Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorifed by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Affent to several Ads agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of the Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for granting Annuities to fatisfy certain

Exchequer Bills.

An Act for imposing, until the End of the next Session of Parliament, a Duty on Cotton Wool, the Growth of the British Colonies, exported from Great Britain.

An Act for granting to His Majesty, until the End of the next Session of Parliament, certain Duties on the Exportation from Ireland of Goods, Wares, and Merchandize therein enumerated.

An Act to prohibit, until the End of the next Session of Parliament, the Exportation of Cotton

Wool from Great Britain.

An Act for further continuing, until the 24th Day of June 1809, an Act of the Forty-fixth Year of His present Majesty, for altering and amending feveral Laws relating to the Duties of Excise upon Malt.

An Act to extend the Provisions of an Act made in the Forty-fifth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, for preventing the counterfeiting of certain Silver Tokens, to certain other Tokens which may be iffued by the Governor and Company of the Bank of Ireland, and to promote the Circulation of
