A'T the Court at the Queen's Palaee, the 4th of July 1808,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majefty in Council.

HIS Majefty having taken into His Confideration the glorious Exertions of the Spanish Nation for the Deliverance of their Country from the Tyranny and Usurpation of France, and the Affurances which His Majesty has received from feveral of the Provinces of Spain, of their friendly Disposition towards this Kingdom; His Majesty is pleased, by and with the Advice of His-Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered;

First, That all Hostilities against Spain on the Part of His Majesty shall immediately cease.

Secondly, That the Blockade of all the Ports of Spain, except fuch as may be ftill in the Poffeffion or under Controul of France, shall be forthwith raifed.

Thirdly, That all Ships and Vessels belonging to Spain shall have free Admission into the Ports of His Majesty's Dominions, as before the present Hostilities.

Fourthly, That all Ships and Veffels belonging to Spain, which shall be met at Sea by His Majelty's Ships and Cruizers, shall be treated in the same Manner as the Ships of States in Amity with His Majesty, and shall be suffered to carry on any Trade now confidered by His Majesty to be lawfully carried on by Neutral Ships.

Fifthly, That all Veffels and Goods belonging to Perfons refiding in the Spanish Colonies, which shall be detained by any of His Majefty's Crujzer's after the Date hereof, shall be brought into Port, and shall be carefully preferved in safe fusitody, to await His Majefty's forther Pleasure, until it shall be known whether the said Colonies, or any of them, in which the Owners of such Ships and Goods refide, shall have made common Caufe with Spain against the Power of France.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majelty's Treafury, His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take fuch Measures hereinlatto then may respectively appertain.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. W/HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twenty fifth Day of November One thousand eight hundred and feven, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this, Kingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eleventh Day of this inftant July : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, from the faid Eleventh Day of this inflant July, prefume to transport into any Farts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowlprits,. Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship,

or Weffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permillion first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirtythird Year of His Majery's Reign, intituled " An " Act to enable His Majefty to reftrain the Expor-« tation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to " prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and " Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation " or Order in Council:" But it is neverthelefs His Majelty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majelty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Weffels or Boats in the Service of His Majefty, or employed or freighted by His Majefty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majefty's Navy ; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be neceffary for the Ufe of fuch Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commiffioners of the Admiralty for the Time being ; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majelly's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Well Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of . St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the Eaft.Indies : Provided that upon the Exportation of any-of the faid Articles for the Parpose of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Yards and Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonics and Plantations in America or the Welt Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Ma-, jefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factorics in the East Indies, the . Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Deflination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, except as hereinafter excepted,) to the Satisfaction of the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, to carry the : faid Articles. to the Places for which they are : fo entered outwards, and for the Purpofes fpecified, aud none other; and fuch Bond fhall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid. Commiffioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commisfioners, flewing that the faid Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were en-

tered outwards : But it is His Majesty's Pleasure, neverthelefs, that the following Articles, viz. Bary Iron, White and Tarred Rope, Tallow or Mill Greafe, Tarpaulins for Waggon-Covers, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, shall be permitted to be exported, upon Payment of the proper Duties, without Bond being entered into by the Merchant Exporter, to any of the British Plantations in the West Indies, or to any of His Majefty's Settlements in South America; provided the Merchant Exporter shall first verify, upon Oath, that the Articles fo exported are intended for the Ufe of a particular Plantation or Settlement, to be named in the Entry Outwards, and not for Sale; and that the faid Plantation or Settlement has not before been furnished with any Supply of the faid Articles during the fame Seafon ; and provided also that the Exportation of the faid Articles shall, in no Cafe, exceed the Value of Fifty Pounds Sterling for any given Plantation or Settlement, whether by one or more Shipments within the fame Seafon : And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may refpec-Steph. A DISPATCH, of which the following is a Copy, together with Inclosures, have been received from Major-General Spencer by Viscount Caltlereagh, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, dated off Cadiz, June 12, 1808.

