Copy of a Letter from Peter Rainier, Efq; Captain of His Majelly's Ship the Caroline, addreffed to Rear-Admiral Sir Thomas Troubridge, Bart. dated the 19th of OEtober 1806, a Duplicate of which has been transmitted by Captuin Rainier to the Honourable W. W. Pole.

His Majefly's Ship Caroline, off Batavia, OBober 19, 1805. SIR,

FTER putting the former Part of your Orders A FTER putting the former 1 are of your of the in Execution, 1 proceeded to Anger Point, where I obtained Information that the Enemy's state of the Eaflward. Line of Battle Ships were all to the Eaflward.

On the Morning of the 18th Inlant, I captured a fmall Brig from Bantam, from whom I learnt that the Phoenix, a Dutch Frigate of Thirty-fix Guns, was undergoing Repairs at Omust ; it appearing to me that the might be brought out, I was making the belt of my Way there, when between Middlebey and Amsterdam Islands, I discovered Two Men of War Brigs at Anchor, One of which I captured, the other made her Efcape by being too clofe in Shore for us to purfue her; the captured Brig was the Zeerop of Fourteen Guns, commanded by Cap-tain Groot. Whill taking Polleffion of her, I obferved the Phænix flip from Omult and run for Ba-tavia Road. From the Officers of the Zeerop we gained Intelligence, that the Maria, a Dutch Frigate, was laying in the Roads, manned from the Shore, being aware of our Approach. A fhort Time after I obferved her, and likewife the William Sloop of War, with the Brig that before efcaped us.

As I diffinctly made out the Frigate to be the largest Ship in the Road, I ran for her with Springs on both Cables; the Enemy commenced firing at us as foon as we were within Gun-Shot, which was not returned till we came as close as the Wind would allow us, which was within Half Piftol-Shot, when we opened our Fire. The Action continued about Half an Hour, when the Enemy hauled down their Colours; on boarding she proved to be the Dutch Republican Frigate Maria Reygersbergen, of Thirtyfix Gune, Eighteen-Pounders on the Main-Deck, and Two Hundred and Seventy Men, commanded by Captain Jager (Second in Command). The . Maria was launched in 1800, and is a faft failing Ship. We had to encounter btfides the Frigate, : the William of Twenty Guns, Patriot of Eighteen, and Zeeplong of Fourteen Guns, with feveral Gun-Boats ; and there were Thirty Gun-Boats laying in Shore, which did not attempt to come out. I beg Leave to state, that when the Action commenced we had short of Complement, by Men away in Prizes, sick at Hospitals, &c. Fifty-feven in Number.

I am forry to fay it was not in my Power to cap-. ture either the Phœnix, William, Patriot, or Zeeplong Brig, as His Majefty's Ship Caroline and the
