P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that all Portuguese Property now detained, and not already decreed to be restored, nor entitled to Restitution under His Majesty's Order of the Sixth of January last, shall be forthwith decreed to be restored upon Claims given or to be given for the same, either by the Portuguese Consul, or other Person duly authorized by the Portuguese Minister resident at this Court, or by the Agents (duly authorized) of those Owners and Proprietors who are not resident in Portugal, or in other Places subject to the Influence and Control of France; and that the Part of the Property so restored belonging to Persons not residing in Portugal, or in other Places subject to the Influence and Control of France, shall be for the Use and Benefit of the Owners and Proprietors thereof; and the Part belonging jointly to Persons resident in Portugal, and Persons resident in the Brazils, or in any Settlement belonging to the Crown of Portugal, or in the United Kingdom, or in any Country or Ambassadors His Majesty, shall be given up to such of the Owners and Proprietors thereof as are resident as last mentioned, upon an Engagement entered into and Security given by or on the Behalf of the said Part Owners and Proprietors, to the Satisfaction of the Portuguese Minister, to account to the Prince Regent of Portugal for such Part of the said joint Property as shall belong to Persons resident in Portugal, or in other Places subject to the Influence and Control of France; and the Part belonging to Persons resident in Portugal, or in other Places subject to the Influence and Control of France, shall be at the future Disposition of the Prince Regent of Portugal.

And it is further ordered, that the joint Agents to whom the Property has been or shall be delivered pursuant to the said Order of the Sixth of January last, shall be, and they are hereby authorized and directed, after the said Property shall have been decreed to be restored, to proceed to the Sale of such Property, or of such Parts thereof, as the Portuguese Minister resident at this Court shall signify to them, in Writing, the Expediency of selling in the Manner most beneficial for the Parties interested therein, and to invest the Proceeds of such Part as shall be sold in Government Securities, under the previous Sanction, in Writing, of the Portuguese Minister, and to hold the same, together with the Property not sold, at the Disposal and subject to the future Directions of the Prince Regent of Portugal, to be signified to them through his Minister resident in London: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take the necessary Measures herein as to them shall respectively appertain. *Stoph. WHEREAS the Islands of Saint Thomas, Saint John, and Sainte Croix, and their Dependencies, have been surrendered and placed under the immediate Protection of His Majesty's Arms, and the Territories and Forts of the same have been delivered up to His Majesty, and the said Islands are now in His Majesty's Possession; His Majesty is thereupon pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that all His loving Subjects may lawfully trade to and from the

said Islands, subject nevertheless to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Conditions, Restrictions, Penalties, and Forfeitures, to which the Trade to and from His Majesty's Colonies, Plantations, and Islands in the West Indies is or shall be subject by Law: And His Majesty is further pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that all Commodities, being the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of the said Islands of Saint Thomas, Saint John, and Sainte Croix, being in His Majesty's Possession, shall be permitted to be imported into any of the Ports of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, in British Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, subject to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Restrictions, Conditions, Penalties, and Forfeitures, as Articles of the like Sort are subject to coming from His Majesty's Colonies, Plantations, or Islands in the West Indies: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

#### A PROCLAMATION,

*For apprehending William Williams, Master of the Ship Croydon, in the African Trade.*

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS William Williams, Master of the Ship Croydon, in the African Trade, stands charged on the Oath of Two credible Witnesses, with the Murder of Samuel Barnes, a Sailor belonging to the said Ship, at Charleston, South Carolina, some Time in the Year 1806; and whereas the said William Williams lately returned in the said Ship Croydon from a Voyage to the Coast of Africa, and has resided at Chepstow, in the County of Monmouth, but is supposed to have fled from thence; we have therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby requiring and commanding all Our loving Subjects to discover and apprehend, and cause to be discovered and apprehended, the said William Williams, and to carry him before some of Our Justices of the Peace, or Chief Magistrates of the County, Town, or Place, where he shall be apprehended, who are respectively required to secure him, and thereof to give speedy Notice unto Our Privy Council, or one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, to the end he may be forthcoming, and may be dealt withal and proceeded against according to Law: And whoever shall discover and apprehend the said William Williams, and bring him before such Justice of the Peace or Chief Magistrate, or so discover him that he may be apprehended, shall receive for Reward the Sum of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, which

said Sum of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury are hereby required and directed to pay accordingly.