His Majefly's Ship Allas, off Cadiz, June 12, 1808.

My LORD, HE French Squadron confifting of Five Sail of 1 A the Line and a Frigate, having placed them-felves in a Defensive Position, in the Channel leading to the Caraccas, and out of the Reach of the Works of Cadiz, and having refused to listen to any Terms, I have great Satisfaction in reporting that the Spanish Gun and Mortar Boats, and the Batteries erected for this Purpofe, on the Ifle of Leon, and near Fort Louis, commenced Holtilities against the French Ships, at Three o'Clock in the Afternoon of the 9th, and the firing continued without Interruption on both Sides till Night. It was renewed on the Part of the Spaniards on the Morning of the toth, and partially continued till Two, when a Flag of Truce was holfted by the French, but the Terms proposed being inadmissible, the Spaniards intend to recommence:Hoftilities with an additional Battery, to the Eaftward of Fort Louis, conditing of Thirty Twenty-four Pounders.

Admiral Purvis, and myfelf wilhed to have cooperated in this Attack, but the Spaniards, feeling themfelves confident in their own Force, have declined our Offers of Affiliance.

The Supreme Council of Seville have nominated Commifficuers, and applied laft Night for Paffports, and a Frigate to convey them to England, and they are also equally anxious to fend Feluccas with Difpatches to South America.

Information having been received that a fmall French Corps was affembling at Tavira, with a View of entering Spain by the River Guadiana, we have been requeiled to proceed against this Corps, and either to attack them on the Coaft, or endeavour to prevent the further Profecution of their Plans against Spain. I accordingly propole to fail immediately for this Object, Lord Collingwood approving of it.

Admiral Purvis had already detached Three Ships of War off the Mouth of the Guadiana, and has offered every other neceffary Affiftance, which Lord Collingwood has fince confirmed.

Copy of a Letter from General Morla, Captain-General of Andalufia and Governor of Cadiz, addreffed to their Excellencies Admiral Purvis and Major-General Spencer.

ADMIRAL ROSSILLY, as your Excellencies will obferve by the annexed Copy, has propoled to difarm, but upon Conditions which I thought were inadmiffible. Whatever may be his Terms of Surrender, I shall in no Manner deviate from my Promile; it is therefore neceffary that I fhould have your Confent; as I have already faid in my first Conference with Brigadier General Smith and Captain Sir John Gore, to whom I have pledged myfelf with Simplicity and good Faith.

It will afford me confiderable Satisfaction to confult with your Excellencies on all Occurrences, Incidents, and Circumstances, conducive to our common Advantage, and contrary to the Interests of the Common Enemy.

Nothing gives me more real Pleafure than the abfolute Confidence of your Excellencies in my Candour and Sincerity, with which I remain your Excellencies most affectionate and devoted Servant.

Copy of a Letter from Admiral Roffilly, addreffed to General Morla, dated on board the Admiral's Ship, Hero Bay, off Cadiz, June 11, 1808.

CAPTAIN GENERAL,

OBLIGED to defend myfelf on account of the Inquietude infpired into the People of, this Province by my imposing Attitude, I yesterday, in order to · tranquillize them, proposed to your Excellency to quit the Bay. In cafe the English cannot accede to this Proposal, I suggest the Idea of difembarking my Means of Attack, and keeping my Ships' · Companies on board ; no Colours shall be difplayed on my Squadron. Holtages shall be given for our Security, our Sick, and all the French People in the Province, with their national and individual Property. Holtages will be equally given on my Part. The Refreshments, Water, and Provisions meceffary for my Squadron shall be provided on my paying for them, as has hitherto been done. In thort, I shall demand no Conditions but those which are neceffary for my Honour and that of the People ferving under my Orders, and as are compatible with the public Tranquillity.

Deprived by my Proposal of the Means of De. fence against the exterior Enemy, I demand Security againft them.

