## PRESENT,

The KING's Molt Excellent Majefty in Council. 7HEREAS in virtue of the Powers velled in His Majedy by an Act, paffed in the Fortyfixth Year of His Majefly's Reign, intituled " An I Act for reviving and continuing feveral Laws of Cultoms relating to the effablishing Courts of Judi- ! cature in the Ifland of Newfoundland; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation to, Great Pritain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, Cne thouland eight hundred and nine; and for continuing feveral Laws relating to the granting a Bounty upon certain Species of British and Irin Linens exported from Great Britain, and taking off the Duties on Importation into Great Britain of Forcign Raw Linen Yarns made of Flax ; to the granting a Bounty upon the Importation into Creat Britain of Hemp, and rough and undreffed Max, from His Majefty's Colonies in America, and to me Incouragement of the Greenland Whale Fifthe :. : : ...d for reviving and continuing feveral Laws reto be regulating the Prices at which Corn and , where the exported from Great Britain to Ire-in Ireland to Great Britain; and to the Submitting to Entry in Great Britain of Oil and Slubber of Newfoundland, taken by His Majefty's Subjects carrying on the Filhery from, and refiding in, the faid Island; and for continuing an AA of the Twenty-third Year of His prefent Majefty, for the more effectual Encouragement of the Manufactures of Flax and Cotton in Great Britain; and for reviving and continuing feveral Laws relating to the permitting the Importation into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in Foreign Ships; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from Ireland of Com or Potatoes, or other Provisions, and to the permitting the Importation into Ircland of Com, made of all fuch Articles as aforefaid, that thall be

T the Court at the Queen's Polace, the 6th Bills, and Provisions, without Payment of Duty, unil the Tweety-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eight; and for reviving and continuing an AA, paffed in the Parliament of Ireland in the Twenty-fifth Year of His prefent Majefty, for the Encouragement of the Fiznen and Hempen Manufactures of Ireland until the Twenty-fifth Day of March Gas thousand eight hundred and twentyieven; and for umending and further continuing an A& made in the Seventh Year of His prefent Majefty for the free Importation into Great Britain of Cochineal and Indigo, until the Twenty-Ofth Day of March Que thousand eight hundred and nine:"

> His Majefty was pleafed by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Thirtieth Day of September laft, to permit for the Space of Six Months, from the Sixteenth Day of October then next, the Importation of fundry Articles of Provisions, therein specified, Duty free: And whereas it is judged expedient that. the faid Permiffion should be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council to allow, and doth hereby allow, for and during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Sixteenth Day of this inflant April, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain of any Beans, called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulfe; and alfe of Bulls, Cowes Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine, and of Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, (except Salted Beef, and Pork,) and of Bicon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheefe, Potatoes, Rice, Sago, Sago Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any Britifh Ship or Veffel, or in any other Ship or Veffel belonging to Perfons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majefty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whattoever; provided that a due Entry shall be
