The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Order of His Majesty in Council, of the Twenty-fifth Day of November One thousand eight hundred and seven, it -was ordered and declared, that Information of His Majesty's Order in Council of the Eleventh Day of the same November should be taken and held to have been received in the Places therein mentioned, at the Periods therein respectively astigned, to fuch Places respectively: And whereas the Countries on the Continent of North and South America, extending from the Tenth to the Thirtieth Degree of North Latitude, are not included in the Places to specified; His Majesty is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order and declare, that Information of the faid Order of the Eleventh of November One thousand eight hundred and feven, shall be taken and held to have been received in all Places on the Continent of North and South America, extending from the Tenth to the Thirtieth Degree of North Latitude, including the Island of New Orleans, on the Tenth Day of February One thousand eight hundred and eight; and that all Matters contained in the said Order of the Twenty-fifth of November One thousand eight hundred and seven shall apply to Vessels sailing from the Places aforesaid, as having received Notice of the said Order of the Eleventh of November One thousand eight hundred and seven on the said Tenth Day of February One thousand eight hundred and eight: -And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take the necessary Meafures herein as to them shall respectively appertain.

WE, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Gentlemen, Clergy, Freeholders, and Inhabitants of the County of Chelter, beg Leave to apLovalry and Attachment to your Majesty's Person and Government.

Has he not repeatedly avowed, that whether he assumes the Garb of Friendship, or wields the Sword of Hollility, the Metive and Object of either will be our immediate or ultimate Destruction; and can we, with the Knowledge we have of his Character, hefitate for a Moment to believe that this is the fixed Determination of his Soul? Shall we, following the Example of the vallal Continent, bend the suppliant Knee, and offer our facrilegious Prayers to a perfidious Enemy for the Acquirement of a Peace, which is to feal our Ruin? Forbid it Heaven! Let us be firm and united, and as far as human Forefight can penetrate through the Veil of Futurity, we are invincible. Or should it please the Almighty Disposer of all Events to make us fall |

proach the Throne with the warmen Expressions of | before our Enemies, we shall fall as faithful Martyrs on the high Altar of our Independence and our Religion, with the confoling Affurance, (even if our Exertions should be over-ruled, and temporal Succels be denied us by the Dispensation of an inscrutable Wisdom,) that they who fulfil their Duty to their Country and their God, will receive at the last a most abundant Recompence.

Your Majesty's Subjects do not deprecate a Peace, it is the only Object of their Warfare; but they would carry on War until they can obtain a fecure and honourable Peace, and they conceive no Peace to be fecure but that which is honourable. If we continue to exhibit the noble Example of a People undaunted in the Defence of their Country, we may be Instruments in the Hands of an All-merciful Father in roufing into Action the torpid Energies of Mankind, in freeing them from the most extenfive and atrocious Tyranny that ever difgraced their Annals, and in shedding the Blessings of Peace and Happinels over the Face of a degenerate and ravaged World. Copies of Letters from Captains Mason and Bathurst, of His Majesty's Ships Daphne and Salfette, addressed to Rear-Admiral Sir Samuel Hood, and transmitted to the Honourable William Wellesley Pole by Vite Admiral Sir James Saumarez.

His Majesly's Ship Daphne, April 26, 1808, SIR. off Leffoe. JUDGING from the Cargo of the Sloop destroy-

ed on the 22d, that the rest of the Enemy's Vessels at Flodilrand were also loaded with Provifions, and deflined for the Relief of Norway, I conceived it to be an Object to attempt getting them

ont; and the Officers and Crews of both Ships having volumeered, I, last Night, font Three Boats from this Ship, and the Partarus Two, all under the Direction of Lieutenant William Elliot, First of the Daphne, accompanied by Mr. Hugh Stewart, Mafter; Lieutenant Boger of the Royal Marines; and Meffrs. Bezzely, Durell, Elliot, Maore, and Ayton, Midshipmen; and Lieutenants Gittins and Patter fon, and Messers. Septford, Lussman, and Andrews, Midshipmen of the Tartarns. They were towed near the thore by the Forward Gun Brig. They found the Vessels moored close under the Fort of the Castle, which mounts Ten Guns, with Hawsers falt to the Shore; and immediately on getting to them the Alarm was given by fome Danish Boats, the Danes instantly for fook the Vessels, and the Castle and Three other Guns began, and kept up a heavy Fire of Round, Grape, and Musketry: Many of the Shot went through the Holls and Sails of the Veffels; notwithstanding which the Five Boats cleared the Harbour of all but Two Brigs, both light, and one of them with neither Sails nor Rudder. As no Credit can accrue but to those who planned and executed this Enterprize, I truit, Sir, I may be allowed to express to you my Admiration of the steady Valour and good Conduct of Lieutenant Elliot, (whose Behaviour at all Times led me to expect it from him,) as well as every Officer and Man employed in it. He speaks in the strongest Terms of the Courage and Steadiness of the Officers, Petty Officers, Seamen, and Marines of both Ships. I am happy, Sir, to add, that the Loss is very trifling on either Side, which I am surprised at, having observed from the Ship the heavy Fire kept up by the Enemy. A Danish Boat, with Five Men in, having the Temerity to perfilt in endeavouring to retake one of the Vessels, although repeatedly warned by Lieutenant Elliot, the latter was obliged with his People to fire in their own Defence, and Three of the Five fell; on our Side there were Three wounded by the Enemy, and one by Millake, but none badly. Amongst the former is Lieutenant Elliot, which, with his being an old Lieutenant, and a very deferving Officer, will, I trult, be an additional Inducement with you to recommend him to the Notice of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

I inclose a List of the Wounded. There is a Man slightly wounded belonging to the Tartarus, but I have not learnt the Nature of his Wounds. All but my First Licutenant and One Seaman are

Extra@ of a Letter from Mr. John T. Curry, Commander of the Royal George Yacht in the Service of the Revenue, to the Commissioners of the Excise at Edinburgh, and transmitted to the Hon. W. W. Pole by the Secretary to that Bourd.

EING off Wick on Sunday the rst of May inflant, I received Information from a Fishing Smack that a Privateer was upon the Coast, and could not then be far off, I made Sail and stood out to Sea, and soon found the Information I had received to be perfectly correct, for I observed the Enemy in Shore in Chace of several Vessels, about Five P. M. South Ronaldsha then bearing N. N. W. distant about Five or Six Miles. I made all Sail instantly, and gave Chace, the Wind being then S. W. The Privateer, as soon as she perceived what I was, tacked, and stood away before the Wind with a Press of Sail, and seemed at first to gain upon us; but it springing up a smart Breeze we gradually approached him, when he began to sire his Stern Chacers, which did us no Injury. At length I had the Pleasure of laying him alongshed after a Seven Hours' Chace, about One o'Clock on the Morning of the 2d, when I gave her a whole Broadiide, and wore round and gave her another, when the struck.

Upon boarding I found her to be the Paffe-Partout, commanded by Jean Judæ Vaudlieme, of Ottend, Dogger rigged, (with a View to deceive) mounting Sixteen Guns, Four and Eight-Pounders, with Sixty-eight Men, but only Forty-four on board.