Receive, Captain-General, the Renewal of my diftinguished Confideration, with which I am your Excellency's most humble Servant,

Copy of an Anfaver from General Morla to Admiral Roffilly.

Excellent Sir, Admiral Roffilly,

'IN Answer to certain Proposals and official Demands transmitted by your Excellency, which, although dictated by your Honour, are unquellionably incompatible with mine, as mult be evident to your Excellency, I have to acquaint you, that I cannot accept any Terms but an unconditional Surrender. My Honour and Character not allowing me to de-part in any Way from my Promifes, I therefore inform you, that my Orders from the Superior Council being politive with respect to the Surrender of the Squadron commanded by your Excellency, I can-not enter into any Conditions without previously confulting them. It is likewife my Daty to confult with the English Commanders, as, without their Confent, I cannot compromife mysfelf.

For these Reasons, I shall suspend my Attack, until I have dispatched those Two Expresses, avaiting myfelf however of the intermediate Time to prepare other Means for the Attack.

Nothing opposes the Individual effeem entertained for your Excellency, by your faithful Servant, (Signed) THOMAS MORLA.

HESE are, by Order withe, Right Honourable the Lords and others, Commiffioners for managing the Affairs of the Royal Hospital at Chelfea, to give Notice, That all Out Pentioners belong-ing to the faid Holpital, reliding in London, or within Twenty five Miles thereof, are required to appear personally and regimentally at the Secretary's Office, in the faid Hospital, on the respective Days, and in their different Claffes," according to their feveral Rates of Penfion, as undermentioned; when Attendance will be given from Nine o'Clock in the Morning until Three in the Afternoon, for the

Chriftmas next, with an Augmentation in Proportion to their Difability and Length of Service, according to His Majesty's new Regulations in their Favour.

On Thursday, the 14th of July. The Penfioners at 6d. per Day, from the different Regiments of Cavalry, Foot Guards, 1ft Regiment of Foot, to the 62d Regiment, inclusive.

On Friday, the 15th of July.

Thole at 6d. per Day, from the 63d Regiment of Foot, with the remaining Regiments or Corps; as also the Pensioners at 9d. per Day, from the feveral Regiments of Cavalry, Foot Guards, the 1st Regiment of Foot, to the 69th inclusive.

The Affidavir, drawn according to the above Form,



fworn before, dated and attefted by a Magistrate, is to be put up in a Cover, and fent by the General Polt, directed thus: "To the Right Hon. the Paymalter-General of His Majesty's Land Forces, London," marking on the Cover, " Chelfea Penfioners' Affidavit," and Counterparts or Duplicates of the faid Affidavits are to be referred by the Out Penfioners refpectively, to be exhibited to fuch Perfons as shall be directed to pay them, that they may be fatisfied that all fuch as may claim Out-Penfions are the real Perfons entitled to receive the fame.

And to the End that the Commissioners for the Affairs of Chelfea Holpital may be fatisfied that the Penfioners are the fame Perfons who have paffed their Examination, it is hereby further directed, that fuch of them who have ferved in, and have been dif charged from, any of the Regiments, or Independent Companies of Invalids, or Royal Veteran Battalions, are not to mention in their Affidavits fuch Regiment or Company of Invalids, or Royal Veteran Battalions, in which they ferved last, but the Regiment, Troop, or Corps of the Army from which they were first discharged and recommended, and received at Chelfea Hofpital.

The Penfioners are particularly to take Notice, that the Half-yearly Payments after Midlummer, are regulated, as to the Place of Payment, by the Musters at Chelfea, or the Affidavits fent as above, after the Chriftmas preceding ; and that the Chriftmas Payment is in the like Manner regulated by the Musters or Affidavits after the Midfummer preceding.

