Proposals must be made separately for each County and Island, and each Proposal must be accompanied by a Letter from Two Persons of known Property, engaging to become bound with the Person tendering, in the Amount which may be required, for the due Performance of the Contract, and no Proposal will be noticed unless made on, or annexed to, a printed Tender, and the Prices expressed in Words at Length, nor unless the Party, or an Agent for him, personally attend on the following Day to know the Decision thereon; and should it so happen that during the Continuance of the Contract no Troops should be stationed or supplied in the County, the Expenses of the Contract and Bond; paid in the first Instance by the Contractor, to be refunded to him by the Commissary-General.
