AT the Court at the *Queen's Palace*, the 4th of July 1808,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Majesty having taken into His Consideration the glorious Exertions of the Spanish Nation for the Deliverance of their Country from the Tyranny and Usurpation of France, and the Assurances which His Majesty has received from several of the Provinces of Spain, of their friendly Disposition towards this Kingdom; His Majesty is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered;

First, That all Hostilities against Spain on the Part of His Majesty shall immediately cease.

Secondly, That the Blockade of all the Ports of Spain, except such as may be still in the Possession or under Controul of France, shall be forthwith raised.

Thirdly, That all Ships and Vessels belonging to Spain shall have free Admission into the Ports of His Majesty's Dominions, as before the present Hostilities.

Fourthly, That all Ships and Vessels belonging to Spain, which shall be met at Sea by His Majesty's Ships and Cruizers, shall be treated in the same Manner as the Ships of States in Amity with His Majesty, and shall be suffered to carry on any Trade now considered by His Majesty to be lawfully carried on by Neutral Ships.

Fifthly, That all Vessels and Goods belonging to Persons residing in the Spanish Colonies, which shall be detained by any of His Majesty's Cruizers after the Date hereof, shall be brought into Port, and shall be carefully preserved in safe Custody, to await His Majesty's further Pleasure, until it shall be known whether the said Colonies, or any of them, in which the Owners of such Ships and Goods reside, shall have made common Cause with Spain against the Power of France.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take such Measures herein as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, made and passed in the Forty sixth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for authorizing His Majesty in Council to allow during the present War, and for Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, the Importation and Exportation of certain Goods and Commodities, in Neutral Ships, into and from His Majesty's Territories in the West Indies and Continent of South America;" it is enacted, that from and after the passing of the said Act, it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, by and with the Advice of His and Their Privy Council, to permit, or to authorize the Governors of the said Islands and Territories, in such Manner and under such Restrictions as to His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, shall seem fit to permit, when the Necessity of the Case shall appear to His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to require it from Time to Time during the present War, and for Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, the Importation into, and the Exportation from any Island in the West Indies, (in which Description the Bahama Islands and the Bermuda or Somer Islands are included,) or any Lands or Territories on the Continent of South America to His Majesty belonging, of any such Articles, Goods, and Commodities as shall be mentioned in such Order of His Majesty in Council, in any Ships or Vessels belonging to the Subjects of any State in Amity with His Majesty, in such Manner as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, by and with the

Advice aforesaid, shall direct; provided such Ships or Vessels shall duly enter into, report, and deliver their respective Cargoes, and re-load at such Ports only where regular Custom-Houses shall have been established: And whereas it appears at present to be necessary to permit for a limited Time, subject to be sooner terminated, varied, or altered, as is hereinafter provided, the Importation into, and the Exportation from the Islands and Territories of His Majesty in the West Indies, (including the Bahama Islands, and the Bermuda or Somer Islands,) and the Lands and Territories on the Continent of South America to His Majesty belonging, of certain Articles, Goods, and Commodities hereinafter-mentioned, in any Ships or Vessels belonging to the Subjects of any State in Amity with His Majesty; His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and doth hereby order, that the Governors and Lieutenant-Governors of His Majesty's Islands and Colonies in the West Indies, (in which Description the Bahama Islands, and the Bermuda or Somer Islands are included,) and of any Lands or Territories on the Continent of South America to His Majesty belonging, and each and every of such Governors and Lieutenant-Governors shall be authorized, and they, and each and every of them are hereby authorized to permit for Twelve Months, from the Date hereof, subject to be sooner terminated, varied, or altered as is hereinafter provided, in any Ships or Vessels belonging to the Subjects of any State in Amity with His Majesty, the Importation into the said Islands, Colonies, Lands, and Territories respectively, of Staves and Lumber, and also of every Kind of Provisions; (Beef, Pork, Fish, and Butter excepted,) which are of the Growth or Produce of the Country to which such Ship or Vessel importing the same shall belong; (the Exception of Fish, however, not to be in Force in any of the said Islands, Colonies, Lands, or Territories in which there shall have been provided a Bounty on Fish taken in any Part of His Majesty's Dominions in North America, or on the Coasts thereof, by British Subjects, to an Amount equal to Two Shillings a Quintal on Cod, and imported in British Vessels from any of His Majesty's Provinces, Settlements, or Possessions in North America;) and also the Exportation from the said Islands, Colonies, Lands, and Territories respectively, into which such Importation of Staves, Lumber, and Provisions as aforesaid shall be made, of Rum and Molasses, and of any other Articles, Goods, and Commodities whatsoever, except Sugar, Indigo, Cotton Wool, Coffee, and Cocoa; provided always, that such Ships or Vessels shall duly enter into, report, and deliver their respective Cargoes, and re-load at such Ports only where regular Custom-Houses shall have been established: And His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His said Privy Council, is further pleased to order, and doth hereby order, that notwithstanding any Thing hereinbefore contained, the said Permission and Authority to import and export shall cease and determine, or be varied and altered, before the Expiration of the abovementioned Period of Twelve Months, at the Expiration of Six Months after the Notification in the London-Gazette of any Order of His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, for revoking, varying, or altering such Permission and Authority, or shall cease and determine

at the Expiration of Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace.

An Act to amend the Acts relating to the Duties of Assessed Taxes, and of the Tax upon the Profits of Property, Professions, Trades, and Offices, and to regulate the Assessment and Collection of the same.

An Act to repeal the Stamp Duties on Licences granted by Justices of the Peace for selling Ale, Beer, and other Exciseable Liquors by Retail, and for granting other Duties in lieu thereof.

An Act for enabling His Majesty to grant Annuities to the Judges of the Courts of Session, Judiciary, and Exchequer in Scotland, upon the Resignation of their Offices.

