To the KING's Moft Excellent Majefty.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

A T a Period unexampled in the Annals of this Country, we, your Majefty's loyal and dutiful Subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Chief Citizens of the City of Bath, in Common Council affembled, deem it our indispensable Duty to come forward and repeat our Declarations of unshaken Fidelity and Attachment to your Majefty's facred Perfon and Government.

Contemplating with deep Concern the Mifery and Diftrefs which reftlefs Ambition has brought upon almost all the States of the European Continent, we acknowlege with Gratitude the interpoling Provi-dence that has preferved this Nation from fimilar Calamities, and continued to us, under your Majefty's mild and equitable Sway, the Bleffings of Freedom and national Independence.

May the fame over-ruling Power continue to infpire your Majefty's Councils with Wildom and Vigour commenfurate to the arduous Contest in which we are engaged; may Zeal and Unani-mity influence the Hearts of all your Subjects in Support of your Majesty's just and equitable Go-vernment; and may your Majesty be enabled by the Divine Bleffing upon your Arms, by Sea and Land, effectually to refilt the powerful and extended Con-federacy directed against your Majesty's Dominions; and ultimately to accomplifh your Majefty's earneft Defire, to obtain for your People an honourable, fecure, and permanent Peace.
