As feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Berain, have, from Time to Time, gene into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Gallings, contrury to the Larus of these Kingdoms, the follow-ing Abilirasis of Alls of Parliament of Their late Majefilies King George the First and Second, and of His prefent Majefly, for preventing fuch Pratices, are publifhed, for the Information of all Perfons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Difobedience to them: And it will be observed, that fuch Penalties likewife extend to those who are any ways concerned or inftrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of thefe Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Inflruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themfelves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

F any Perfon shall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brals, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and full be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Informa-tion in any of the Courts at Weltminiter, or at the Affizes or Quarter Seffions, he thall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Diferentian of the Court, and imprisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Ma-jetty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any such Foreign Country, exercifing any of the fail Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister, or Consul of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Person authorised by such Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm; such Persons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devise, or Purchase, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alica, and out of His Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Juffice of Peace, that any Perfon is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majefty's Dominions, for the Purpoles aforefaid, fuch Juffice may fend his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before fome other Juffice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of One Witnels, or by Confelfion, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, such Juffice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Sel-fions: And if fuch Perlon shall refuse to give Secnrity, the Justice may commit him to Gaol till the next Affizes or Quarter Schlons, and until he shall he delivered by due Courfe of Law. And if any fuch Artificer thall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fuch Promife, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majefty's Dominions; as such Court shall think reasonable, and thall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour sto feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton, or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland into any Foreign Coun-try not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Weitminiter, or by Indictment at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fach Offence shall be committed in Eagland, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ire-land; the Perfon fo convicted fhall, for every Artificer contracted with or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Impri-fonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid: And in cafe of a fublequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons to again offending shall forfeit, for every Perfon contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall fuffer Impriforment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until such Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland fhall put on board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly ufed in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up, or Finifhing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures, or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall, for every Offence, forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Esson, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Majefty's Warehouses, all such Tools or Utensils prohibited to be exposted, as such Officer shall find on board any Vellel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools so feized shall, after Condemnation, be publicly fold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majethy, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on board his Veffel, he fhall, for every fuch Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and, if the Veffel belongs to His Majetty, the Captain fhall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but fhall alfo forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majefty.

If any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or figu any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be cone, he fhall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majefty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the fame.

Statutes 14, 21, 25, and 26 of His prefent Majefiy.

BY these Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above-mentioned are extended to Perfons packing or putting on board any Veffel, not bound directly for fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Prefs, Paper, Utenfil, or Implement whatfoever, ufed in or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Steel, or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of fuch Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof; and all Captains of Ships and other Perfons receiving or being in Poffeffion of any fuch Articles, with an Intent to export the fame to Foreign Parts, and all Cuftom-houfe Officers fuffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above-mentioned, in the cafe of Tools and Utenfils uled in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.
