Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Vafton, Commander in Chief of His Mujesty's Ships and Vessels at Leith, to the Hon. W. W. Pole, dated August 2,

AM to beg you will be pleased to lay before the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty the inclosed Letter which I have received from Captain Dix, of His Majelly's Sloop Cygnet, giving an Account of the Capture of the Danish Privateer Brig. Christiana, mounting Fourteen Guns, with a Complement of Sixty Men; out Three Days from Chrisrtiana.

The Privateer has just anchored in Leith Roads. J. VASHON. 1 am, &c.

His Majesty's Sloop Cygnet, at Sea, SIR, July 27, 1808. I BEG Leave to inform you, that, after n Chace

of Nine Hours, I had the good Fortune to come up with and capture the Danish Brig Privateer Christiana, mounting Fourteen Guns, Twelve Twelve Pounder Carronades, and Two long Nines, manned with Sixty Mer; out Three Days from Christiana without having made any Captures. She is victualled and stored for One Month, and was proceeding off the North End of Shetland for the Purpose of intercepting our homeward-bound Greenlandmen.

The Christiana was formerly an English Merchant Brig.

FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.

Whitehall, July 30, 1808. TAT Hereas it has been represented to His Majesty, that, about Twelve o' Clock on the Night of the 22d Instant, the Boats of the Nimble Cutter and Asp Lugger, in the Service of His Majesty's Customs, jell in with and drove on Shore, at the North End of Deal. Two Smuggling Ten-Oared Galleys; and that, on the Approach of the Revenue Boats, the Smugglers, who were affembled on the Beach, together with others who had landed from the Jaid Galleys, commenced a very heavy Dijcharge of Mushets and Blunderbusses on the Crews of the Revenue Boats, whereby Robert Bruce, a Mariner of the Nimble, and John Ellis, a Mariner of the Asp, were spect dead, and John Wilson and William Burwich, Two other Mariners, were dangeroully wounded:
