## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Majelty having taken into His Confideration the glorious Exertions of the Spanish Nation for the Deliverance of their Country from the Tyranny and Ufurpation of France, and the Affurances which His Majelty has received from feveral of the Provinces of Spain, of their friendly Disposition towards this Kingdom; His Majelty is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered;

First, That all Hostilities against Spain on the Part of His Majesty shall immediately cease.

Secondly, That the Blockade of all the Ports of Spain, except fuch as may be full in the Poffeffion or under Controul of France, shall be forthwith raifed.

Thirdly, That all Ships and Veffels belonging to Spain shall have free Admission into the Ports of His Majesty's Dominions, as before the prefent Hostilities.

Fourthly, That all Ships and Vetfels belonging to Spain, which shall be met at Sea by His Majesty's Ships and Cruizers, shall be treated in the fame Manner as the Ships of States in Amity with His Majesty, and shall be fuffered to carry on any Trade now confidered by His Majesty to be lawfully carried on by Neutral Ships.

Fifthly, That all Veffels and Goods belonging to Perfons refiding in the Spanish Colonies, which shall be detained by any of His Majesty's Cruizers after the Date hereof, shall be brought into Port, and shall be carefully preferved in fafe Custody, to await His Majesty's further Pleasure, until it shall be known whether the faid Colonies, or any of them, in which the Owners of fuch Ships and Goods reside, shall have made common Cause with Spain egainst the Power of France.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take fuch Measures herein as to them may refpectively appertain.

## PRESENT,

WHEREAS by an Act, made and paffed in the Forty fixth Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled "An Act for authorizing His Majefty in Council to allow during the prefent War, and for Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, the Importation and Exportation of certain Goods and Commodities, in Neutral Ships, into and from His Majefty's Territories in the West Indies and Continent of South America ;" it is enacted, that from and after the paffing of the faid Act, it shall and may be lawful for His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His and Their Privy Council, to permit, or to au-thorize the Governors of the faid Islands and Territories, in fuch Manner and under fuch Reftrictions as to His Majelty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, shall seem fit to permit, when the N ceffity of the Cafe shall appear to His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to require it from Time to Time during the prefent War, and for Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, the Importation into, and the Exportation from any Island in the West Indies, (in which Defeription the Bahama Islands and the Bermuda or Somer Islands are included,) or any Lands or Territories on the Continent of South America to His Majefty belonging, of any fuch Articles, Goods, and Commodities as shall be mentioned in such Order of His Majetty in Council, in any Ships or Veffels belonging to the Subjects of any State in Amity with His Majelly, in fuch Manner as His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, by and with the