#### A PROCLAMATION,

*For pardoning such Seamen and Marines as have deserted, and shall return into His Majesty's Service on or before the Thirty-first Day of December next.*

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS We are desirous to give all due Encouragement to such Seamen as may have deserted from any of Our Ships since the Tenth Day of October One thousand eight hundred and five, and shall be willing to return to Our Service; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby promise Our most gracious Pardon to all such Deserters as shall repair on board any of Our Ships or Vessels on or before the Thirty-first Day of December next; and We do hereby further promise Our most gracious Pardon to all such Seamen as, having deserted, are now belonging to some one of Our Ships; and We do also hereby promise Our most gracious Pardon to all Marines who may have deserted from our Service since the said Tenth Day of October One thousand eight hundred and five, and shall on or before the said Thirty-first Day of December next, surrender themselves at the Headquarters of the Royal Marines established at Portsmouth, Plymouth, or Chatham, or to any Recruiting Party of Our said Forces; and We do hereby declare, that all Seamen and Royal Marines so surrendering themselves as aforesaid, shall be released and discharged from all Prosecutions, Imprisonments, and Penalties commenced or incurred by reason of any such Offence; but that such Pardon shall not entitle Deserters, whether Seamen, or Marines, to any Arrears of Pay forfeited by such Desertion: And We do hereby further declare, that all such Deserters, whether Seamen or Marines, who shall not on or before the said Thirty-first Day of December next, surrender themselves on board One of Our Ships or Vessels of War, or at the Headquarters of the Royal Marines established at Portsmouth, Plymouth, or Chatham, or to some Recruiting Party of the said Forces, or who shall hereafter absent themselves from the Ships to which they belong, or from the Marine Quarters, without Leave from their Commanding Officers, shall be tried at a Court Martial, and being found guilty, shall be deemed unfit Objects of Our Royal Mercy, and shall suffer the Punishment of Death, or such other Punishment as they shall be condemned to suffer by Sentence of the said Court.

WE, the Seven Incorporations of Dumfries, unanimously beg Leave to renew our solemn Assurance of Loyalty and Attachment. I HAVE the Pleasure to inform you, that, on the 16th Instant, at Eight A. M. His Majesty's Sloop Tweed, under my Command, captured the French Privateer Schooner L'Aventure, of Three Guns and Fifty-two Men. A few Days prior to her Capture we destroyed a small Schooner, Prize and Tender to the Privateer.

*Extract of a Letter from Rear-Admiral the Hon. Sir Alexander Cochrane, K. B. Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels at the Leeward Islands, to the Honourable W. W. Pole, dated on board His Majesty's Ship Belkifle, off Marie Galante, April 7, 1808.*

I HAVE the Honour to inclose, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Copy of a Letter from Captain Selby, of His Majesty's Ship Cerberus, acquainting me with the Capture of the Island of Defeada, and of his having caused all the Batteries thereon to be destroyed.

The Inhabitants have generally taken the Oath of Neutrality, I have not therefore left any Force on the Island, but only stationed a Sloop of War and a Brig there for its Protection, and to prevent the Enemy from throwing in a Garrison from Guadaloupe.

The Neutrality of this Island will afford us greater

Facilities in annoying the Privateers, and cutting off their Prizes from getting into Point à Petre.

*His Majesty's Ship Cerberus, at Defeada,*  
30th March 1808.

SIR,

I HAVE the Satisfaction to announce to you the Capture of the Island of Defeada by the Force you did me the Honour to place under my Orders.

