## A PROCLAMATION,

*For pardoning such Seamen and Marines as have deserted, and shall return into His Majesty's Service on or before the Thirty-first Day of December next.*

GEORGE R.

**W**HEREAS We are desirous to give all due Encouragement to such Seamen as may have deserted from any of Our Ships since the Tenth Day of October One thousand eight hundred and five, and shall be willing to return to Our Service; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby promise Our most gracious Pardon to all such Deserters as shall repair on board any of Our Ships or Vessels on or before the Thirty-first Day of December next; and We do hereby further promise Our most gracious Pardon to all such Seamen as, having deserted, are now belonging to some one of Our Ships; and We do also hereby promise Our most gracious Pardon to all Marines who may have deserted from our Service since the said Tenth Day of October One thousand eight hundred and five, and shall on or before the said Thirty-first Day of December next, surrender themselves at the Headquarters of the Royal Marines established at Portsmouth, Plymouth, or Chatham, or to any Recruiting Party of Our said Forces; and We do hereby declare, that all Seamen and Royal Marines so surrendering themselves as aforesaid, shall be released and discharged from all Prosecutions, Imprisonments, and Penalties commenced or incurred by reason of any such Offence; but that such Pardon shall not entitle Deserters, whether Seamen or Marines, to any Arrears of Pay forfeited by such Desertion: And We do hereby further declare, that all such Deserters, whether Seamen or Marines, who shall not on or before the said Thirty-first Day of December next, surrender themselves on board One of Our Ships or Vessels of War, or at the Headquarters of the Royal Marines established at Portsmouth, Plymouth, or Chatham, or to some Recruiting Party of the said Forces, or who shall hereafter absent themselves from the Ships to which they belong, or from the Marine Quarters, without Leave from their Commanding Officers, shall be tried at a

Court Martial, and being found guilty, shall be deemed unfit Objects of Our Royal Mercy, and shall suffer the Punishment of Death, or such other Punishment as they shall be condemned to suffer by Sentence of the said Court.

**H**IS Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that all Portuguese Property now detained, and not already decreed to be restored, nor entitled to Restitution under His Majesty's Order of the Sixth of January last, shall be forthwith decreed to be restored upon Claims given or to be given for the same, either by the Portuguese Consul, or other Person duly authorized by the Portuguese Minister resident at this Court, or by the Agents (duly authorized) of those Owners and Proprietors who are not resident in Portugal, or in other Places subject to the Influence and Controul of France, and that the Part of the Property so restored belonging to Persons not residing in Portugal, or in other Places subject to the Influence and Controul of France, shall be for the Use and Benefit of the Owners and Proprietors thereof; and the Part belonging jointly to Persons resident in Portugal, and Persons resident in the Brazils, or in any Settlement belonging to the Crown of Portugal, or in the United Kingdom, or in any Country in Amity with His Majesty, shall be given up to such of the Owners and Proprietors thereof as are resident as last mentioned, upon an Engagement entered into and Security given by or on the Behalf of the said Part Owners and Proprietors, to the Satisfaction of the Portuguese Minister, to account to the Prince Regent of Portugal for such Part of the said joint Property as shall belong to

Persons resident in Portugal, or in other Places subject to the Influence and Controul of France; and the Part belonging to Persons resident in Portugal, or in other Places subject to the Influence and Controul of France, shall be at the future Disposition of the Prince Regent of Portugal.

And it is further ordered, that the joint Agents to whom the Property has been or shall be delivered pursuant to the said Order of the Sixth of January last, shall be, and they are hereby authorized and directed, after the said Property shall have been decreed to be restored, to proceed to the Sale of such Property, or of such Parts thereof, as the Portuguese Minister resident at this Court shall signify to them, in Writing, the Expediency of selling in the Manner most beneficial for the Parties interested therein, and to invest the Proceeds of such Part as shall be sold in Government Securities, under the previous Sanction, in Writing, of the Portuguese Minister, and to hold the same, together with the Property not sold, at the Disposal and subject to the future Directions of the Prince Regent of Portugal, to be signified to them through his Minister resident in London: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take the necessary Measures herein as to them shall respectively appertain. *Steph. An Act to grant to His Majesty certain Duties and Taxes in Ireland in respect of Carriages, Dogs, Fire Hearths, Horses, Male Servants, and Windows, in lieu of former Duties and Taxes in respect of the like Articles.

THE gracious Letter with which your Majesty hath been pleased to honour this Meeting of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, hath been received with equal Respect and Gratitude.

