His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in the Felony above mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any of them (except the Person who actually set the said Manufactory on Fire,) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further Encouragement, a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS is hereby offered by the above-mentioned Mr. Scot; to any Person or Persons making the Discovery as aforesaid, except as is before excepted.
