IT having been represented to the Lords Com-missioners of the Admiralty, that certain Per-fons in or about the Port of London are in the Habit of extorting Money from Foreigners, under the Plea of obtaining for them Protections from the Board of Admiralty to secure them from being impressed into His Majesty's Service, from which they are freed and exempted by Act of Parliament; in order to put a Stop to a Practice so injurious to Foreigners, Notice is hereby given, that all Admiralty Protections fecuring Foreigners from being impressed into His Majesty's Service will in future be issued to them personally, and free of all Expence, on Application to Captain Richbell, the Regulating Officer, on Tower-Hill, who has received their Lord-ships' Directions to this Effect. Drawbacks on the Exportation of Sugar from Great Britain, and for suspending the Countervailing Duties and Bounties on Sugar, when the Duties imposed by an Act of the last Session of Parliament shall be suspended.

An Act to continue, until the 25th Day of March 1809, certain Acts for regulating the Drawbacks and Bounties on the Exportation of Sugar from Ireland, and allowing British Plantation Sugar to be warehoused in Ireland; and for warehousing in Ireland Rum or Spirits of the British Sugar Planta-

An Act for amending and further continuing an Act, made in the Thirty eighth Year of His prefent Majesty, for regulating the Payment of the Duties on Cinnamon, Cloves, Nutmegs, and Mace.

An Act for the Regulation of His Majesty's Royal Marine Forces while on Shore.

An Act to empower the Commissioners appointed for distributing the Money paid by the United States of America, to withdraw the same from the Bank and vest it in Exchequer-Bills.

An Act for making perpetual feveral Laws re-lating to permitting the Exportation of Tobacco Pipe Clay from Great Britain to the British Sugar Colonies in the Well Indies; the Importation of Salt from Europe into Quebec in America; and the prohibiting of Foreign Wrought Silks and Velvets.

An Act to continue, until the 25th Day of March 1810, an Act made in the Forty-fixth Year of His present Majesty, for permitting the Importation of Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, and Timber for Naval Furposes, from the British Colonies in North America Duty free.

An Act to continue several Laws relating to the granting a Bounty on the Importation into Great Britain of Hemp, and rough and undressed Flax, from His Majesty's Colonies in America; and to the more effectually encouraging the Manufacture of Flax and Cotton in Great Britain, until the Twentyfifth Day of March 1810; and for granting a Bounty upon certain Species of British and Irish Linens exported from Great Britain, and taking off

Foreign Raw Linen Yarns made of Flax, until the

Twenty-fifth Day of March 1811.

An Act for further continuing, until Three Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, an Act made in the Forty-fourth Year of His present Majesty, for permitting the Importation into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in Foreign Ships.

An Act to continue, until the 25th Day of March 1810, several Laws relating to the Encouragement of the Greenland Whale Fisheries, to the Admission to Entry in Great Britain of Oil and Blubber of Newfoundland, taken by His Majesty's Subjects carrying on the Fishery from and residing in the said Island; and to the allowing the Importation of Fish from Newfoundland and the Coast of Labrador.

An Act for further continuing, until the 25th Day of July 1809, an Act made in the Thirty third Year of His present Majesty, for rendering the Payment of Creditors more equal and expeditions in

Scotland.

An Act for completing the Improvement of the Port of Brillol.

An Act to enable the Company of Proprietors of the East London Water-Works to purchase certain other Water-Works, and to amend an Act of the Forty-seventh Year of His present Majesly relating to the said East London Water-Works.

An Act for better affeffing and collecting the Poor and other Rates in the Parish of St. Saviour, in the Borough of Southwark, in the County of

Surrey, and regulating the Poor thereof

An Act to continue the Term, and alter and enlarge the Powers, of Two Acts of His late and present Majesty for repairing the Roads from Hinck-ley to Melbourne-Common, and other Roads in the said Acts mentioned, in the Counties of Leicester and Derby.

As feweral Artificers and lilanufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercife their feweral Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms, the following Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majessies King George the First and Second, and of His present Majessy, for preventing such Practices, are published, for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incurty Disobedience to them: And it will be observed, that such Penalties likewise extend to those wording or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

F any Person shall contract with, entice, or solicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Information in any of the Courts at Weltminster, or at the Assizes or Quarter Sessions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Ossence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Person having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being such Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the said Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any such Foreign Country, exercising any of the said Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister, or Consul of Great Britain, in the Country where such Artificers shall be, or by any Person authorised by such Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm; such Persona shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devise, or Purchase, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Justice of Peace, that any Person is endeavouring to seduce any such Artificer, or that any such Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majeity's Dominions, for the Purposes aforesaid, such Justice may send his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before some other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of One Witness, or by Consession, that he was guilty of any of the said Ossences, such Justice may bind him to appear at the next Assizes or Quarter Sessions: And if such Person shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Gaol till the next Assizes or Quarter Sessions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any such Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any such Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go

beyond the Seas, for the Purpose aforesaid, he shall give such Security to the King not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the same shall be prosecuted in the Court of Justiciary or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Person shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton, or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Welminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Ossence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Justiciary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if such Offence be committed in Ireland; the Person so convicted shall, for every Artificer contracted with or seduced, forseit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprifoument in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid: And in case of a subsequent Offence of the same Kind, the Persons so again offending thall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or seduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until such Forfeiture be paid.

If any Person in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any such Tools or Utensils as are commonly used in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up, or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures, or any Part of such Tools, he shall, for every Oftence, forseit all such Tools, or Parts thereof, put on board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Session in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Essoin, &c. shall be

allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to seize and secure, in some of His Majesty's Warehouses, all such Tools or Utensils prohibited to be exported, as such Officer shall sind on board any Vessel not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools so seized shall, after Condemnation, be publicly sold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall seize and secure the same.

If the Captain of any Vessel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the said Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on board his Vessel, he shall, for every such Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inslicted upon Persons exporting the Tools; and, if the Vessel belongs to His Majelty, the Captain shall not only forseit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but shall also forseit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majesty.

If any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly suffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or sign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the said Tools, or knowingly suffer the same to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforesaid, and also forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office

under His Majesty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the same.

Statutes 14, 21, 25, and 26 of His prefent Majefty.

BY these Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above-mentioned are extended to Persons packing or putting on board any Vessel, not bound directly for some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Press, Paper, Utensil, or Implement whatsoever, used in or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Steel, or Iron Manusactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of such Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof; and all Captains of Ships and other Persons receiving or being in Possessing of any such Articles, with an Intent to export the same to Foreign Parts, and all Custom-house Officers suffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above-mentioned, in the case of Tools and Utensils used in the Woollen and Silk Manusactures.