On the 29th Instant I weighed from Marie Galante with the Vessels named in the Margin \*; and on the 30th, at half past Three P.M. the Boats under the Command of Captain Sherriff, of His Majesty's Sloop Lily, with a Detachment of Seamen and Marines from each Vessel, under their respective Commanders, (who gallantly volunteered their Services on the Occasion,) stood towards the Shore, which was defended by a Battery of Two Nine-Pounders, completely commanding the narrow Entrance of the Harbour, together with the National Troops and Militia, amounting to about Seventy Men, who opened their Fire upon the Boats, when I found it necessary to anchor the Squadron with Springs on their Cables, and commence a cannonading, which soon silenced them, and at Four o'Clock the French Flag was struck; the Boats landed at half past Four, hoisted the British Flag, and the whole Island surrendered without further Opposition.

I have the Satisfaction to acquaint you, that this Capture has been effected without Loss; the Commandant, National Officers, and Troops are made Prisoners of War, and the Militia have laid down their Arms.

I should not do Justice to the Merit of Captain Sherriff was I not to express in the highest Terms my entire Approbation of his Conduct, together with Captain Ward, and all the Officers and Men employed on this Service.

SIR,

ENCLOSED I send you, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a Copy of a Letter I transmitted on the 24th Instant to Rear-Admiral Purvis, acquainting him of the

Capture of Two Spanish Gun-Boats, the Destruction of Two others, and the Capture of Two valuable Vessels from South America, which I this Day arrived safe with at this Place.

*His Majesty's Sloop Grasshopper, at Sea,*  
24th April 1808.

SIR,

I HAVE the Honour to acquaint you, that Yesterday Morning, in Company with His Majesty's Gun-Brig Rapid, I had the good Fortune to fall in with Two Spanish Vessels from South America, under the Protection of Four Gun-Boats, when, after a short Chace, they anchored under a Battery close in with Faro, among the Shoals; I immediately anchored within Range of Grape-Shot, and, after a very severe Action of Two Hours and a Half, the People on Shore deserted their Guns, Two Gun-Boats struck, and the other Two we drove ashore, and were destroyed. The Cargoes on board the Two Spanish Vessels are worth Thirty Thousand Pounds each, which we also captured; but am sorry to say it was not accomplished without Loss on our Part; we had One Man killed, myself slightly, and Three Seamen severely wounded; both Vessels suffered very much in their Hulls, Masts, Sails, and Rigging. The Enemy's Loss was very great in the Two Gun-Boats captured; they had Forty killed and wounded; Fourteen of the latter I sent on shore to Faro, as I had no Means of taking Care of our own wounded Men and those of the Enemy's, which I hope you will approve of.

It gives me Pleasure to inform you that I received every possible Assistance from Lieutenant Baugh, commanding His Majesty's Gun-Brig Rapid, who acted with great Gallantry the whole Time, and speaks in the highest Terms of the good Conduct of his Officers and Men, Three of which were severely wounded, and particularly of Mr. Baxton, acting Master. I also beg Leave to observe that Lieutenant Cutfield; Mr. Henry Bell, Master; Mr. Thomas Baitin, Purser, Warrant and Petty Officers, and Ship's Company, under my Command, merit my warmest Thanks for their gallant Conduct on this as well as former Occasions.

Messrs. Bell and Baitin I beg particularly to recommend; the former for taking the Brig into a very dangerous Navigation, and is at all Times a Volunteer on every Occasion; the latter has received a very severe Wound since he has been with me, and volunteered to command the after Guns, having only one Lieutenant on board, and is a very deserving good Officer.

I BEG to acquaint you, that the French Lugger Privateer Le Hazard, of Four Guns and Fifty Men, commanded by Francois Blanchet, was taken on the 23d of February by the Franchise, Twelve Leagues South of Scilly, whilst hovering round the

valuable Convoy committed to my Charge. She failed from Granville Three Days previous, and had not made any Capture.

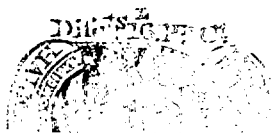

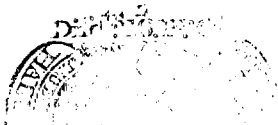
