PRESENT,

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. HEREAS by an Act, passed in the last Seffion of Parliament, intituled " An Act to permit Goods fecured in Warehoufes in the Port " of London to be removed to the Out Ports for "Exportation to any Part of Europe; for em "powering His Majelly to direct that Licences, which His Majefty is authorized to grant under \*\* "His Sign Manual, may be granted by one of the "Principal Secretaries of State; and for enabling " His Majesty to permit the Exportation of Goods " in Veffels of lefs Burthen than are now allowed " by Law during the prefent Hostilities, and until " One Month after the Signature of the preliminary "Articles of Peace;" it is enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council, or by His Royal Proclamation, to direct that all or any fuch Licences as, by virtue of any Act of Parliament or otherwife, His Majefty may lawfully grant under His Sign Manual, shall and may be granted by one of His Majelty's Principal Secretaries of State, in purfuance of an Order of Council specially authorizing the Grant of such Licences, a Duplicate of which Order shall in all Cafes be annexed to fuch Licences; His Majefty having taken the fame into His Royal Confideration, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order and direct, and it is hereby ordered and directed, that all Licences which by virtue of any Acts of Parliament or otherwife His Majefty may lawfully grant under His Sign Manual touching, concerning, or in any Manner relating to Trade, Commerce, or Navigation, shall and may hereafter, and until further Order, be granted by either of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, in purluance of any Order in Council specially authorizing the Grant of fuch Licences ; and that all Licences fo granted, and having a Duplicate of fuch Order in Council annexed thereto, shall be as valid, and have as full Force and Effect, as if fuch Licences had been granted under His Majefty's Sign Manual; provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed or taken to invalidate, or in any Manner to affect any Licences which His Majefty shall think vented our cloting again with her for some Time,

Copy of a Letter from Vice Admiral Sir James Sau-marez, Bart. and K B. Commander in Chief of Ilis Majefly's Ships and Veffels in the Baltic, to the Hon. W. W. Pole, dated on board the Viftory, off Moon Ifland, July 15, 1808.

SIR,

HEREWITH inclose, for the Information of the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiraly, the Copy of a Letter transmitted to me by Rear- dmiral Sir Samuel Hood, from Captain Bathurit, of His Majefty's Ship Salfette. flating his having chifed a Sloop of War, under Ruffian Colours, into Revel, and having captured His Ruffian Majelty's Cutter

Apith. I have directed the Cutter to be forveyed and valued, being reprefented to be in every Refpect fit for His Majelty's Service; and as Veffels of this Class are particularly required upon this Station, I propose to appoint an Officer to command her, and to man her with the Men lately exchanged from I am, Sir, &c. ## His Majefty's Ship Salfette, off Norgen

S1R, Ifland, June 24, 1808. I BEG Leave to inform you, that having Yefterday, in His Majesty's Ship Salsette, chafed a Sloop of War under Russian Colours to Revel, where a Frigate and a Brig were laying, and taken a Galliot partly laden with Spirits, that was at Auchor in the Roads, in coming out with the latter faw a Cutter off the North End of Norgen Island, coming down with Signals up, who foon after hauled her Wind for the Land; made all Sail in chafe, and clofed with her at half past Eight P. M. but on opposite Tacks, and the Wind dying away at the Time she croffed us with her Sweeps out, and returned our Fire, by which, I am forry I have to fay, one, a Marine, was killed ; the Wind continuing very light, and the Cutter pulling away with her Sweeps, pre-