The renewed Appointment of Francis Lord Napier to be your Majesty's High Commissioner in this Assembly, is in the highest Degree acceptable to the Church of Scotland. We regard it as a Proof of your Majesty's Care and Attention to the general Interests of Religion, and more particularly of your gracious Attachment and Regard to our National Church, that your Royal Person is represented among us by one whom we so highly and so justly value.

We are deeply impressed with the Importance of the Trust committed to us of instructing so considerable a Portion of your Majesty's Subjects in the great and awful Truths of Religion, and in those unerring Rules of Morality, of which the Founda-

tion is sought in vain in mere speculative Reasoning, or in the unsatisfying Hypothesis of Philosophy.

It is our anxious Wish and Hope that those Doctrines, which have so long flourished in our Church, may still be preserved in their original Purity. And we are most sincerely grateful for the paternal Solitude with which your Majesty calls forth our Zeal in their Defence, at a Time when we are menaced by so gigantic a Power, and nearly surrounded by the Instruments of his unprincipled Devastation. It shall be our earnest Study that the loyal Endeavours and persevering Efforts of your Majesty's Subjects may never be wanting in the Cause of Virtue and Morality; that Religion and Honour may still be respected in our Land. And we trust in the infinite Mercy of God, that however ill we have deserved of that Almighty Power, by whose Command alone Empires rise or fall, He will not rigorously visit the Sins of his People, nor send forth the avenging Angel to destroy.

We shall endeavour to guard with the most vigilant Care against every Irregularity or Abuse which Time, Accident, or the Attempts of evil designing Persons, may have a Tendency to introduce into our Church Government. And we entreat your Majesty to believe, that every Exhortation which it is in our Power to employ shall be used in preparing the People under our Charge for the many Hardships which they may be called to endure in the arduous Contest in which we are at present involved.

We have received with respectful Gratitude, and shall endeavour faithfully and zealously to employ your Majesty's Royal Donation of One Thousand Pounds for propagating the Knowledge of the Gospel in the Highlands and Islands of Scotland.

We entreat your Majesty to be at all Times assured of our affectionate Attachment to your Person and Government. And that Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, may protect your Majesty and prosper your Councils; that he may bless abundantly our gracious Queen, the Prince and Princess of Wales, and all the Members of your illustrious House; that he may long continue to us the inestimable Benefits which we enjoy under your Majesty's Reign; and that he may bestow upon you hereafter a Crown of Glory, are the Prayers of, May it please your Majesty, your Majesty's most faithful, most obedient, and most loyal Subjects, the Ministers and Elders met in this National Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

The humble Address of the Gentlemen, Clergy, Freeholders, and other Inhabitants of the County of Denbigh.

*Most Gracious Sovereign,*

WE, your Majesty's faithful and loyal Subjects, implore Permission to approach your Majesty's Throne to testify our unvarying Attachment to your Majesty's Royal Person, Family, and Government.

We are deeply sensible of the Blessings we enjoy under your Majesty's Government, and the indignation we feel at the unprovoked and unwarrantable Aggression of our Enemies, who seek to deprive us of those Blessings, and threaten your Majesty's Kingdoms with Invasion, will continue to animate our Resolutions, and redouble our Efforts in the De-

fence of all we hold dear. We trust that those Efforts, seconded by the Zeal of a faithful and loyal People, will, under the Providence of God, be fully sufficient to repel every Attack, to frustrate the Hopes and defeat the Designs of one of the most alarming Confederacies that was ever formed against your Majesty's Crown and the People of Great Britain.

In such a Crisis the Approach of Danger can only serve to call forth that national Spirit, which always rises with the Occasion that demands it, but which never displayed itself at a more important Conjunction, though it has so often protected the Liberties of these Kingdoms and of Europe in general, and has enabled the British Fleets and Armies to withstand and defeat the Designs of that restless and aspiring Ambition, which has for such a Length of Time disturbed the Peace, and invaded the Rights of Mankind.

The Friedland is Twelve Months old, carries Sixteen French Twelve-Pounder long Guns, built at Venice, and is a very fine Brig. Embarked on board her is Commodore Don Anilcar Paolucci, commanding in Chief the Italian Marine, and Knight of the Iron Crown.

SIR,

I BEG to inclose, to be laid before my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Copy of a Letter from Captain Sir Thomas Livingstone, which I have To-day received from Rear-Admiral Purvis, giving an Account of the Boats of the Renommée and Grasshopper having, on the Night of the 6th of November last, attacked and captured Two Armed Vessels which lay at Anchor under the Protection of the Torre de Estacio.

