Whereas it has been humbly represented unto the King, that, on the Morning of the 13th Day of November last, a most alarming Fire was discovered at the Woollen-Manufactory of Mr. Scot, at Sherborne, in Dorsetshire, which totally consumed the same, whereby the Owner of the said Manufactory has suffered a Loss of near 4000l.; and whereas there is strong Ground for suspecting that the said Manufactory was wilfully and maliciously set on Fire by some Person or Persons unknown;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in the Felony above mentioned, is hereby pleased so promise His most gracious Pardon to any of them (except the Person who actually set the said Manufactory on Fire.) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further Encouragement, a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS is hereby offered by the above mentioned Mr. Scot, to any Person or Persons making the Discovery as aforesaid, except as is before excepted.

And a further Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS is offered by the Inhabitants of the said Town of Sherborne, upon the like Conditions and Exceptions, to be paid on Conviction of the Offender or Offenders by John Milliar, Esq; Chairman of the Committee appointed to investigate the Circumstances of the Fire before mentioned.
