The KING's Most Excellent Majetly in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Ma-jelly's Order in Council of the Twenty-lifth Day of November One thousand eight hundred and feven, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaltwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of June next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majetly's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majetly doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatfoever, (except the Master-General of the Ordnauce for His Majelly's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Sixth Day of June next, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwife, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Conneil, upon Pain of incurring and fusiering the respective Forseitures and Period Private Priva rang and innering the respective Potentials and Ten-nalties inflicted by an Act pulled in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majerly's Reign, intituled "An "Act to empower His Mirelly to prohibit the "Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the "Law for empowering His Majerly to prohibit "Law for empowering Fits majerty to promone the Empartation of Gunpawder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower His Majerty to refrain the carrying Contwife of Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition?"—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majerty's Treasury, the Commissioners for expenting the Office of Lord. the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lard

The Ladies to wear Black Silk, fringed or plain Linen, White Gloves, Necklaces, and Ear-rings, Black or White Shoes, Fans, and Tippets.
Undrefs-White or Grey Luftrings, Tabbies,

The Gentlemen to wear Black full-trimmed, fringed or plain Linen, Black Swords and Buckles. Ündrefs – Grey Frocks.

The Court to change the Mourning on Thursday the 9th of June next, viz.

The Ladies to wear Black Silk or Velvet coloured Ribbons, Fans, and Tippets; or plain White, or White and Gold, or White and Silver Stuffs, with Black Ribbons.

The Gentlemen to wear Black Coats and Black or plain White, or White and Gold, or White and Silver Stuff Wailtcoats, full-trummed, coloured Swords and Puckles.
