AT the Court at the *Queen's Palace*, the 22d of June 1808,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, made and passed in the Forty-sixth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for authorizing His Majesty in Council to allow during the present War, and for Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, the Importation and Exportation of certain Goods and Commodities, in Neutral Ships, into and from His Majesty's Territories in the West Indies and Continent of South America;" it is enacted, that from and after the passing of the said Act, it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, by and with the Advice of His and Their Privy Council, to permit, or to authorize the Governors of the said Islands and Territories, in such Manner and under such Restrictions as to His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, shall seem fit to permit, when the Necessity of the Case shall appear to His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to require it from Time to Time during the present War, and for Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, the Importation into, and the Exportation from any Island in the West Indies, (in which Description the Bahama Islands and the Bermuda or Somer Islands are included,) or any Lands or Territories on the Continent of South America to His Majesty belonging, of any such Articles, Goods, and Commodities as shall be mentioned in such Order of His Majesty in Council, in any Ships or Vessels belonging to the Subjects of any State in Amity with His Majesty, in such Manner as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, by and with the Advice aforesaid, shall direct; provided such Ships or Vessels shall duly enter into, report, and deliver their respective Cargoes, and re-load at such Ports only where regular Custom-Houses shall have been

established: And whereas it appears at present to be necessary to permit for a limited Time, subject to be sooner terminated, varied, or altered, as is hereinafter provided, the Importation into, and the Exportation from the Islands and Territories of His Majesty in the West Indies, (including the Bahama Islands, and the Bermuda or Somer Islands,) and the Lands and Territories on the Continent of South America to His Majesty belonging, of certain Articles, Goods, and Commodities hereinafter-mentioned, in any Ships or Vessels belonging to the Subjects of any State in Amity with His Majesty; His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and doth hereby order, that the Governors and Lieutenant-Governors of His Majesty's Islands and Colonies in the West Indies, (in which Description the Bahama Islands, and the Bermuda or Somer Islands are included,) and of any Lands or Territories on the Continent of South America to His Majesty belonging, and each and every of such Governors and Lieutenant-Governors shall be authorized, and they, and each and every of them are hereby authorized to permit for Twelve Months, from the Date hereof, subject to be sooner terminated, varied, or altered as is hereinafter provided, in any Ships or Vessels belonging to the Subjects of any State in Amity with His Majesty, the Importation into the said Islands, Colonies, Lands, and Territories respectively, of Staves and Lumber, and also of every Kind of Provisions, (Beef, Pork, Fish, and Butter excepted,) which are of the Growth or Produce of the Country to which such Ship or Vessel importing the same shall belong; (the Exception of Fish, however, not to be in Force in any of the said Islands, Colonies, Lands, or Territories in which there shall have been provided a Bounty on Fish taken in any Part of His Majesty's Dominions in North America, or on the Coasts thereof, by British Subjects, to an Amount equal to Two Shillings a Quintal on Cod, and imported in British Vessels from any of His Majesty's Provinces, Set-

lements, or Possessions in North America;) and also the Exportation from the said Islands, Colonies, Lands, and Territories respectively, into which such Importation of Staves, Lumber, and Provisions as aforesaid shall be made, of Rum and Molasses, and of any other Articles, Goods, and Commodities whatsoever, except Sugar, Indigo, Cotton Wool, Coffee, and Cocoa; provided always, that such Ships or Vessels shall duly enter into, report, and deliver their respective Cargoes, and re-load at such Ports only where regular Custom-Houses shall have been established: And His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His said Privy Council, is further pleased to order, and doth hereby order, that notwithstanding any Thing hereinbefore contained, the said Permission and Authority to import and export shall cease and determine, or be varied and altered, before the Expiration of the abovementioned Period of Twelve Months, at the Expiration of Six Months after the Notification in the London Gazette of any Order of His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, for revoking, varying, or altering such Permission and Authority, or shall cease and determine at the Expiration of Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace.

#### P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-fifth Day of November One thousand eight hundred and seven, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of June next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever, (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said Sixth Day of June next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the

"Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition:"—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

THIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of the Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for raising the Sum of Seven Hundred and Fifty Thousand Pounds, by Way of Annuities, for the Service of Ireland.

An Act to grant to His Majesty Duties upon Malt made in Ireland, and upon Spirits made or distilled in Ireland, and to allow certain Drawbacks on the Exportation thereof.

An Act to enable the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury to issue Exchequer-Bills on the Credit of such Aids or Supplies as have been or shall be granted by Parliament for the Service of Great Britain for the Year 1808.

An Act for letting to Farm the Duties on Horses hired by the Mile or Stage to be used in travelling, and on Horses hired for a less Period of Time than Twenty-eight Days, for drawing Carriages used in travelling Post or otherwise, in Great Britain, and for better securing the said Duties.

An Act to amend Two Acts for the collecting of the Malt Duties in Ireland, and regulating the Trade of a Malster.

An Act to continue, until the 5th Day of July 1809, and to amend several Acts for granting certain Rates and Duties, and for allowing certain Drawbacks and Bounties on Goods, Wares, and Merchandize imported into and exported from Ireland, and to grant new Duties on the Importation of East-India Sugar and Foreign Spirits, and to reduce the Duty on British Plantation Coffee imported.

An Act to amend the several Acts for the regulating and securing the Collection of the Duty on Spirits distilled in Ireland.

An Act to repeal so much of an Act, made in the Forty-seventh Year of His present Majesty, for charging the Sum of Twelve Millions Two Hun-

hundred Thousand Pounds raised for the Service of Great Britain for the Year 1807, upon the Duties of Customs and Excise, granted to His Majesty during the Continuance of the present War, as relates to Money issued for Charges of Management of Stock redeemed.