The Officers and Men employed on this Service, under the Direction of acting Lieutenant Webster, appear to have displayed considerable Gallantry.

His Majesty's Ship Renommée, off Carthagena, Nov. 12, 1807.

SIR,

I HAVE to acquaint you, that on the Night of the 6th Instant I sent a Detachment of Boats from this Ship and the Grasshopper, under the Direction of Lieutenant William Webster of the Renommée, for the Purpose of cutting out some Enemy's Vessels that lay at Anchor under the Torre de Estacio.

By Four o'Clock in the Morning the Boats were in Possession of the Vessels, viz. a Spanish Brig and a French Tartan, each of them mounting Six Guns, with a proportionable Number of Men; but unfortunately there was so little Wind, and the Current ran so strong, that they both got aground; and notwithstanding every Exertion was used for the Purpose of getting them off, it was found impossible, and at about Seven o'Clock they were abandoned; they would have been burnt had there not been so many Men, Women, and Children on board them, (many of whom were badly wounded, and our Boats could not remove them,) and Humanity induced Lieutenant Webster not to set them on Fire.

During the Performance of the abovementioned Service the Torre de Estacio kept up a constant Fire of Grape and Cannon upon our Boats and the captured Vessels, which wounded several of the Enemy and Two of our brave Fellows, viz. Mr. Thomas Baskin, Purser of the Grasshopper, who was a Volunteer, and commanded a Boat upon the Occasion, and Henry Garrett, Coxswain of the Renommée's Pinnace, both very badly.

The Loss the Enemy sustained was considerable in wounded, but none killed. The cool and gallant Conduct of every Officer and Man employed on the abovementioned Service entitles them to every Praise which is in my Power to bestow.

Lieutenant William Webster, who commanded, has in several such Instances distinguished himself.

SIR,

I HAVE the Honour to inclose you, for the Information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a Copy of a Letter I have received from Captain Usher, of His Majesty's Sloop the Redwing, representing another Instance of Bravery displayed by him on the 7th Instant, off Cape Trafalgar.

His Majesty's Sloop Redwing, at Sea,  
7th May 1808.

SIR,

I HAVE the Honour to acquaint you, that this Morning at Daylight, Cape Trafalgar bearing W. N. W. about Six Miles, an Enemy's Convoy was discovered coming down along Shore. The Winds being very light and variable, I was not enabled to close with them before Seven o'Clock; at that Time, being within point-blank Shot, the Armed Vessels handed their Sails, and forming a close Line, swept towards us, indicating an Intention to board. The just Confidence I place in the Officers and Men that I have the Honour to command induced me to meet the Enemy upon his own Terms, and I endeavoured to close, to decide the Business as quick as possible, in order to secure the Merchantmen. Upon arriving within Musket-Shot, a quick and well-directed Fire was opened, our Guns doing great Execution. At Nine o'Clock, the Enemy completely Panic-struck and beaten, pushed their Vessels into a heavy Surf, sacrificing all their Wounded. I instantly sent a Boat to try and save as many as I could, as it was distressing to see their Situation, but our Men were unable to rescue one of them. The Merchant Vessels, seeing the Fate of their Convoy, attempted to disperse; some were sunk; others ran into the Surf, and, in a short Time, disappeared; the rest were captured, excepting Three, (Two of which were armed,) that it was not in my Power to come up with, owing to our crippled State, having Two Twenty-four-Pounders shot through the Foremast, One through the Mainmast, and One through the Gammoning of the Bow-sprit, that likewise cut the Knee of the Head asunder.

The steady and cool Conduct of the Officers and Men throughout deserve my warmest Praise; and had the Enemy possessed Resolution enough to have boarded, I could not doubt of the Result, though opposed to such superior Numbers. My First Lieutenant, Ferguson, on this as well as on many other Occasions, was a good Assistant to me. Nothing can exceed his cool determined Conduct, which I have so often witnessed. Lieutenant Webster likewise executed his Duty entirely to my Satisfaction, as well as Mr. Davis, Master, and Mr. Horniman, Purser, who were both wounded; the latter, I fear,

will lose an Eye. It is with the most heartfelt Gratification I acquaint you our Loss in Men is small, as herewith annexed. I am now on my Way to Gibraltar, as our Masts must be taken out; but I shall lose no Time in refitting, and resuming my Station.
