That all Prosperity and Happiness may attend your Majesty, and that the Divine Providence may grant a Blessing on your Councils and Success to your Arms, in securing the Honour and Independence of the Country, is our earnest Wish and Prayer.

Unto the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

WE, the Mayor, Aldermen, Burgesses, and Commonalty of the Borough of Great Yarmouth, in the County of Norfolk, in Common Council assembled, beg Leave to approach your Majesty with the most dutiful Expressions of Loyalty and Attachment to your Majesty's Person and Government, and to assure your Majesty of our Readiness to make every Sacrifice of personal Interest to promote the Strength and Resources of the Country in the present extraordinary Crisis of public Affairs.

We have the fullest Confidence in the Wisdom which directs your Majesty's Councils; and however we may lament the Evils of a protracted War, yet it is our Determination to support your Majesty's Measures, and to bear with Fortitude every Privation until the Opportunity is afforded your Majesty of restoring to your People the Blessings of such a Peace as is consistent with the Interests and Dignity of the Empire.

Given under our Common Seal, at our Guildhall, the 22d Day of March 1808.
