The dutiful and loyal Address of the Synod of Fife.

*May it please your Majesty,*

WE, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Ministers of the Provincial Synod of Fife, eagerly embrace the Opportunity of an extraordinary Meeting to express our firm and constant Attachment to your Majesty's Person and Government. Aware of the Difficulties in which our Country is involved in the present unexampled State of Europe, we still trust that the Wisdom and Decision of your Majesty's Councils shall, through Divine Providence, preserve unimpaired the Independence and Glory of the British Empire.

Although from our Situation we feel peculiarly the Pressure of some of the Burdens which the Circumstances of the Times have made it necessary to impose, we cheerfully bear them for maintaining an arduous Contest, not undertaken for Purposes of Ambition and Aggrandizement, but in Defence of your Majesty's Crown, and of our Freedom and National Honour.

And convinced that Perseverance in vigorous Measures can alone secure a Peace consistent with the Interest and Dignity of your Empire, we will continue to impress upon the Minds of the People committed to our Care, both by our Precept and Example, those Sentiments of Loyalty and Unanimity which our Religion and the Good of our Country prescribe,—that ready Submission to the Privations and Burdens which the vigorous Prosecution of a just and necessary War requires; and that spirited Determination to defend all that is dear to Britons, which this awful Crisis so imperiously demands.