It is also ordered and directed, that no Person who shall change the Place of his Abode given in at his Mufter, or specified in his Affidavit aforefaid, and who may apply for his Penfion, (excepting to the Officers of Excife nearest fuch Place of Abode,) shall receive the fame, unless it appears, by the Certificate of refpectable Perfons, that fuch Removal was through unavoidable Neceffity, which he or they

could not foresee or prevent. And that if any Pensioner shall fraudulently sttempt to receive a double Payment of the Penfion, either at Chelfea or at different Places, he shall be ftruck off the Lifts.

Laftly, it is notified, that none will be entered upon the Pay Lifts of the faid Hotpital, or be entitled to receive any Benefit therefrom, who shall not act agreeably to these Orders and Directions, particularly in fending their Half-Yearly Affidavits to the Paymaster-General, as above directed, and to no other Office ; which feveral of the Penfioners have of late either neglected to do, or fent them irregularly to other Departments.

Stamp-Office, July 8, 1808. Notice is hereby given, that by an Act. paffed at the Close of the late Seffion of Parliament, the Stamp Duties on Deeds, Law Proceedings, and other written Instruments, and the Duties on Legacies and Successions to perfonal Estate upon Inreftacies, now payable in Great Britain, are re-pealed from and after the 10th Day of October next, and other Duties are granted in lieu thereof, to commence immediately after that Day.

The new Ducies are of the like Nature, and in

Duties; but a more precile and accurate Delcrip-tion is given of the Inftruments on which they at-There are some Duties altogether new, and tach. fome new in Amount; of which the principal ones are, ad valorem Duties on Conveyances upon the Sale of any Property, according to the Amount of the Purchase Money; increased Dutics on Promif. fory Notes allowed to be re-iffued; and a Duty on Licences to be taken out Yearly by Bankers and others iffuing fuch Promissory Notes. There is alfo a Duty on Policies of Infurance on Lives, and on Three or Four Law Proceedings, not now charged. The Duties on Mortgages for Imail Sums, and on Conveyances on the Sale of Property of finall Value; are lefs than at prefent. The Duties are contained in a Schedule, in which the Inftruments charged are claffed and alphabetically arranged, with numerous References, fo as to afford a complete Table of Duties in the most convenient and practical Form, and to superfede the Neceffity of those Compilations to which the Profession of the Law and the Public have hitherto found it ex-pedient to refort. The Schedule is also framed fo as not to admit of an Abridgment that can be fafely relied upon. The Commiffioners therefore recommend it to the Profession, and others whom it may concern, 'to look only to the Schedule itfelf.

The A& contains special Provisions for securing the Duties on Conveyances on the Sale of Property, on Bills of Exchange, and Drafts on Bankers polt-dated, or iffued beyond Ten Miles from the Banker's Refidence, and on Inftruments relating to Copyhold Estates, which the Commissioners recommend to the Notice and Attention of Furchalers and Sellers, Attornies, Solicitors, Bankers, Stewards of Manors, and others, that they may not incur Pe-nalties, which it will be the Duty of the Commif-fioners to enforce. The Provisions respecting Drafts on Bankers take effect after One Month from the paffing of the AA.

LEGACY DUTY.

It being apprehended that many Perfons may have neglected to pay the Duties on Legacies, and on Relidues of perfonal Eftate given by Will, or devolved to next of Kin upon Inteftacies, within the Time prefcribed by Law, through Ignorance or Inadvertence, or from accidental or unavoidable Caufes; the AA authorizes the Commiffioners to remit the Penalties which may have been incurred in fuch Cafes, provided the Duty shall be paid on or before the 31ft Day of January 1809. In giving Notice of this Provision of the Act, the Commiffioners think it right also to state, that Profecutions in the Exchequer will be inflituted against those Perfons who shall not take the Benefit of it, as well as against those who shall fail to pay the Duties which may hereafter become due, within the Time allowed by Law; an Abstract of Wills proved and Administrations granted being returned to the Commiffioners from the feveral Ecclefialtical Courts, for the Purpole of discovering Defaulters.
