Advice aforefaid, Ikall direct ; provided fuch Ships | or Veffels thall duly enter into, report, and deliver their refpective Cargnes, and re-load at fuch Ports only where regular Cultom-Houles shall have been cflablished : And whereas it appears at prefent to be neceffary to permit for a limited Fime, fubject to be f. oner terminated, varied, or altered, as is hereinafter provided, the Importation into, and the Exportation from the Iflands and Territories of His Majefty in the Weft ludies, (including the Bahama Iflands, and the Bermuda or Somer Iflands,) and the Lands and Territories on the Continent of South America to His Majelly belonging, of certain Articles, Goods, a d Commodities hereinafter-mentioned, in any Ships or Veffels belonging to the Subjects of any State in Amity with His Majelty ; His Majelty is thereupon plealed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and doth hereby order, that the Governors and Lieutenant Governors of His Majefty's Iflands and Colonies in the Weft Indies, (in which Description the Bahama Islands, and the Bermuda or Somer Iflands are included,) and of any Lands or Territories on the Continent of South America to His Majelty belonging, and each and every of fuch Governors and Lieutenant-Governors shall be authorized, and they, and each and every of them are hereby authorized to permit for Twelve Months, from the Date hereof, fubject to be fooner terminated, varied, or altered as is hereinafter provided, insany Ships or Veffels belonging to the Subjests of any. State in Amity with His Majelty, the Importation into the faid Iflands. Colonies, Lands, and Territories refpectively, of Staves and Lumber, and alfo of every Kind of Provisions; (Beef, Pork, Fifh, and Butter excepted.) which are of the Growth or Produce of the Country to which fuch Ship or Veffel importing the fame shall belong ; (the Exception of Fifh, however, not to be in Force in any of the faid Iflands, Colonies, Lands, or Territories in which there shall have been provided a Bounty on Fish taken in any Part of His Majesty's Dominions in North America, or on the Coalts thereof, by British Subjects, to an Amount equal to Two Shill lings a Quintal on Cod, and imported in British Vesiels from any of His Majesty's Provinces, Set tlements, or Poffeffions in North America;) and alfo the Exportation, from the faid Islands, Colonies, Lands, and Territories refpectively, into which fuch Importation of Staves, Lumber, and Provisions as aforefaid shall be made, of Rum and Molalies, and of any other Articles, Goods, and Commodities. whatfoever, except Sugar, Indigo, Cotton Wool, Coffee, and Cocoa; provided always, that fuch Ships or Veffels shall duly enter into, report, and deliver their respective Cargoes, and re-load at such Ports only where regular Cultom-Houles shall have been established : And His Majelty, by and with the Advice of His faid Privy Council, is further pleafed to order, and doth hereby order, that notwithlanding any Thing hereinbefore contained, the laid Perniffi in and Authority to import and export shall ceafe and determine, or be varied and altered, before the Expiration of the abovementioned Period of Twelve Months, at the Expiration of Six Months after the Notification in the London Gazette of any Order of His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, for revoking, varying, or altering fuch Per-million and Authority, or shall ceale and determine

at the Expiration of Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace.
