HAVE to request you will be pleased to acquaint the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty of the Arrival here, last Night, of His Majesty's Sloop Ringdove, from a Cruize to the Northward; and herewith I inclose a Letter which I have received from Lieutenant George Peak, her acting Commander, giving an Account of the Capture of the Danish Privateer Brig Forden Shieold, Michael Goeff, Commander, of One Hundred and Ninety Tons Burthen, pierced for Fourteen Guns, but had only Ten long Six-Pounders mounted, with a Complement of Sixty-two Men; out Four Hours from Bergen, and had made Five Captures during former Cruizes.

I HAVE the Honour to acquaint you, that, in pursuance of the Information I received at Balta Sound, mentioned in my Letter to you dated the 29th Ult. a Copy of which is inclosed, respecting Two Privateers being seen off Shetland in Possession of a Sloop, supposed to be the Hope of Leith, I instantly weighed, and stood under all Sail for Bergen.
