PROCLAMATION,

For pareloning fuch Seamen and Marines as have de-ferted, and shall return into His Majesty's Service on or before the Thirty-first Day of December next.

GEGRGE R.

HEREAS We are defirous to give all due Encouragement to such Seamen as may have deferted from any of Our Ships fince the Tenth Day of October One thousand eight hundred and five, and shall be willing to return to Our Service; We have thought sit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby promise Our most gracious Pardon to all such Deserters as shall repair on board any of Our Ships or Veffels on or before the Thirty-first Day of December next; and We do hereby further promise Cur most gracious Pardon to all such Seamen as, having deserted, are now belonging to some one of Our Ships; and We do also hereby promise Our mon gracious Pardon to all Marines who may have deserted from our Service tince the said Tenth Day of October One thousand eight hundred and five, and shall on or before the said Thirty-first Day of December next, furrender themselves at the Head-Quarters of the Royal Marines established at Ports. mouth, Plymouth, or Chatham, or to any Recruiting Party of Cur faid Forces; and We do hereby declare, that all Seamen and Royal Marines fo furrendering themselves as aforelaid, shall be released and discharged from all Projecutions, Imprison-ments, and Penalties commenced or incurred by reason of any such Offence; but that such Pardon shall not en itle Deserters, whether Seamen or Ma-rines, to any Arrears of Pay forseited by such De-fertion: And We do hereby further declare, that all such Deserters, whether Seamen or Marines, who shall not on or before the said Thirty-first Day of December next, furrender themselves on board One of Our Ships or Vessels of War, or at the Head-Quarters of the Royal Marines established at Portsmouth, Piymouth, or Chatham, or to fome Recruiting Perty of the faid Forces, or who shall hereafter anient themselves from the Ships to which they be-

Court Martial, and being found guilty, shall be deemed unfit Objects of Our Royal Mercy, and shall suffer the Punishment of Death, or such other Punishment as they shall be condemned to suffer by Sentence of the faid Court.

Given at Our Court at the Queen's Palace, the Fourth Day of May, One thousand eight hundred and eight, in the Forty-eighth Year of Our Reign.

GOD fave the KING.

AT the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 4th of May 1808,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

TIS Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that all Portuguese Property now detained, and not already decreed to be reflored, nor entitled to Restitution under His Majesty's Order of the Sixth of January last, shall be forthwith decreed to be reftored upon Claims given or to be given for the fame, either by the Portuguese Conful, or other Person duly authorized by the Portuguese Minister resident at this Court, or by the Agents (duly authorized) of those Owners and Proprietors who are not relident in Portugal, or in other Places subject to the Insuence and Controul of France, and that the Part of the Property so restored belonging to Persons not residing in Portugal, or in other Places subject to the Instuence and Controul of France, shall be for the Use and Benefit of the Owners and Proprietors thereof; and the Part belonging jointly to Persons resident in Portugal, and Persons resident in the Brazils, or in any Settlement belonging to the Crown of Portugal, or in the United Kingdom, or in any Country in Amity with His Majesty, shall be given up to fuch of the Owners and Proprietors thereof as are resident as last mentioned, upon an Engagement entered into and Security given by or on the Be-half of the faid Part Owners and Proprietors, to the Satisfaction of the Portuguese Minister, to aclong, or from the Marine Quarters, without Leave count to the Prince Regent of Portugal for such from their Commanding Officers, shall be tried at a Part of the said joint Property as shall belong to