An Act for appointing Commissioners for carrying into Execution an Act of this Session of Parliament for granting to His Majesty a Duty on Pensions and Offices in England, and an Act made in the Thirty-eighth Year of His present Majesty for granting an Aid to His Majesty by a Land-Tax to be raised in Great Britain for the Service of the Year 1798.

An Act to make perpetual, and to amend several Acts for the better regulating the issuing and granting of Permits and Certificates for the Conveyance and Protection of certain exciseable Goods in Ireland.

An Act for enabling the Commissioners appointed to examine Accounts of Public Expenditures in the West Indies more speedily and effectually to investigate the said Accounts.

An Act, to regulate the Trade between Great Britain and the United States of America until the End of the next Session of Parliament.

An Act for amending and rendering more effectual an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament to make more effectual Provision for the Prevention of Smuggling, and for regulating the Periods for cancelling and delivering up certain Bonds relating to the Revenue of Customs.

An Act for enabling the Commissioners appointed to examine Accounts of Public Expenditure in the Barrack-Office more speedily and effectually to investigate the said Accounts.

An Act to revive and continue, until the 25th Day of March 1809, an Act of the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty for the more effectual Encouragement of the British Fisheries.

An Act for repealing the Rates and Taxes taken by Licensed Hackney Coachmen, and for establishing others in lieu thereof; and for amending several Laws relating to Hackney Coaches.

An Act to restrain the Negotiation of Promissory Notes and Inland Bills of Exchange under a limited Sum in England.

An Act for depositing Prize Goods liable to Duty in Warehouses, under the Care of the Officers of the Customs and Excise; and for reducing Spirits condemned as Prize to a proper Strength for Home Consumption.

An Act for extending the Provisions of an Act, made in the Forty-seventh Year of His present Majesty, so far as respects the Payment of Prize-Money arising from Captures made by Foreign in Conjunction with British Ships, to Captures made by the Land Forces of Foreign States in Conjunction with the British.

An Act to enable the Commissioners for auditing Public Accounts, and the Commissioners for the Affairs of Barracks, respectively to send and receive Letters and Packets on the Business of their Offices free of Postage.

An Act to repeal so much of an Act of the First Year of King James the First, as relates to the Penalties on shooting at Hares; and also to repeal an Act of the Third Year of King George the First, relating to Gamekeepers.

An Act for repealing so much of an Act, made in the Parliament of Scotland in the Fourth Session of the First Parliament of Queen Anne, intitled "An Act for preserving the Game," as relates to the shooting of Hares.

An Act for the better Care and Maintenance of Lunatics, being Paupers or Criminals, in England.

An Act for extinguishing the Right of Way over a Lane or Road leading across the Exercising-Ground in Front of Chatham Lines; and for vesting the Soil thereof in His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors.

An Act for continuing, until the 1st Day of August 1811, an Act of the Forty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, for allowing under certain Restrictions the bringing a limited Quantity of Coals, Culm, or Cinders, to London and Westminster by Inland Navigation.

An Act to amend Two Acts, so far as relate to supplying the City of Londonderry with Water, improving the Harbour of the said City, and the Regulation of Pilots and Vessels using the same; and for extending the Jurisdiction of the Court held in the said City for the Recovery of small Debts.

An Act for supplying with Water the Inhabitants of the Borough of Colchester, in the County of Essex.

An Act to continue the Term, and alter and enlarge the Powers, of Two Acts of His present Majesty, for amending the Road from near Milford through Haslemere to the Portsmouth Road, between Lippock and Rake, in the Counties of Surrey, Sussex, and Southampton.

An Act for repairing the Roads from Tavernspite to the Towns of Pembroke and Tenby, and to Hubberton Haking, and from Loveston Mountain to Canaston-Bridge, in the County of Pembroke.

*Copy of a Letter from Rear-Admiral the Honourable Sir Alexander Cochrane, K. B. Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels at the Leeward Islands, to the Honourable W. W. Pole, dated on board the Bellisle, Carlisle-Bay, May 2, 1808.*

SIR,

I INCLOSE the Copy of a Letter from Captain Sherriff, of His Majesty's Sloop Lily, giving an Account of the Capture of a French Brig Letter of Marque, pierced for Eighteen Guns, from Bourdeaux bound to Guadaloupe; also an English Brig, her Prize, both of which were taken by not knowing that the Island of Defeada was in our Possession, where the Armed Brig ran for Protection.

SIR,

THIS Morning the Squadron under my Command, as per Margin\*, captured the French Letter of Marque Brig Jean Jacques, pierced for Eighteen Guns, only Six mounted, long Nine-Pounders, Thirty-six Days from Bourdeaux, bound to Guadaloupe.

I have great Pleasure in bearing Testimony of the gallant Conduct of the Mosambique, which, from being far a-head, was enabled to bring the Enemy to close Action, obliging him to strike just as the other Vessels came up.

Seeing another Brig to Windward, the Boats of the Squadron were sent in chase; and I am happy to say, that, although on Fire fore and aft, and abandoned, they succeeded in extinguishing the Flames. She proves to be the Brig Brothers of Liverpool,

and ought to have left Barbadoes under Convoy of the Hawke, but did not sail till Three or Four Hours after the Convoy had bore up from Carlisle Bay, and consequently was captured by this Brig.

I have Satisfaction in adding this Service was performed without Loss on our Side; the Enemy had One Man wounded.

The Capture of the Jean Jacques is of the more Importance, as she was sent out for the express Purpose of cruising in these Seas, and, from her superior Sailing, would have proved a great Annoyance to the Trade.

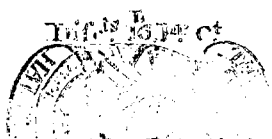
