#### The KING's Most Excellent Majelly in Council.

W HEREAS the Time limited by His Ma-jetty's Order in Council of the Twenty-lifth Day of November One thousand eight hundred and feven, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaltwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of June next : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majelty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer, His Majcity doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfen or Perfons whatloever, (except the Master General of the Ordnance for His Majelly's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Sixth Day of June next, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaltwife, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty or Fils Privy Conneil, upon Pain of incur-ring and inflering the respective Forfeitures and Penalies inflicted by an Act palled in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majefly's Reign, initialed "An "Act to empower His Kriefly to prohibit the "Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the "Law for empowering His Majefly to prohibit 44 Law for empowering Fils selajeity to promote



Copy of a Letter from Mr. James Dowie, atting Com-mander of the Prince William Henry Revenue Cutter, to the Commissioners of the Customs at Edinburgh, and transmitted by the Secretary to that Board to the Han. William Wellefsey Pole

HONOURABLE SIRS,

BEG Leave to acquaint your Honours, that upon the Afternoon of the 24th Inflant, Rat-tray Head bearing W. N. W. diftant about Three Miles, 1 obferved a ftrange Sail ftanding towards the Land, and made for her, upon which fhe put round, and fet all Sail to make off. I continued the Chace, and about Five o'Clock got within Gun-fhot; and about Six brought her to Action, which was kept up, owing to little Wind and a rolling Sea, near Two Hours, when an Accident, by the blowing up of fome Guupowder on board my Cutter, obliged me to give it up until next Morning; I then renewed the Attack, and about Nine o'Clock had the good Fortune to capture her. She proves to be the Wovehalfen, of North Bergen, Anders Knudson, Commander, with Four Four-Pounders, Two Swivels, and a Number of fmall Arms, and Thirty-three Men. I am concerned to add that this Capture was not made without fome Injury to my Crew, Six of them being wounded, though none dangeroußy. On board the Privateer One Man was killed, and



the Commander and Too Men wounded, both of J them feverely. She was out Nine Days, had made no Capture.
