated on board His Majesty's Ship Ocean, at Sea, November 10, 1807.*

SIR,

I ENCLOSE, to be laid before my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a Letter which I have this Day received from Captain Rosenhagen, of His Majesty's Ship the Volage, giving an Account of his having captured, on the 6th Instant, the French Cutter Succès, of Ten Guns and Fifty-nine Men, commanded by the Lieutenant de Vaisseau, Bourdévillehuet.

I HAVE the Honour to acquaint you, that being on my Way to join your Lordship, I had this Morning the good Fortune to fall in with and capture the French Cutter Succès, of Ten Guns and Fifty-nine Men, commanded by Lieutenant de Vaisseau, Bourdévillehuet. She sailed only Three Days ago from Toulon, and had seen nothing. The Officer says he was going to cruize, but several Circumstances incline me to think he was charged with Dispatches of some Consequence, which, however, he had sufficient Time to destroy. The Cutter, I believe, was formerly in His Majesty's Service under the Name of the Suffex.

*Copy of another Letter from Vice-Admiral the Right Honourable Lord Collingwood, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels in the Mediterranean, to the Hon. W. W. Pole, dated on board His Majesty's Ship Ocean, at Syracuse, Dec. 6, 1807.*

SIR,

HAVING sent the Herald to obtain Information from Captain Campbell of the Unité, of the State of the Enemy in the Neighbourhood of Corfu, Captain Hony, in the Execution of this Service, observed an Armed Trabaccolo at Anchor under the Fortrefs of Otranto; and on the Evening of the 25th of October he dispatched the Boats under the Direction of Lieutenant Walter Foreman, to bring her out, which was very gallantly done, notwithstanding a heavy Fire from the Shore and the Vessel.

She proved to be the Cæsar French Privateer, of Four Six-Pounders, bound with Supplies to Corfu.

I inclose, for their Lordships' Information, a Copy of Captain Hony's Letter, relating the Circumstance; and by which it appears that Mr. James Wood, Carpenter, wounded in the Boats, and Three Seamen on board the Herald, is the principal Damage sustained. I am, Sir, &c.

MY LORD,

IN the Execution of your Orders, when off Otranto, with His Majesty's Sloop under my Command, on the 25th of October I observed an Armed Trabaccolo under that Fortrefs, and conceiving it practicable to cut her out under Cover of Night, dispatched the Boats directed by Lieutenant Walter Foreman, who executed the Orders given him, with the greatest Gallantry, under a heavy Fire of great Guns and Musketry both from the Vessel and Shore.

She was shortly brought out, and proves to be Le Cæsar French Privateer, of Four Six-Pounders, belonging to Ancona, having on board a Cargo of Rice and Flour on account of the French Government, bound to Corfu. The Crew defended her until the Boats were alongside, when all excepting Four escaped by a Stern Hawser.

The Sloop has received some little Injury both in Hull and Rigging, but am happy to say my Object was obtained, with One Officer wounded in the Boats and Three Seamen in the Ship. I here subjoin a List of Wounded, and have the Honour to be, &c.

*Extract of a Letter from Vice-Admiral the Right Hon. Lord Collingwood, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels in the Mediterranean, to the Hon. W. W. Pole, dated on board His Majesty's Ship Ocean, at Syracuse, December 9, 1807.*

ON the 29th November, His Majesty's Ship Glatton fell in with a Number of small Vessels carrying Troops to Corfu from Otranto, and took the Soldiers, (in Number Three Hundred,) from Nine of them, and destroyed the Vessels; Two escaped and got back to the Port from whence they came.

The King, taking into His Royal Consideration that upon the Death of Francis, late Duke of Bridgewater, without Issue of his Body, the Title of Earl of Bridgewater is devolved upon John William, now Earl of Bridgewater, as Son and Heir of the late Right Reverend Father in God John Egerton, Lord Bishop of Durham, and Great Grandson and Heir Male of the Body of John Earl of Bridgewater, Grandfather of the said Duke, and by the ordinary Rules of Honour the younger Brother and Sister of the said Earl cannot enjoy that Place and Precedency, which would have been due to them in case the said Title and Dignity had descended to him from his Father; and also considering that the said Earl is now Heir Male of the Body of Sir John Egerton, Knt. created Earl of Bridgewater by King James the First, in the Fifteenth Year of His Reign, and of the said Earl's Wife Frances Stanley (commonly called Lady Frances Stanley),



one of the Daughters and Coheirs of Ferdinando Stanley, Earl of Derby, Son and Heir of Henry Stanley, Earl of Derby, and of his Wife Margaret Clifford (commonly called Lady Margarett Clifford), Daughter and only Child of Henry Clifford, Earl of Cumberland, by his first Wife Eleanor Brandon (commonly called Lady Eleanor Brandon), who was Daughter and Coheir of Charles Brandon, Duke of Suffolk, and of his Wife the Princess Mary, younger Daughter of King Henry the Seventh, and Dowager Queen of France; and that through his deceased Mother Anna Sophia Grey (commonly called Lady Anna Sophia Grey), he is Grandson, and younger Coheir of Henry Grey, late Duke and Earl of Kent, who was Heir Male of the Body of Sir Edmond Grey, created Earl of Kent in the fifth Year of King Edward the Fourth, which Sir Edmond Grey Earl of Kent, was Son and Heir of Sir John Grey and of his Wife Constance Holland, (commonly called Lady Constance Holland) whose Father, Sir John Holland, Duke of Exeter and Earl of Huntingdon, was Son and Heir Male of the Body of Lady Joan Plantagenet, Daughter of King Edward the First's youngest Son, Edward Plantagenet of Woodstock, Earl of Kent, and whose Mother, Lady Elizabeth Plantagenet, Daughter of King Edward the Third's Son, John of Gaunt Duke of Lancaster, and of his first Wife, Lady Blanch Plantagenet, Daughter and Heir of Henry Plantagenet, Duke of Lancaster, who was Grandson and Heir of King Henry the Third's second Son, Edmond Plantagenet, Earl of Lancaster, has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare, that Francis Henry Egerton, only younger Brother, and Dame Amelia Hume, Wife of Sir Abraham Hume, Bart. only Sister of the said Earl, shall from henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same Titles, Place, Pre-eminence, and Precedence as if their said Father John late Lord Bishop of Durham had survived his said Cousin Francis late Duke of Bridgewater:

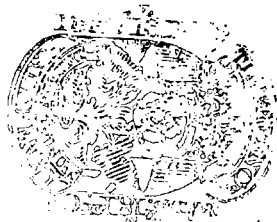

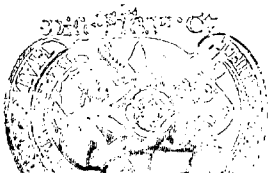
