Encouragement and Satisfaction to us, that we have (at the Head of the British Empire a Sovereign who to juilly appreciates the true Interests of his People, and to steadily maintains them. We are not infenfible to the Privations which all Classes of your Majefty's Subjects muft endure in confequence of the boundless Ambition and inveterate Hostility to this Country, of the common Enemy of all lawful Governments and ancient political Establishments ; but being convinced that to thefe Privations we mult fubmit, in order to fecure our national Honour and Independence, and to realife what we are convinced is the most anxious Wish of your Majesty's Heart, the Bleffings of a fecure and lafting Peace, we are prepared to fubmit to them with Cheerfulngfs, fo long as the political Circumstances of the Country

shall render it necessary; and we presume to hope that your Majefty will be gratified to learn, that, in expreffing this Refolution, we fpeak the Sentiments of that numerous and respectable Class of your Majefty's Subjects with whom we are more particularly connected.

Amid the many difastrous and afflicting Changes which have lately taken place in the political State of Europe, we cannot avoid expressing the lively Intereft with which we view the rifing Spirit of a neighbouring Nation, and the warm Sympathy which we feel with them in their generous Efforts to wreft their Country from the Iron Grasp of the Despot of the Continent : and while we admire the Promptitude with which your Majefty has firetched out your protecting Arm to affift their noble Exertions, we venture to indulge the Hope that the patriotic Spirit of the Spaniards may prove the Means of frustrating the ambitious Projects of the Ruler of France, and ultimately of reftoring Europe to a State in which the Bleffings of Peace and mutual Intercourfe may be expected to be permanent.

That Almighty God, by whom Kings reign, may protect your Majefty's Person, and prosper the Meafures of your Government; that He may long preferve you to be a Bleffing to your People, and a Refuge to oppreffed Nations ; and that, to the lateft Polterity, Princes of the illustrious Houle of Brunfwick, formed on your Majefty's Example, may fway the Sceptre of this Realm, is the earnest Prayer of your Majelty's loyal and dutiful Subjects, the Commiffioners and Representatives of the Royal Burghs of Scotland, in their annual Convention affembled.
