A PROCLAMATION,

For apprehending William Williams, Master of the Ship Croydon, in the African Trade.

GEORGE R. HEREAS William Williams, Mafter of the W Ship Croydon, in the African Trade, stands charged on the Oath of Two credible Witnesses, with the Murder of Samuel Barnes, a Sailor belonging to the faid Ship, at Charleston, South Carolina, some Time in the Year 2806; and whereas the faid William Williams lately returned in the faid Ship Croydon from a Voyage to the Coast of Africa, and has resided at Chepstow, in the County of Monmouth, but is supposed to have fled from thence; we have therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby requiring and commanding all Our loving Subjects to discover and apprehend, and cause to be discovered and apprehended, the faid William Williams, and to carry him before some of Our Justices of the Peace, or Chief Magistrates of the County, Town, or Place, where he shall be apprehended, who are respectively required to secure him, and thereof to give speedy Notice unto Our Privy Council, or one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, to the end he may be forthcoming, and may be dealt withal and proceeded against according to Law: And whoever shall discover and apprehend the said William Williams, and bring him before such Justice of the Peace or Chief Magistrate, or so discover him that he may be apprehended, shall receive for Reward the Sum of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, which faid Sum of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury are hereby sequired and directed to pay accordingly.