An Act for enabling the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt to grant Life Annuities.

An Act for vesting the Stock of the Court of Session in Scotland in Trustees, for the erecting Buildings for the better Accommodation of the College of Justice, and a public Gaol in the City of Edinburgh, and for other Purposes therein mentioned.

An Act to permit the Sale of the Danish Prize Ship *Constantia Maria*, and her Cargo, in the Port of Fowey, in the County of Cornwall.

*The Speech of the Lords Commissioners to both Houses of Parliament, on Monday, July 4, 1808.*

*My Lords, and Gentlemen,*

WE have it in Command from His Majesty to express to you the great Satisfaction which He derives from being enabled, by putting an End to the present Session of Parliament, to terminate the laborious Attendance which the public Business has required of you.

The Measure which you have adopted for the Improvement of the Military Force of the Country, promises to lay the Foundation of a System of internal Defence eminently useful, and peculiarly adapted to the Exigencies of these Times.

The Sanction which you have given to those Measures of defensive Retaliation, to which the violent Attacks of the Enemy upon the Commerce and Resources, of this Kingdom compelled His Majesty to resort, has been highly satisfactory to His Majesty. His Majesty doubts not that in the Result the Enemy will be convinced of the Impolicy of persevering in a System which retorts upon himself, in so much greater Proportion, those Evils which he endeavours to inflict upon this Country.

*Gentlemen of the House of Commons,*

We are commanded by His Majesty to return His most hearty Acknowledgements for the Cheerfulness and Liberality with which the necessary Supplies for the current Year have been provided. His Majesty directs us to assure you, that He participates in the Satisfaction with which you must have contemplated the flourishing Situation of the Revenue and Credit of the Country, notwithstanding the continued Prefecture of the War: and He congratulates you upon

having been enabled to provide for the Exigencies of the public Service with so small an Addition to the public Burthens.

His Majesty commands us to thank you for having enabled Him to make good His Engagements with His Allies; and to express to you the particular Gratification which He has derived from the Manner in which you have provided for the Establishment of His Sister Her Royal Highness the Duchesse of Brunswick.

*My Lords, and Gentlemen,*

His Majesty has great Satisfaction in informing you, that, notwithstanding the formidable Confederacy united against His Ally the King of Sweden, that Sovereign perseveres with unabated Vigour and Constancy to maintain the Honour and Independence of His Crown: No Effort has been wanting on the Part of His Majesty to support Him in the arduous Contest in which He is engaged.

The recent Transactions in Spain and Italy have exhibited new and striking Proofs of the unbounded and unprincipled Ambition which actuates the Common Enemy of every established Government and independent Nation in the World.

His Majesty views with the liveliest Interest the loyal and determined Spirit manifested by the Spanish Nation, in resisting the Violence and Perfidy with which their dearest Rights have been assailed.

Thus nobly struggling against the Tyranny and Usurpation of France, the Spanish Nation can no longer be considered as the Enemy of Great Britain, but is recognized by His Majesty as a natural Friend and Ally.

We are commanded to inform you, that Communications have been made to His Majesty from several of the Provinces of Spain, soliciting the Aid of His Majesty. The Answer of His Majesty to these Communications has been received in Spain with every Demonstration of those Sentiments of Confidence and Affection which are congenial to the Feelings and true Interests of both Nations. And His Majesty commands us to assure you that He will continue to make every Exertion in His Power for the Support of the Spanish Cause, guided in the Choice and in the Direction of His Exertions, by the Wishes of those in whose Behalf they are employed.

In contributing to the Success of this just and glorious Cause, His Majesty has no other Object than that of preserving unimpaired the Integrity and Independence of the Spanish Monarchy:

But He trusts that the same Efforts which are directed to that great Object, may, under the Blessing of Divine Providence, lead, in their Effects and by their Example, to the Restoration of the Liberties and the Peace of Europe.

Then a Commission for proroguing the Parliament was read. After which the Lord Chancellor said;

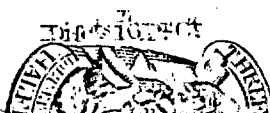

**W**hereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that, between the Hours of Nine and Ten o'Clock on the Evening of Wednesday the 18th of May last, as Mr. Humphreys, of Haver Castle, in the County of Kent, Farmer, was returning home, he was attacked by a Footpad at a Place called Four Elms, near his own House, who with violent Oaths demanded his Money, and on Mr. Humphreys dismounting to defend himself, the Footpad shot at him, and the Ball passed through both Cheeks; he afterwards beat him with the Pistol, which broke his Jaws and fractured his Skull, and then robbed him; since which the said Mr. Humphreys has died of the Wounds he received;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in the said atrocious Murder and Robbery, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except the Person who actually shot and beat the said Mr. Humphreys) who shall discover his, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

**B**y an Act, passed in the present Session of Parliament, (which received the Royal Assent the 30th of June,) it was enacted, that from and after the Establishment of Packet Boats between this Kingdom and the Portuguese Territories in South America, the following Rates of Postage should take place:

For every Single Letter to and from the Island of Madeira, a Packet Postage of One Shilling and Sixpence

A Double Letter, Three Shillings.

A Treble Letter, Four Shillings and Sixpence.

An Ounce, Six Shillings, and so in Proportion.

For every Single Letter to and from Brazil, a Packet Postage of Two Shillings and Five-pence.

A Double Letter, Four Shillings and Tenpence.

A Treble Letter, Seven Shillings and Threepence.

An Ounce, Nine Shillings and Eightpence, and so in Proportion.

These Rates are in addition to the Rates to the Port of Falmouth; and both the Inland and Packet Postage must be paid on the Letters being put into any Post-Office.
